VACATION NOTES.

Our last Lord's day in Boston, we start out undecided whether to go. We thought it might serve a purpose to take a little taste of unorthodox preaching.

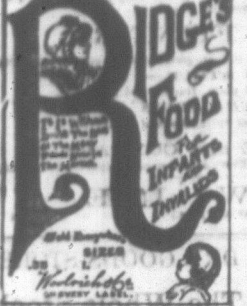
