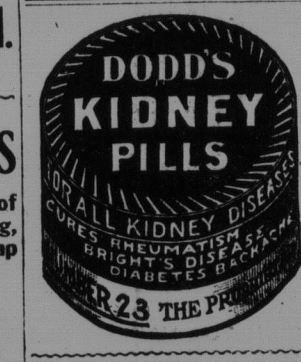
YACHT CRUISE ENDS WITH ANNUAL SERVICE
