At twenty minutes past twelve the elevation of the Hast took place to the flourish of trumpets, the boom of cannon, and the clang of the great bell. The choir took up the singing, a religious enthusiasm seemed to take possession of all in the church, and a thrill of excitement passed through all like an electric shock. The grandeur of the service of the Church of Rome struck a thord in the hearts of all present, and heads were bowed low, while pulses beat high, and breath came quickly. Then the Archbishop, mitred and in full canonicals, again solemnly blessed the people, and high Mass was finished. A few moments now, and the greatevent of the day—the re-entombment of the Saint—will commence. All eyes are turned towards the chancel into which, through a side door, come two priests bearing between them the heavy lid of the richly decorated coffin, which is still lying open in its silver casket. Meanwhile the Archbishop, his two suffragans of Patna and Vizagapatam, with mace bearers, followed by His Grace the Governor and his suite, approached the casket, and in turn kissed the exposed foot of the Saint, after which a prayer was chanted.
