Hoover's Advice

Hoover, of the U. S. A., has issued the following suggestions for the saving of food and fuel. While addressed to the people of the United States, they are equally applicable to Canada.

Save the Wheat—One wheatless meal a day. Use corn, oatmeal, rye or barley bread and non-wheat breakfast foods.

Save the Meat—Beef, mutton, or pork not more than once daily. Use freely vegetables and fish.

Save the Milk—The children must have milk. Use every drop. Use buttermilk and sour milk for cooking and making cottage cheese. Use less cream.

Save the Fat—We are the world's greatest fat wastrels. Fat is food. Butter is essential for the growth and health of children.

Save the Fuel—Coal comes from a distance, and our railways are overburdened hauling war material. Help relieve them by burning fewer fires. Use wood when you can get it.

Use the Perishable Foods—Fruits and vegetables we have in abundance. As a nation we eat too little green stuffs. Double their use and improve your health.

Use Local Supplies—Patronize your local producer. Distance means money. Buy perishable food from the neighborhood nearest you and thus save transportation.

All of Mr. Hoover's suggestions are valuable and are absolutely in line with the advice the Canadian Food Controller, Mr. Hanna, is endeavoring to press upon the people of this country.

Ottawa, July 16.—Sir Robert Borden rose at the opening of the House this afternoon to move the resolution which had been standing in his name for three months, petitioning the Imperial parliament to grant an extension of the present Canadian parliamentary term for another year.

Sir Robert Borden replied that he would have been glad if Mr. MacLean had communicated to him a little earlier his desire for a further postponement.

London, July 17.—The official report from British headquarters in France tonight reads: "We captured a few prisoners and improved our positions somewhat in the course of local fighting early this morning east of Monchy-Le-Preux."
