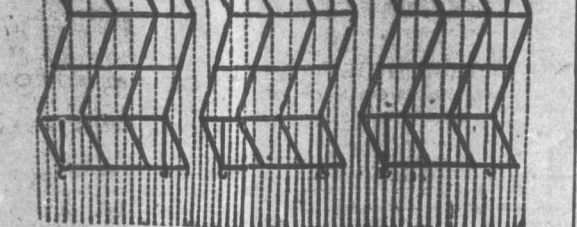

### CLINTON.

From the New Era. Mr. G. Debono said his farm of 50 acres on the Huron Road, Tupperburgh, to Mr. Richard Huron, his next neighbor, for \$3,000 cash. On Friday last, Robert, youngest son of Mr. Charles Hamilton did from the roof of a stable and broke his left arm just above the wrist.

Several considerable half dollars and quarters have been taken in this town, giving evidence of recent manufacture.

In his proper place will be found the announcement of the death of Mr. Oliver, who died on the 13th inst., when he was suddenly taken ill, and in one week he was no more. He had been a resident of the township for a number of years, and had been returned as Constable for two years. An evidence of the high esteem in which he was held, his funeral was one of the largest that had ever taken place in the township, there being over seventy-five teams in the procession. The corpse was taken to Tupperburgh, where his relatives reside. He leaves a wife and two children to mourn his death.

A few days ago a farmer in Hullett purchased a farm from another farmer in the township. The bargain was completed, and a portion of the money paid, and possession was to be given in the spring. The seller, however, after thinking over what he had done, came to the conclusion to back out if he could. He accordingly went to the purchaser and offered to return the money, but the latter declined to go back on the bargain unless he got the money he had paid, back, and \$500 additional. After considerable parleying between the parties the seller agreed to the terms, and refunded the money, and handed over in addition \$500 in hard coin, and a number of articles of value to get his farm back again. Buying farms in this way is more profitable than selling them.

During the past year no families, lately from England, reside in a house in Clinton, together, though no one of them is a native. One of them is a monthly income of \$5 from the purchase of their friends there, willing to sell to treat more than that amount with them at one time, well knowing that it would all go for liquor. During the winter the family, one of which consists of a wife and three children, and the other of a wife and six children, have suffered much from cold and hunger, the husbands being too lazy, besides spending their incomes in drink, to provide even the necessities of life for them. About a week ago each of the women gave birth to a child, one of them—that of the woman Berry, being premature. In consequence of the neglect and unskilful attention of the midwife, the child died shortly after birth, and the woman, being poorly attended and provided for, died on Wednesday last, leaving six children, the eldest only about 12, to the tender mercies of a drinking father. The poverty of the family is such that the authorities of the town are compelled to bury the woman, and make some provision for the children.
