IMPERIAL CONFERENCE IN OCTOBER.
 LONDON, April 9. Imperial Conference of Premiers, similar to that held in June 1921 will be held in London concurrently with the Imperial Economic Conference beginning October first this year, it was announced in the Commons to-day.

BONAR LAW UNABLE TO SPEAK.
 LONDON, April 9. Premier Bonar Law returned to the House to-day but was unable to carry on a conversation when attempting to answer questions and was forced to send a copy of his speech to Stanley Baldwin for delivery. Throat trouble is believed to be the cause.

WITHERING BONAR LAW.
 LONDON, April 9. While withering Bonar Law, and while at serious, it revives interest in his rumored retirement owing to ill health.

DORTMUND-EMMS CANAL BLOCKED.
 ESSEN, April 9. The explosion of a time bomb destroyed the lock of the Dortmund-Emms Canal near here to-day, effectually blocking the passage way and seriously interfering with inland waterway traffic. It is said to be the latest serious case of sabotage so far reported.

MATTER FOR THEIR MAJESTIES.
 LONDON, April 9. Sir Murdock MacDonald, member of the House of Commons for Inverness, objecting to protests against the proposed visit of the King and Queen to the Pope this year, said it was a matter that ought to be left to the judgment of their Majesties. "We cannot pretend that His Majesty has many millions of Catholic subjects and if he would like to make a courtesy call on the titular head of the Roman Catholic Church it would be wrong to suggest that he should not do so," said Sir Murdock.

FRANCE'S GIFT TO KINGSTON.
 KINGSTON, April 9. A gift from the Government of France of a beautiful statue entitled "Les Bleues de Setres" has been received at the Royal Military College, Kingston, and will be unveiled shortly with appropriate ceremonies. It is a recognition by the French Republic of the outstanding record of

 MONTREAL, April 9. Ten thousand dollar silk robberies occurred over the week end from two uptown stores.

SAILING CANCELLED.
 HARVE, April 9. The French line decided yesterday to cancel the sailing of the steamer France for New York because the firemen persisted in the attitude protesting against the deduction tax on wages due seven of their number. All the firemen were dismissed.

FOUR REPUBLICANS KILLED.
 DUBLIN, April 9. In a South Kerry battle between Republicans and Nationals over the execution by the former of condemned workmen, a prisoner escaped in the melee while the captors took refuge

in nearby houses. The Nationals stormed them, killing four.

MINERS RETURN TO WORK.
 CARDIFF, April 9. The striking miners in Rhonda Coal Fields held a meeting late Saturday night and settled their differences. Work, therefore, resumed for forty-six thousand men.

TEN WERE DROWNED.
 VINEYARD HAVEN, April 9. At least ten lives are believed to have been lost when the steam lighter John Dwight sank in Vineyard Sound Friday night.

GERMAN PAPER MONEY CONFISCATED.
 DUSSELDORF, April 9. The French have confiscated eighty billion marks in unfinished German paper money, which they found Friday at the printing plant in Mulheim of the General Anzeiger. At the same

time Belgian troops seized two billion marks in paper money.

ITALIAN PRINCESS MARRIED.
 ROME, April 9. Princess Yolanda, eldest daughter of King Victor Emmanuel and Queen Helena, of Italy, was married this morning to Count Calvi Di Bergolo, captain of cavalry, who was decorated for bravery in the war.

SOME TIME OFF.
 ROME, April 9. The Olympic games for 1932 have been awarded to Los Angeles, California.

CANADA SELLING STEAMERS.
 OTTAWA, April 9. Twenty-seven of the sixty-four vessels comprising the Canadian Government Merchant Marine fleet are to be offered for sale. They are of the smaller type, more suitable for coastal trade and not adapted for economical use in Canadian canals. The following are the names with prefix "Canadian": Dash, Sealer, Miner, Adventurer, Sower, Pathfinder, Engineer, Trader, Saller, Coaster, Beaver, Farmer, Gunner, Harvester, Observer, Logger, Rover, Straggler, Warrior, Trapper, Hunter, Raider, Aviator, Rancher, Settler; also the T. J. Drummond, J. A. McKee and the Sheba.

PRISONERS FOUND IN GERMANY.

A fresh proof of the brutal treatment which the inhabitants of Alsace-Lorraine met with at the hands of the German authorities before the return of the provinces to France is afforded to-day by the newspapers. They state that the military authorities have found in German prisons—notably at Bochum—20 Alsatians who were sent to prison during the war, and were not set free after the armistice.

Schoolboy Prevents War

LONDON.—It is a delightful story that the Governor of South Australia, Sir Tom Bridges, recently told some students at Adelaide, Australia, of an English schoolboy who, singlehanded prevented war between the Georgians and the Armenians, and that he made himself governor over the disputed territory and ran the new State successfully for six months in the name of the British Empire. Captain Archibald Douglas, of the Rifle Brigade, is the school boy referred to.

"I was at Tiflis in 1919," the Governor of South Australia said, "and I got a telegram from the Control Officer at Eslvan saying war had broken out between Georgia and Armenia. I Control Officer was, and they said that he was only a schoolboy who had just come out from England where he had been in the cricket eleven at Eton and Sandhurst.

"He was alone there, with his servant and an interpreter, and I afterwards learned that, riding a mule and accompanied by an interpreter, and his servant bearing a Union Jack, he visited the opposing armies, and in the name of the British Empire ordered them to cease firing.

"He enlisted police, appointed officials, and ran a first-class State for about six months, and only when we found out that he was getting too much into the life of the people, and was revising the marriage laws, did we send an officer of more mature experience. The schoolboy thereon was removed to another sphere of duty."

Boy Emigrants.

SCHEME TO SETTLE 10,000 OVERSEAS.

A scheme to settle 10,000 boys between the ages of 14 and 17 overseas has been launched by the Salvation Army following negotiations with the Government and the Canadian Government. Only a limited number of boys between 17 and 18 will be selected.

The Salvation Army, which guarantees that the boys will have the chance of a good start in life, will train the boys for 12 weeks at one of their institutions, and on their farms at Haddleigh, Essex, in the rudiments of many handicrafts, including carpentry, cobbling, cooking, market gardening, and the handling of cattle and horses.

Over-seas the boys will be placed on farms. Each will be required to find £7, but a substantial sum will be spent on his outfit. Applications should be made to: Commissioners, Bullard, Emigration House, Upper Thames Street, London, E.C. 4.
