SCIENTIFIC WONDERS. "I have made a discovery which has not, as far as I can make out, ever been presented to the scientific world." This statement was made yesterday by Capt. Powers. As is well known, Capt. Powers is constructing a little craft by which he hopes to demonstrate a world that he can drive a wheel, which will generate electricity by forcing water through pipes under the hull of a ship driven lengths. In the process of constructing his craft, he discovered the fact that the water in the pipes in the hull was no extra weight to the craft; in fact that it buoyed it up, and its buoyancy almost equaled the weight of the metal pipes. This scientific fact can be demonstrated in this way: If water is poured into a hole below the surface, that water will rise to the level of the surface of the sea, and will thus have a rising tendency. In the case of the pipes in the hull, the water rises below the surface and tries to get to the surface. The water in the hull acts as a buoyant force, equal to the weight of the pipes. If the pipes were of lead, the water would be a dead weight and weigh down the ship. Capt. Powers says his system of water power. Mr. Charles Tanner is the president, expecting to have a secret trial of his boat in about two weeks. The boat has been for the U. B. R. The boat has been known, or not whether he was dreaming or whether he had made the great scientific discovery, which has been built by his syndicate is 30 feet long, and will have two holes driven through the hull, one on each side, each hole will be tubed. If the water in the ship when open do not decrease the speed of the steam traveling under the same head of steam, then Capt. Powers claims he has made a discovery that will electrify the world. The big Empress can generate an enormous amount of electric power by their own speed through the water, and that this power can be used as an auxiliary driving force for lighting and heating her, etc. Then the question is naturally asked, if this is the case, why is it necessary to use any steam after the ship is once started, for the power generated will continue to drive the ship? The answer through the water will be constantly making new power, and here we have perpetual motion. It is not two weeks the world will know whether Powers' dream will be realized or vanishes into thin air.
