WAS HE GUILTY?

Thrown amid the temptations of the town at an early age, my life was wild and dissolute. I did make the statement before the magistrate with a not true. In order to avoid suspicion of one crime I was obliged to confess to others."

In my distress I borrowed this coat, and the very worst construction was put upon a circumstance purely accidental. As to the stain upon my shirt collar, it comes of it when it is proved, evidence that I cut my thumb? When questioned about cutting my thumb by the officers, I had fully forgotten who or how I did it, and returned an answer at random."

During the course of the day Jones got dressed and shaved himself, carefully replacing the razor in its case. At 7 o'clock they went out together, she going to meet to pursue her night vigil, and he—where did he go? A man answering his description was seen at 10:30 that night standing on the steps of No. 11 Montague place, Bedford square. He was talking to an old woman named Mrs. Williams, who was housekeeper for Mr. Lett at the above residence. Mrs. Lett had the door half open with her right hand and a candlestick in her left. The man had the woman good-night, and she went in and shut the door. This was never seen alive again.

At about 11 o'clock a scream was heard in some way making noise just to stop her. Mrs. Jones had been twice widowed. John Knight, one of her sons, was friendly with Mrs. Williams, who visited his house, 221 St. George street. On New Year's day Mrs. Williams, the landlady, was up in Jones and Charlotte Berry's room, and she was washing. He gave her two shillings. She had let him the night before a dark blue coat belonging to her son. It now lay on a chair, having breakfast had fallen down to the floor with a peculiar sound, as if there was silver in the pockets. Jones seemed much confused at the incident. He sent Charlotte out for gin after breakfast, and to see if she could get him a paper. She did not succeed in getting one. Later in the day Mrs. Williams rushed up to Jones' apartment and informed him that she had heard from her son, who had just come in, that the police were in search of a man named Jones, on a charge of murder. He said his friends, who were about, had probably found out that he was not leading a reputable life, and had sent the officers after him.

The next day Jones was arrested for the murder of Mrs. Lett. On the 1st of January some of the police accompanied to call daily at the house in Montague place as usual, but could get no answer to their ringing. Mr. Deit had left his home solely in charge of the old woman, who was a confidential servant. Being unable to obtain admission, the people became alarmed, and they effected an entrance into the house through the window. The old woman was found lying on the floor with her throat cut and her body stained, as if she had struggled desperately with her murderer. The wind-up was divided, but the wound was not such a one as the deceased could have inflicted upon herself. Her eyes were open, her hands clenched and had a sovereign in it. There were marks of knuckles on her left arm, and on her left cheek what appeared to be the dirt from the sole of a muddy shoe, as if a foot had been pressed upon her when she was dying. There were several other portions of her body. One of her pockets had been turned inside out, the other seemed to have been overlooked and had a sovereign in it. Her watch was missing, and near the body was found the lower part of a razor case. There was a great quantity of blood on the floor—in one particular spot.
