GEN. BARR'S DEATH.
How it Was Complicated According to
Proper Hands of the 19th Hussars.
The account of General Barr's death is
somewhat exaggerated. The real thing is
this. After the whole of the position was
taken, Barr went up the rocks to inspect
a small hut (mud) in which some rebels
were suspected to be secreted. He was
warned not to do so, but he peered his
head in at the hole under a window,
put it out again, and looked on to some
one below. Again he put his head in at
the fatal window, and as he withdrew it
and looked around again, the muzzle of a
rifle was placed close to his ear, the
general's head, and the vagabond inside
blew his brains out, the charge coming out
at the front of his helmet; the fellow then
threw the rifle at him. The man was
brought out of the house by Major Slade,
of the intelligence department, and was
instantly cut into a hundred pieces. There
was another house found with a horse and
camel, and inside were twenty-five men and
about three hundred muskets. The whole
were burnt alive in the house and blown
to atoms by the continuous exploding
ammunition. The real thing is, the whole
was burnt to a cinder; so that really, you see,
the general met with his death through
inadvertence. He was a brave man, and
deserves all credit.

The House of Cecil.
In Lord Salisbury's house of Cecil

was first lord of the treasury from 1743
till his death in 1764, when his brother
Newcastle succeeded him, and retained the
post with a brief of a few months) for
the next eight years. The duke was also
secretary of state for nearly thirty years,
and no third Pelham was destined to equal
success, though a Duke of Newcastle of
our own times, who won no less political
fame, could claim descent from a daughter
of Henry. The only other family which
has furnished two first lords of the treasury
since the other acquired his present
importance is that of Grenville.

Reinsdeer by the Thousand.
The approaching close of the
winter of 1879 has sent the reindeer in
numbers bands on their southward migra-
tions until they came to the narrow strait
which separates King William's land from
the mainland. The strait not being frozen
over, the number of deer which could swim
at the narrowest point must have
been well up into the thousands. The
cut was an almost perfect barrier to
Arctic deer, and takes to the water
as if he were web-footed, swimming
across the lakes in summer when the ice
is twice the distance around them. When
chased on to points of land jutting into the
sea the deer have been known to swim into
the water until lost to sight, and nothing
was ever heard of them. But
approach the strait, migrating southward
for the winter, is a zoological curiosity,
enough to convert the same sea into a
mass of ice, about the same as would be
produced by throwing two or three feet of
snow into the water. This would retard the
advance of the reindeer, so that it would fall
an easy prey to the many Netchilak Equi-
man who congregates there to slay the
deer. My party killed twenty-six deer in
a day. Ere long my best hunter, managed
to secure twelve of them. He could have
easily doubled or even trebled his total
but, but a dozen was the most he could
slay and properly butcher, disposing of their
meat and allowing proper attention to the
skins that were destined for
winter bedding and clothing. During
the last few days of September and
the early part of October there were
many times when a thousand reindeer
could be seen, looking from the top of the
hill back of our snow houses on to the edge
of a large lake. One clear night in early
October the straits were frozen over and
eighty heads were seen, and within forty
eight hours vast multitudes of deer had
been swarming around us everywhere
vanished southward like a fog swept away
by a northern wind, and we saw no more
of the reindeer until December 12, two
months later, when we had reached Back's
Great Flat river on our winter sledge
journey to Hudson's bay.
