OTAWA, May 26.—Nice weather, gay decorations, evergreen arches, blue banners, music, brass bands, enthusiasm, drums and 2500 citizens singing in chorus combined to make the reception of the Duke and Duchess of Devonshire, the Governor-General's reception to-day a credit to the Ottawa district and an honor to the Capital of the Dominion.
