THE U. S. PUBLIC SCHOOLS

ARE ACCEPTED BY THE POPE'S SPECIAL ALEGATE

Archbishop Sattoli's Mandate as Published to the American Bishops—What is Good Doctrine in the States ought to Apply to the Dominion of Canada.

From The New York, Chicago, I. All care must be taken to erect Catholic schools to enlarge and improve the already established, and to make them equal to the public schools in teaching and discipline.

When there is no Catholic school at all, or when the one that is available is little fitted for giving the children an education in keeping with the opportunities and the precautions of the public schools.

We enact and command that no one shall be allowed to teach in a parochial school who has not proven his fitness for the position by previous examination.

Normal schools, as they are called, are to be established where they are wanting and are evidently necessary.

We strictly forbid anyone, whether Bishop or Priest, and this is the express prohibition of the Sovereign Pontiff through the Sacred Congregation, either by act or by threat to exclude from the Sacraments or unworthy parents who choose to send their children to the public schools.

To the Catholic Church belongs the duty and the divine right of teaching all nations to believe the truth of the Gospel, and to observe whatsoever Christ commanded.

The adoption of one of three plans is recommended, the choice to be made according to local circumstances in the different States and various personal relations.

The second is to have a catechism class outside the public school building, and also classes of higher Christian doctrine, where, at fixed intervals, the Catholic children assemble with diligence and pleasure.

The third plan does not seem as first sight so suitable, but is found to be intimately with the duty of both parents and pastors.

For the standing and growth of Catholic schools, it seems that care should be taken that the teachers prove themselves qualified, not only by previous examination before the Diocesan Board, but by a certificate or diploma from the School Board of the State, awarded after successful examination.

It is long since the Holy See, after consultation with the United States of America, decreed that parochial schools and other institutions under the direction of the Bishops, such as according to the conditions of the Holy See, are to be maintained and supported by the State.

It is necessary that what are called Normal Schools should reach such efficiency in preparing teachers as their graduates shall not fail to obtain the diploma of the State.

It is left to the judgment and the wisdom of the Ordinaries to decide whether, in a certain part of their respective dioceses, a parochial school can be built and kept up in a fitting condition, not inferior to the temporal condition of the parents, while a grave need for procuring their spiritual welfare and the decent support of the church are pressing.
