UNWRITTEN LAW RECOGNIZED IN ENGLAND FOR FIRST TIME

Lieut. Douglas Malcolm Acquitted on Charge of Murdering Bogus Count Who Was Too Friendly With Soldier's Wife.

London, Aug. 19.—The "unwritten law" whereby a man may kill his wife's seducer was recognized by an English jury today against the first time in the history of the English nation the recognition of the "unwritten law" in a civilian case. The "unwritten law" was established in a London court when the first lieutenant in the 3rd Buffs, Douglas Malcolm, was acquitted on the charge of murdering a woman who was too friendly with a soldier's wife.

The woman, who was a wealthy young merchant, was a war returned on leave from France and found his wife with the so-called count. He attacked the "count" and afterwards challenged him to a duel, but the "count" ignored the challenge. Malcolm visited the "count's" London lodgings and other lodgers invited to hearing a struggle, followed by a shot. They found the "count" dead.

Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations

The sole heir of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District in which the land may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency) on certain conditions.
