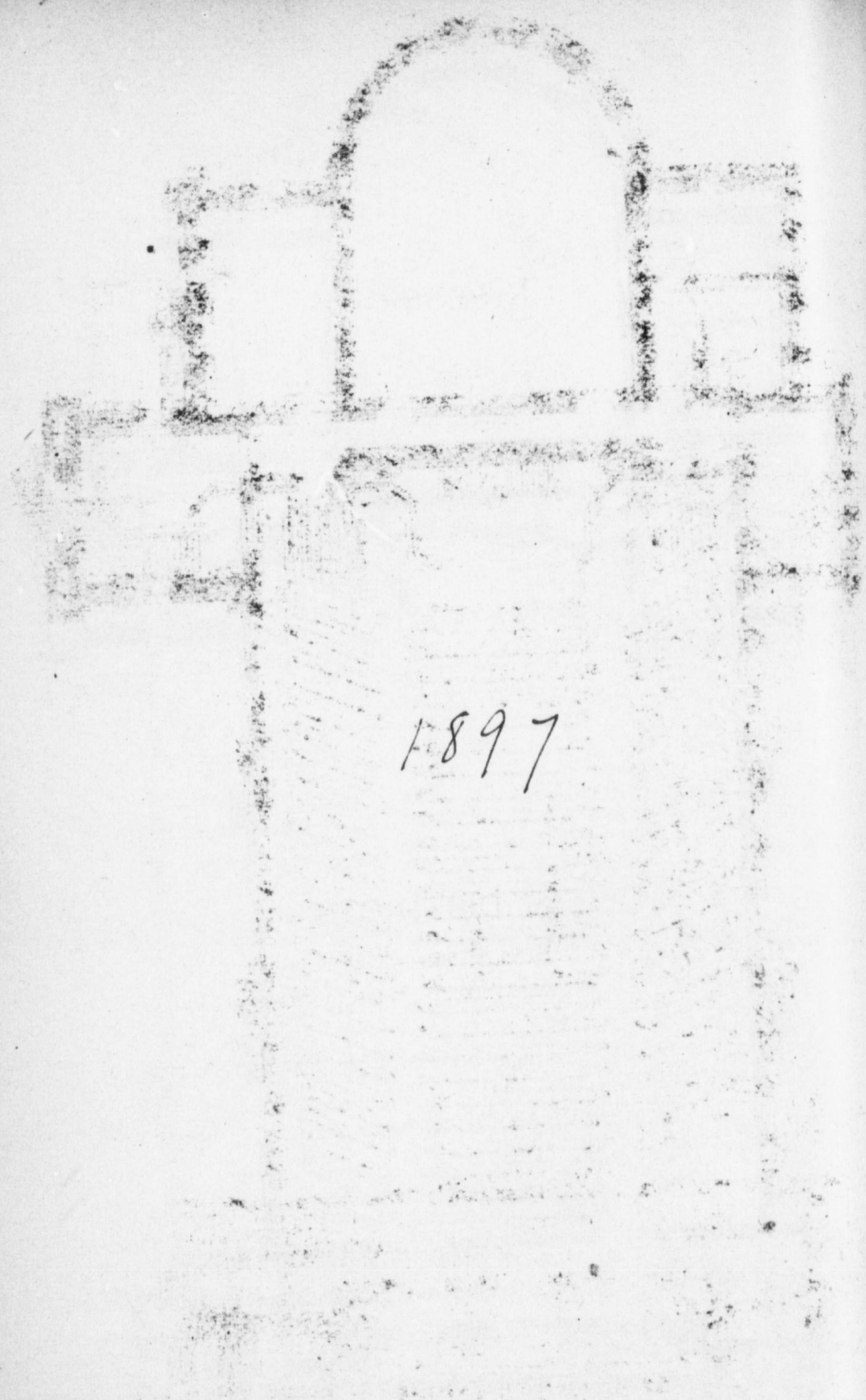


ST ANDREW'S CHURCH.

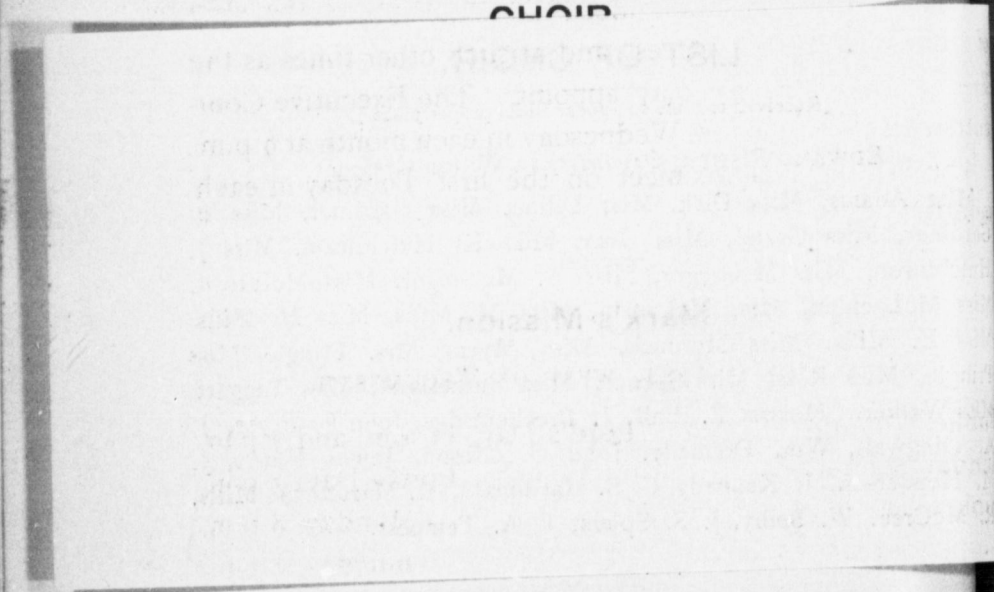

Pew rents are payable to the Treasurer, quarterly in advance, at the Managers' Room, on the 21st day of March, June, September and December. Sittings not paid for within six weeks thereafter may be re-let by the Managers.

The Managers will be in their Room on the first Monday in each month, from 7.30 to 9 p.m., to attend to applications for sittings. Those who give up their sittings should notify the Managers, as sittings cannot be transferred to other parties except by the Managers.

Packages of envelopes will be furnished, on application to the Managers, to Members and Adherents of the Church who are willing to adopt the "Envelope System" of making their weekly offerings. The plan is the following: Each envelope bears a number corresponding to the number opposite to the contributor's name on the Treasurer's book. Each contributor undertakes to give a fixed amount weekly, and to make up the deficiency in case of absence on one or more Sundays.

The Minister will, as a rule, be found at home between 1 and 2 o'clock p.m. He will also endeavor to be at home on Friday afternoon and evening, after 4 o'clock; and will be glad if members of the Congregation, and especially those who are comparative strangers, will avail themselves of the opportunity of coming to the Manse.

### Missionary, Educational and Benevolent Funds.

Contributions will be made on the third Sunday in each month during the current year, in special envelopes provided for the purpose, to the Missionary, Educational and Benevolent Funds of the Church. Contributors may, if they choose, indicate the special objects to which they wish their contributions applied. The amount not so designated will be distributed by the Kirk Session. The following are the chief objects for which contributions are asked:

1. HOME MISSIONS.—For the support of 165 Mission Fields, having 517 Preaching Stations, in the needy districts of Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba, the North-West Territories, and British Columbia. The amount required for the current year is \$30,000.
2. FOREIGN MISSIONS.—For the support of Missions in five fields. (1) Among the Indians in the North-West; (2) In Formosa; (3) In Central India; (4) In the New Hebrides; (5) In Trinidad. \$40,000 is needed for this year for the part of this work under the care of the Western Section.
3. FRENCH EVANGELIZATION.—Missionaries, Colporteurs and Teachers are employed, under the direction of the Assembly's Board, in spreading a pure gospel among the French Canadians. There is an admirably conducted School

at Pointe aux Trembles. The estimated amount required for the current year is \$35,000.

4. COLLEGES—(1) There is a common fund for the support of Knox, Queen's and Montreal Theological Colleges. The amount required this year is \$19,000. (2) This Congregation is responsible for two scholarships—one of \$60 and the other of \$50—in Queen's University. (3) A grant is also made for the support of Manitoba College.

5. MINISTERS' WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.—For providing annuities for the widows and orphans of ministers who die in the service of the Church. Each minister contributes \$12 per annum to this fund.

6. AGED AND INFIRM MINISTERS' FUND.—Amount required, \$8,000. Each minister who wishes to have a claim on this fund is required to contribute annually at the rate of one-half per cent. of professional income.

7. ST. MARK'S MISSION.—Mission work is carried on in the western portion of the Parish assigned to St. Andrew's Church. Annual cost, including stipend of Missionary, say \$1,200. One half of the stipend is paid by the Managers.

The Fund for the AUGMENTATION OF MINISTERS' STIPENDS is not included in the above. A special collection will be made for this object towards the end of the year.

## Minutes of the Fifty-Fourth Annual Meeting of the Congregation.

The Annual Meeting of the Congregation of St. Andrew's Church was held in the Lecture Room of the Church, on the evening of Wednesday, the 21st January, 1885, a large representation of the Congregation being present.

The Rev. D. J. Macdonnell was appointed Chairman, and Mr. Wm. Mitchell Secretary, of the meeting.

The meeting was opened with reading of the Scriptures and prayer, conducted by the Chairman.

The minutes of last Annual Meeting, as printed in the Annual Report, were held as read and sustained.

The Report and Financial Statement of the Board of Managers for the past year was read by the Secretary, and on motion of Mr. I. C. Gilmor, seconded by Mr. Jas. M. Rogerson, the Report and Statement were received and adopted.

The required notice having been given by Mr. McIntyre at last Annual Meeting, it was unanimously resolved to amend Articles III. and XV. of the Constitution by omitting the word "male" in each, so as to give women the same privileges as men at the Annual Meetings of the Congregation.

Mr. C. S. Macdonald moved, seconded by Mr. C. E. McPherson, "That the election of Managers be made by ballot."

Mr. Jas. M. Rogerson moved in amendment, seconded by Mr. J. D. Henderson, "That the election of Managers be made by open vote." Upon the vote being taken, the Chairman declared the amendment carried.

Mr. A. T. Fulton having declined re-election, Mr. J. I. Davidson was elected in his place, and Messrs. John Kay and Wm. Mitchell were re-elected.

Mr. J. D. Henderson moved, seconded by Mr. James Maclennan, "That the thanks of the Congregation are due and they are hereby tendered to Mr. A. T. Fulton for his valued services as Manager during the past eleven years." Carried unanimously.

The Secretary read a report from the Organ Committee, whereupon Mr. J. T. Small moved, seconded by Mr. W. A. Shepard, "That a hearty vote of thanks be tendered to the Organ Committee for their services in connection with the new organ." Carried.

The Reports of St. Andrew's, St. Mark's and Dorset Sunday and Night Schools, and Dorset Sewing Class, were read by the Superintendents of these various departments of Christian work, and received.

Mr. Somerville read an interesting report of the work in which he is engaged in connection with St. Mark's Mission Church.

Reports were also read from the Men's, Women's, and Willing Helpers' Associations.

Mr. James Maclennan then moved, seconded by Mr. J. D. Henderson, "That the reports of the different Schools and Associations which have now been read, be received, and the hearty thanks of the Congregation tendered to the workers in these organizations for their valuable services, and satisfaction expressed at the excellent work which is being done by them." Carried.

The accompanying Statement of the Treasurer shows in detail the receipts and disbursements for the past year. Summarized, these are as follows, viz. :

As compared with last year's revenue, the ordinary Sunday collections are almost identical, while from pew rents there is an increase of \$100. \$3,383.40 of the Sunday collections was received through the envelope system, and \$2,255.89 by open collection, the average for the year being \$108.23 per Sunday. Out of 410 pew-holders only 152 are conforming to the system of contributing by envelopes to the ordinary revenue. The more general

adoption of this system is earnestly recommended. Among the items of disbursement are \$4,162, paid on account of the Memorial Committee, this being the entire cost of the Memorial Window, and the works connected therewith; and \$1,710.33 paid on account of St. Mark's Church. Of this amount \$1,260.66 was applied in repayment of a debt contracted on the building when originally erected in 1870; the balance is for expenses connected with the services which are held in the Church.

At the suggestion of the Kirk Session, the Managers agreed to pay out of revenue one-half of the stipend of the Missionary engaged in the western section of the parish, and to defray the expenses connected with the services held in St. Mark's Mission Church.

In the early part of the year a Committee of members and adherents of the Congregation was formed, with the sanction of the Managers, for the purpose of obtaining contributions towards purchasing a new organ for the Church. The result of this effort is that subscriptions to the amount of \$6,599 have been obtained; and upon a payment of \$3,500 being made to the Managers by the Committee, the Managers, at the request of the Committee, consented to assume the responsibility of purchasing a suitable organ, and appointed a committee for this purpose, consisting of Rev. D. J. Macdonnell, and Messrs. A. M. Cosby, A. Petersen, Ed. Fisher and Wm. Mitchell, convener. This committee put themselves in communication with some of the most eminent organ builders in England, the United States and Canada, from whom tenders were received, and after careful consideration it was decided to entrust the building of the new organ to Messrs. S. R. Warren & Son, of this city, the builders of

the old organ, which for the last seventeen years has given so much satisfaction to the Congregation in aiding the service of praise, both in the old Church and in the present edifice. The new organ will cost when complete about \$12,000; about \$9,000 of this sum is either paid or guaranteed by the original committee. The builders allow \$1,500 for the old organ, and the Managers have undertaken to pay out of the surplus of last year's revenue the sum of about \$1,500 to provide a case for the organ which will be in keeping with the architecture and internal arrangements of the Church. The full payment of the new organ is thus assured.

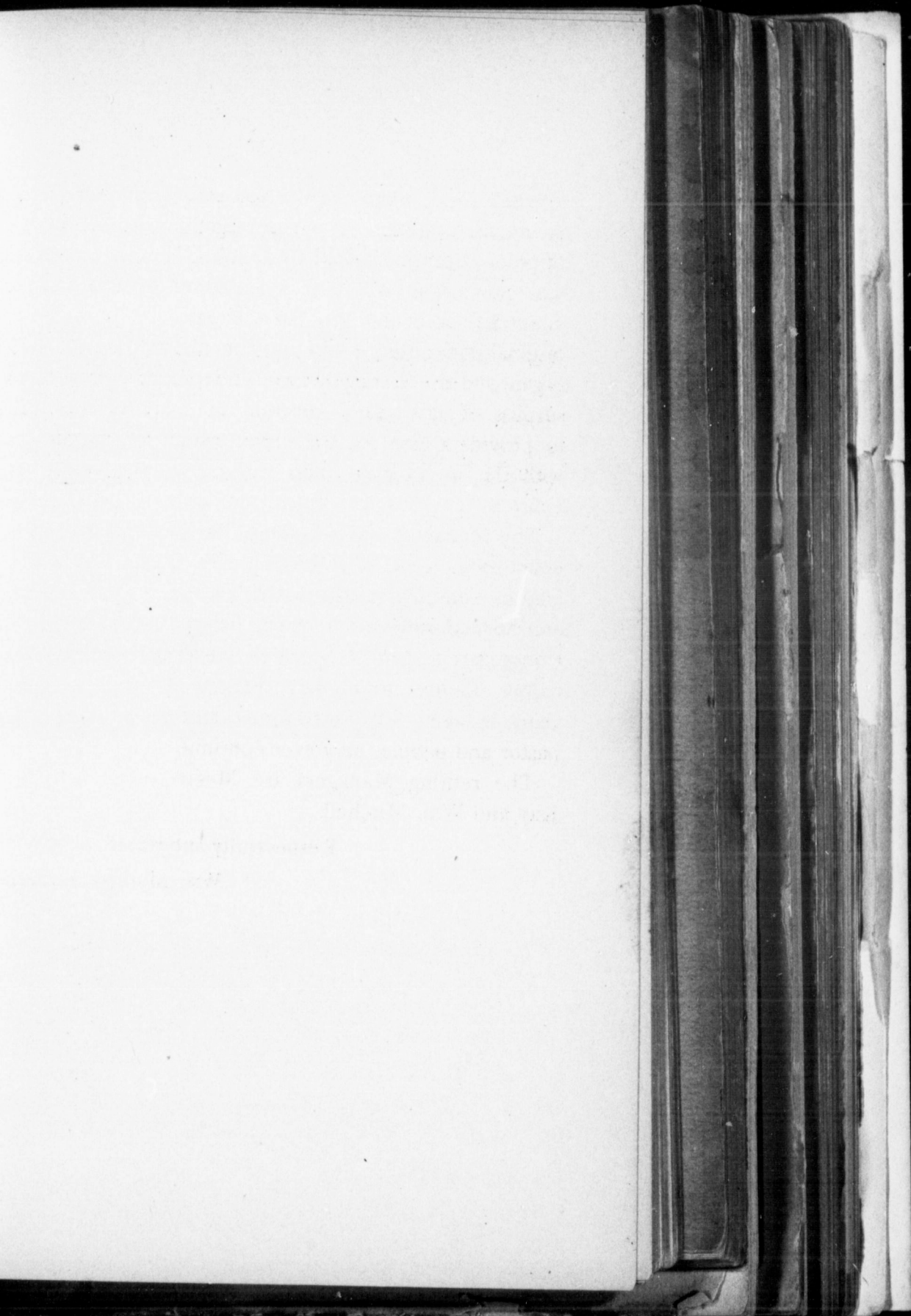
The Managers have to report further that they have decided to increase Mr. Macdonnell's stipend to \$4,000 per annum, commencing from the 1st Jan. This action, they are satisfied, will meet with the hearty approval of the entire Congregation; and they sincerely express the hope that the happy relations which have existed for the past fourteen years between Mr. Macdonnell and the Congregation, as pastor and people, may ever continue.

The retiring Managers are Messrs. A. T. Fulton, John Kay and Wm. Mitchell.

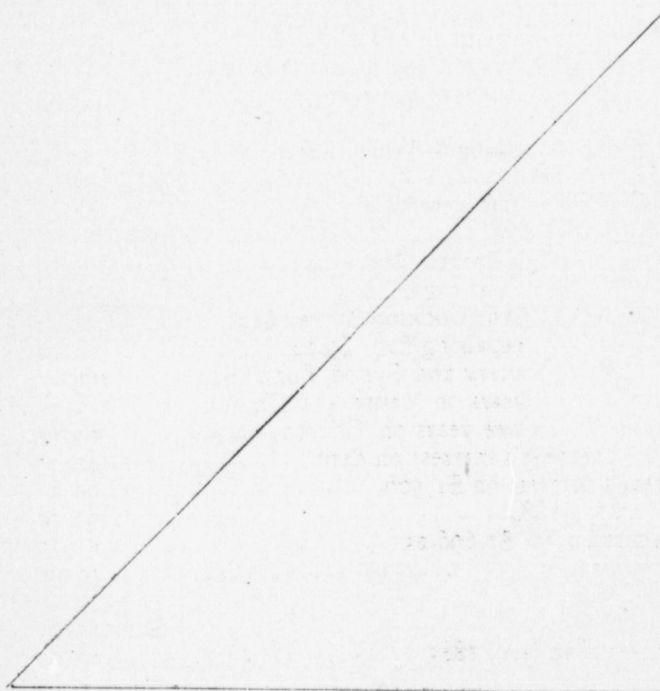

### Report of Organ Committee.

On the 12th of January last the Organ Committee was formed, composed of the following :

Messrs. Jas. Maclennan, John Kay, Jas. Bethune, Wm. Mitchell, Robert Hay, A. M. Cosby, Dr. Geikie, J. W. Langmuir, H. Cassels, Chas. Perry, Thos. McGaw, James Massie, W. Beardmore, E. Fisher, E. A. Scadding, John I. Davidson, Angus Clark, R. J. Wylie, A. Petersen, W. Whyte, John Carlaw, Dr. Clark, A. H. Malloch, R. Christie, and Thos. Davies.

This committee at once commenced operations by issuing a "special circular" to the Congregation, setting out the object in view, and the means which they proposed adopting to secure the required amount.

The response to this circular was so hearty and substantial that the committee felt justified in securing the organ, and having it placed in the Church at as early a date as possible.

The number of families has increased by three; the number of single persons by twenty-two; the number of baptisms by nine; the number of deaths shows a decrease of seven as compared with 1883.

Contributions to the Session Fund on the three Communion Sundays and on Thanksgiving Day, amounted to \$444.55, as compared with \$474.89 in the previous year. This amount has been applied almost entirely to the relief of the poor connected with the Congregation, the larger

portion having been expended under the direction of the Dorcas Committee of the Women's Association, as set forth in the Statement of their Treasurer.

The Session rejoice in the special indications of prosperity in the case of each of the Schools connected with the Church, and in the good work done with so much heartiness by the several Associations. The growth of St. Mark's Sunday School is specially noteworthy.

A new departure was made in May last by the appointment of the Rev. J. F. Somerville, B. A., to labor as Missionary in the Parish that has been assigned to St. Andrew's Church, and to conduct services in St. Mark's. The Parish extends from York St. to Strachan Avenue, between Queen St. and the Bay as far as Brock St., and between Adelaide St. and the Bay west of Brock St. The Women's Association made a thorough canvass of this portion of the city last spring, preparatory to Mr. Somerville's coming, in order to ascertain who were living in the neglect of Christian ordinances. The Missionary's report shows what need there was of some effort being put forth, and indicates that there have been tokens of the Lord's blessing resting on the work done. May there be "showers of blessing!" The Willing Helpers are rendering valuable aid to the Minister and the Missionary by visiting many of the neglected, and inviting them to the services in St. Andrew's and St. Mark's.

The amount raised during the past year for missionary, educational and benevolent objects by the collectors appointed by the Women's Association is (with interest added) \$1,989.62, as compared with \$1,943.97 in 1883. The special collection for Augmentation of Stipends, with

The members of the Session thus called to mourn the death of one who was younger in years than the majority of them, and whom they had hoped to see spared for many years of faithful service, would stir themselves up to renewed activity in the work of the Lord, actuated by the solemn consideration that "the night cometh when no man can work."

This branch of our work was successfully commenced last April by the ladies of the Church, who visited the entire parish to find out those who did not attend church, with a view to have them attend the services about to be opened in St. Mark's.

Your Missionary commenced work on the first Sabbath in May, and a service has been continued every Sabbath evening since that time.

We have also had a Gospel Service on Thursday evening and a Bible Class on Sabbath afternoon. This class is now held on Monday evening. There is also a meeting on Thursday evening for the children, where they learn to sing the hymns, and occasionally listen to an address.

An efficient choir, with the new organ lately purchased, has added very considerably to the interest and profit of all the services, and has been a means of increasing the attendance.

We soon saw that if the people were to be benefited by the services, we must go down to them and "constrain them to come in," and therefore the chief part of your Missionary's work has been the visiting of the people, reading God's Word in their homes, and inviting them to the services.

Several of the ladies have helped in this part of the work by regularly visiting the people, and distributing copies of the "Mission Union" and other gospel literature.

Over two hundred and fifty families have been visited. There are fifty families west of Brock Street who should

attend, and who do sometimes attend St. Mark's, and by continued visitation we may succeed in getting one hundred families who do not attend any church.

The average attendance at these services has been as follows :

Sabbath service.....	50 to 75
Thursday evening service.....	20 to 30
Bible Class.....	15 to 20

We have decided to open a morning service on the first Sabbath of February.

For a time the work was somewhat discouraging, but of late we have been encouraged by seeing some fruit of our labor; "the hand of the Lord" has been with us, and some have "believed and turned unto the Lord."

Considering the importance of this part of our work, we desire to go forward remembering the apostle's injunction, "Be ye steadfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labor is not in vain in the Lord."

## Report of Women's Association.

Nineteen meetings have been held during the year, with an average attendance of twenty-five. In all, eighty-five ladies have taken part in the work.

Our first twelve meetings, from January to May, were conducted on the same plan as those held last year, namely, meeting fortnightly for work at 11 a.m., and holding our business meeting at 3 p.m.

When we held our first meeting in the fall, it was decided that this Association should abandon the plan of holding entertainments *for the purpose of raising money*, and adopt, in its place, that of direct giving. It was arranged that while the various committees should carry on their work as heretofore, all the members should endeavor to make the afternoon meeting on the first and third Friday of each month as interesting as possible, and do their best to bring a voluntary contribution at each meeting to the missionary box.

Six gatherings have been held on the new plan, with an average attendance of thirty-two, and an average contribution of \$7 00 per meeting. Letters from our own Missionaries in India, Formosa, Trinidad, the North-West, and stations on the home field, have been read, as well as general missionary intelligence, and other interesting matter. We had the pleasure at one meeting of the presence of Mrs. Fraser Campbell, and of an account of her daily life as a missionary's wife in India; and, at another, of very stimulating words from the Foreign Secretary of the Women's Foreign Missionary Society.

our funds might not fall behind those of last year, but the members almost unanimously agreed rather to see what could be given by themselves by a certain date, and the result was that on the day fixed, \$179.20 was "offered willingly to the Lord;" and thus our funds were brought up to \$401.00, considerably above the measure of last year. One entertainment had been held in June, which resulted in \$54.00, but it took the form of an "at home," and no tickets were sold by the Association during the year.

We took part with the Associations of other Presbyterian Churches in the city, in sending out, under the auspices of the W. F. M. S., boxes of clothing to the destitute Indians of our N.-W. Mission, for which very hearty thanks have been received from Rev. Hugh Mackay.

The SEWING COMMITTEE takes orders for needlework, and is composed of all those who find it convenient to give time to this purpose. Its members have held sixteen meetings, and have earned for the benefit of the Association \$42.00. They hope for a larger attendance now than they had in the end of the year.

The COLLECTING COMMITTEE has had the assistance of seventeen ladies, and the sum of \$1,989.62 has been collected for the Session by monthly calls on the members of the Congregation. The new plan adopted by the Session renders the work of this committee in future unnecessary, but the Association hopes that the time and labor so cheerfully given by these ladies will now be directed to some other department of work, so that no power may be lost.

The VISITING COMMITTEE has arranged that some of its members should call on all the strangers who have reported themselves as having joined the Congregation. Owing to the sudden removal of a family from the city, one

The DORCAS COMMITTEE has given assistance to twelve families during the year. Most of the recipients are aged and infirm, and all belong to the Congregation.

At the Annual Meeting of the Association, held on the 2nd January, 1885, the committees, after reporting, were re-elected, with power to add to their numbers; the funds in the hands of the Treasurer were allocated almost equally between Home and Foreign Missionary objects, as indicated below; and a minute was recorded, expressing great regret at parting with Mrs. Angus Morrison and Miss Morrison, who, the one on the Dorcas Committee and the other on the Sewing Committee, and as General Treasurer, have given valuable assistance during many years.

The reports of the various branches of the Dorset Mission work, presented herewith, show that the labours of the workers in the different departments have been attended with a large measure of success.

The ASSOCIATION accepted with regret the resignation of Mr. James Strachan, who so ably and faithfully filled the position of Superintendent of the Night School. He was succeeded for a short time by Mr. Wilbur Henderson. The duties of this important position are now discharged by Mr. S. Moore.

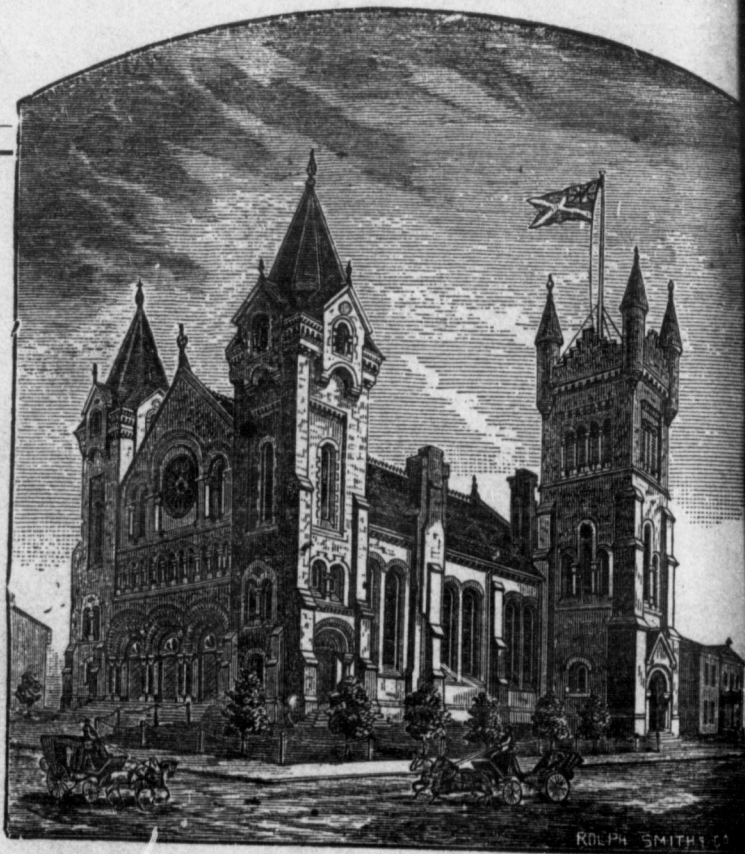
