We had 360, too,000 coustomers in the empire, and should show the United States that our best interests laid within the empire. The people of the mother country could take all the products of Canada except those we required for ourselves. We would have no difficulty in obtaining the preference if we showed our willingness to take the products of Great Britain, not free of duty, but in preference to those of foreign countries. Let Canada take the first move, as she had more to gain than any other colony. In closing, Col. Vincent urged upon all present to do what they could to develop trade with the empire.


