THE MERCHANTS' EXCHANGE. The opening of the Merchants' Exchange yesterday was an event of considerable importance and interest in the commercial history of this city. In all business communities it is recognized as a necessary step towards the more complete central point where business men can meet at certain hours of the day, for the purpose of communicating with each other and transacting business together. In the olden days of the city when the population was small and business men were near together no difficulty was experienced by our merchants in seeing each other. No doubt the venerable institution known as the 11 o'clock which it was considered necessary to imitate a certain modulus of old Jamaica run derived a good deal of its importance from the fact that it was the means of bringing business men together, and the business men of St. John are scattered over a wide area, so that the necessity for a merchants' exchange has become very pressing. At one time Chubb's Corner served the purpose to a considerable extent, but it has never been in recent years what it was before the fire, and certainly it can hardly be expected that our merchants should make a practice of meeting at a place which offers no facilities for the transaction of business, or even for ordinary comfort. The rooms of the Board of Trade although centrally situated have never been sufficiently commodious to serve the purpose required, and therefore the establishment of the Merchants' Exchange seemed to be demanded in the general interest. Certainly the Messrs. Pughley are very much to be congratulated on the enterprise and spirit they have displayed in this matter, and it is to be hoped that their reward will be a simple one. Some people have imagined that the Merchants' Exchange is intended to compete with the Board of Trade, but this is not the case. There is no reason whatever why one institution should interfere with the other in any way. The Board of Trade has functions of its own entirely different from those of the Merchants' Exchange, and it will be able to pursue them without any interference hereafter as it has in the past.
