We have received the Extraordinary Supplement to the Berlin State Gazette, of the 19th inst. which contains an article from Odessa, of the 1st of September, but it preserves a total silence respecting the operations of the army, and merely mentions the intended departure of the Emperor from Odessa for the camp before Varna, on the 1st or 2d inst.—It adds that the Porte has accepted the intervention for Greece, conformably to the Trenty of the 6th of July.

There are articles from Odessa and Bucharest, which only make us more anxious for the arrival of the detailed official accounts. They acknowledge that a Russian corps, which had crossed the Danube and occupied Turtukai, had been attacked by the Turks, and forced to recross the Danube—and that in the excursion of the Turks from the camp at Kalafat, the town of Zecinitz bad been burnt.

The debarkation of the first division of the Expedition to the Morea, has been announced at Paris by a telegraphic despatch from Toulon. One brigade landed upon the little island of Sapienza, and another at Navarin. The second division was spoken, on the 30th, twenty leagues from Navarin, and would arrive the next day. Ibrahim Pacha received the French troops in a very friendly manner, and was preparing to embark for Egypt. Admiral Codrington and the French and English squadrons bad anchored in the port of Navarin, to wait for the Egyptian transports, which were off the coast. The army of Ibrahim is supposed not to exceed 14,000 or 15,000 men.

We understand that by one part of the agreement concluded between the Pacha of Egypt and Sir E. Codrington, 1200 of Ibrahim's troops will be left behind, to garrison the forts, in conjunction with the Turks. conclusion, therefore, from the present state of the quarter's accounts, is not unfavorable.
