

TWO MONTHS IN THE ROCKIES

RETURN OF PROF. COLMAN OF THE SCHOOL OF SCIENCE.

Mount Brown, Hitherto supposed to be the highest mountain in Canada, was found to have only an elevation of 9000 feet—A 300-Mile Journey in a Canvas Boat.

It will be remembered that a year ago Professor A. P. Colman of the School of Science and three others spent the summer in exploring the mountain regions in the vicinity of Mount Brown in the Rockies.

During this expedition they discovered a number of lakes and a pass 300 feet lower than that recorded by the C.P.R. They also made the discovery that the source of the Athabasca consists of two large streams instead of one as had been supposed.

The party had with them on this expedition two Stoney Indians, Jim Jacob, a near neighbor of the famous Chief Jacob, and Mark To-young-man, who acted as guides. They followed the Suwapita (Violent River) to Fortress Lake, and then descended the river to the mouth of the Athabasca.

Accordingly after the close of the University term in May last Prof. A. P. Colman, Mr. L. G. Colman of the School of Science, and three others spent the summer in exploring the mountain regions in the vicinity of Mount Brown in the Rockies.

They provided themselves among other things with a canvas boat weighing about 60 pounds. This time they dispensed with guides, as they had gone on the greater part of their journey before, and they found that they were no longer in the district than the Indians themselves, having gone far beyond where the Indians are accustomed to go.

They reached Athabasca Pass by following the course of the Whirlpool River, which leads out of the Upper Athabasca River. Often they had to cut their way through the deep growth of underwood that obstructs any passage, as they traveled along trails that had not been used for many years.

NEXT YEAR'S ASSESSMENT.

An Increase of a Million and a Half—Estimated Figures For Taxpayers.

Yesterday Assessment Commissioner Manghan completed the figures for the assessment of 1894. There is an increase of over \$600,000 in the real property, a slight increase in income, an increase of over \$600,000 in personal property, or a total increase of \$1,500,000 in the whole assessable property of the city of Toronto.

Extensive reductions have been made in the outlying districts to east, west and north, but these reductions, extensive as they may appear, have been more than counterbalanced by the value of new buildings erected last fall and during the past summer, and by an increase of assessment in the heart of the city where last year valuations have proved so low.
