BRIEF DEVOTIONS

FOR THE

HOLY COMMUNION.

For those who have but little leisure for devotion in approaching the Holy Communion, the following brief helps are intended. May the God of all grace bless them to as many as shall use them !

CONSIDER:

I. THE NATURE OF THIS SACRAMENT.

It is the Body and Blood of Christ.—St. Matt. xxvi, 26—28.

II. THE USE OF IT.

1. As a Communion.—Acts ii, 42; 1 Cor. x, 16.

2. As a Sacrifice. -1 Cor. xi, 26.

III. THE BENEFITS OF IT.

It is the Food of our Spiritual Life.-St. John vi, 53.

IV. THE PERIL OF IT.

Lest we eat and drink unworthily.-1 Cor. xi, 27.

V. THE PREPARATION FOR IT.

1. In self examination.-1 Cor. xie 28.

2. In confession and prayer for divine forgivness.— Psalm xxvi, 6.

3. In Devotion.-Psalm cxvi, 13.

All devout Christians know that the greatest assistance in leading a holy life is the continual worthy reception of the Holy Communion; and all must feel that a holy life is the only *sure* preparation for a happy death.

Our wisdom, ther, is to prepare for each reception of the Holy Communion, as if it were to be our last; for he who is duly prepared for that, is alone prepared for death; but he who is unprepared to meet Jesus in the Sacrament must be equally unready to meet Jesus as the Judge.

Our Church, with motherly care, has not left us in ignorance of what makes a true preparation. This is how she instructs us to make ready for the Heavenly Feast:—

"The way and means thereto is; First to examine your lives and conversations by the rule of God's commandments; and whereinsoever ye shall perceive yourselves to have offended, either by will, word, or deed, there to bewail your own sinfulness, and to confess yourselves to Almighty God, with full purpose of amendment of life. And if ye shall perceive your offences to be such as are not only against God, but also against your neighbours; then ye shall reconcile yourselves unto them; being ready to make restitution and satisfaction, according to the utmost of your powers, for all injuries and wrongs done by you to any other; and being likewise ready to forgive others that have offended you, as ye would have forgiveness of your offences at God's hand: for otherwise the receiving of the holy Commanion doth nothing else but increase your damnation,"

" And because it is requisite, that no man should come to the holy Communion, but with a full trust in God's mercy, and with a quiet conscience; therefore, if there be any of you, who, by this means, cannot quiet his own conscience herein, but requireth further comfort or counsel, let him come to me, or to some other discreet and learned Minister of God's word, and open his grief; that by the ministry of God's holy word he may receive the benefit of absolution, together with ghostly counsel and advice, to the quieting of his conscience, and avoiding of all scruple and doubtfulness."

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"The rule of God's commandments" by which we are to examine ourselves is briefly contained in the Ten Commandments, always recited in the Communion office. We should judge ourselves by this rule as explained in the Sermon on the Mount, and the rest of the New, Testament.

This examination of ourselves should be performed most strictly, and with earnest prayer :- many books are published which will help you in this. Ask your Clergyman to procure you one, and also to teach you, if necessary, how to use it properly.

BEFORE SELF-EXAMINATION.

O Lord God, who lighteneth every man that cometh into the world, let the light of Thy grace shine into my heart, that I may fully know my shortcomings and my sins, make my examination of myself to be earnest and real. Grant that I may not try to excuse myself, or make light of my faults : For Jesus' Sake.—Amen.

A short Form of Examination in the three Classes of TEMPTATIONS.

Gen. III., 5, 6; St. Luke IV., 1-13; 1 Thess. V., 23.

I. SUGGESTED BY THE DEVIL TO YOUR SPIRIT.—St. Luke x, 18; St. John viii, 44; 1 Tim. iii, 6.

Pride, or trying to do without God, in work, pleasure, or worship.

Profaneness, such as swearing.

Conceit, or self esteem.

Vanity, or love of esteem of others.

Anger. or cruelty.

Envy, or desire to rob others.

Disobedience to those whom God hath set over you. Rudeness, or flattery.

Lying or Hypocrisy, or any kind of deceit.

II. OFFERED BY THE WORLD TO YOUR MIND.—1 St. John ii, 15-17.

Stealing money, food, clothing, or any property of others.

Cheating, or taking unfair advantage.

Covetousness, or discontent.

Meanness, or grudging what is due to God or man.

Ambition, or pushing eagerly for wealth, honour or influence.

Ostentation, or love of show, dress, furniture, &c.

Uncleanness in thought, word, or deed.

Immodesty, or lightness in manner.

Gluttony, by eating too much, or too delicately.

Drunkenness, or the abuse of any kind of stimulant.

Sloth, by lying in bed, or indulging in luxury, languor, &c.

Idleness, by not doing your work regularly, or not saying your prayers properly.

During self examination if thy conscience answers 'Not Guilty' to any question, say,

Not unto me, O Lord, but unto Thy Name be the praise for Thy loving mercy and for Thy truth's sake.

But if conscience answers 'Guilty,' say,

God be merciful to me, a sinner.

After Examination.

O MY FATHER, I am really sorry for having offended Thee by these my sins. I will show my sorrow by my future holy life. Pardon in me any want of sincerity; pardon my coldness, and give me real earnestness, real love, which will make me serve Thee better. This, my Father, is my humble petition; my greatest longing. Hear me and answer me, for Jesus' sake. Amen.

A LMIGHTY AND EVERLASTING GOD, who hatest nothing that Thou hast made, and dost forgive the sins of all them that are penitent; create and make in us new and contrite hearts, that we worthily lamenting our sins, and acknowledging our wretchedness, may obtain of Thee, the God of all mercy, perfect remission and torgiveness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

COME, HOLY GHOST, Thou who dost convince the world of sin, of righteousness, and of judgment, come and lead me, a sinner, into the paths of righteousness, so that judging myself I my not be judged. Lead me in the paths of repentance and amendment of life.

Make me to know wherein true repentance consists; and, knowing this, to choose it as my portion; even if it be with all the bitterness and shame of confession to those whom I have wronged or to Thee through Thy Minister.

I resign myself to Thy will; I yield my soul to Thy guidance. Unite me to Thyself by Thy Holy Mysteries, that I may be one with Thee, as Thou art with the Father and the Son for evermore. Amen.

We sinners, beseech Thee, to hear us.

That we may receive Thee into our hearts with love and fear, and thereby obtain pardon and forgiveness of all our sins,

We sinners, beseech Thee, to hear us.

That in this holy Sacrament we may so discern the Lord's Body and Blood, that it may not be to us judgment and condemnation, but life and salvation, and that worthily receiving the same we neither hunger nor thirst any more, nor die eternally,

We sinners, beseech Thee, to hear us.

That through the worthy participation thereof Thou mayest for ever abide in us, and we in Thee, and that as many as eat this bread may be made one in Thy μ sace and love,

We sinners, beseech Thee, to hear us.

That in innocency we may compass Thine altar, O Lord, and offer up ourselves a living, holy, and acceptable sacrifice to Thee, and continue in Thy faith and fear unto our lives' end, and at length behold Thee, O Saviour, with open face in everlasting glory,

We sinners, beseech Thee, to hear us.

R. Replenished with all sweetness and delight.

A LMIGHTY GOD, I draw near to the Sacrament of Thine only begotten Son, I draw near, as a sick man to the Physician, as one defiled to the Fountain, as one blind to the Light, as one poor and needy to the Lord of Heaven and Earth; wherefore I implore Thee to heal all my siekness, to wash away all my defilement, to give light to my blindness, to enrich my poverty, so that I may receive the Bread of Angels, with such penitence and devotion, such purity and faith as may avail to the welfare and sulvation of my soul. Grant this O Father, for Thy Son's sake Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE LAMENTATION OF A SINNER.

(AN ACT OF CONTRITION TO BE SAID KNEELING.)

O LORD, turn not Thy Face from me, Who lie in woeful state, Lamenting all my sinful life, Before Thy mercy-gate—

A gate which opens wide to those Who do lament their sin : Shut not that gate against me, Lord, But let me enter in.

And call me not to strict account How I have sojourned here, For then my guilty conscience knows How vile I shall appear.

Therefore, with tears, I come to beg Of my offended God

For pardon, like a child that dreads His angry parent's rod. So come I to Thy mercy-gate, Where mercy doth abound, Imploring pardon for my sin

To heal my deadly wound.

O Lord, I need not to repeat The comfort I would have :

Thou knowest, O Lord, before I ask, The blessing I do erave.

Mercy, good Lord, mercy I ask, This is the total sum;

For mercy, Lord, is all my suit: Lord, let thy mercy come ! Amen.

ON THE MORNING OF RECEPTION.

Lord, when I present myself and my love, as all the gift I have to offer at Thine Altar, next to my love for Thee, and for the sake of 'I hine infinite love to me, which I there remember, give me grace to love my neighbour, and to be in charity with all men, and to walk in love as Thou hast loved me. Amen.

O Lord, Jesus Christ, King of Glory! behold I desire to come to thee this day, and to receive Thy Body and Blood in this Heavenly Sacrament for thy honour and Glory, and the good of my soul. I desire to come to Thee, that I may be united to Thee, that I may henceforth abide in Thee, and Thou in me. O my God, I detest with my whole heart, all the sins by which I have ever offended Thy Divine Majesty. By thy grace I will never commit them any more : I am sorry for them, and will be sorry for them as long as I live. Forgive me, dear Lord, for thy mercies' rake; pardon all that is past, and be Thou my keeper for the time to come, that I may never more offend Thee. Amen.

A PRAYER TO OUR BLESSED LORD,

To be used before Communion.

GOD unseen, yet ever near, Thy Presence may we feel; And thus inspired with holy fear, Before Thine Altar kneel.

We come, obedient to Thy Word, To feast on heavenly Food— Our meat the body of the Lord, Our drink His precious Blood.

Think on the blessedness of Communion.

O HAPPY DAY, in which I am to receive my Saviour into my soul! O my Love, join me to Thee with the inseparable chains of tenderest love, for Thou alone canst satisfy me.

Grant to me, most loving Jesus, that in this my communion I may be most firmly united to Thee, so that I may rest in the love of Thy Love.

Shew to-day, I beseech Thee, Thy wondrous power, O Lord, and let Thy Right Hand be glorified; for I have no hope to obtain any answer to my prayer, no refuge in temptation, but only Thee, my Lord and my God. Amen.

DURING THE SERVICE,

While the Priest is preparing for the Act of Consecration, say,

Blessed be He that cometh in the name of the Lord : Hosanna in the highest.

The Lord send thee help from His Sanctuary, and strengthen thee out of Sion; remember all thy offerings, and accept thy Sacrifice. At the end of the Consecration Prayer, let the people as cooperating with the Priest and Christ in this Act of Consecration, say "the Amen." 1 Cor. XIV. 16; Rev. i, 6.

When the Consecration is ended, say,

TATE ADORE THEE, O Christ, and we bless Thee,

ed the world.

Hail sweetest Jesus! my God and my Lord! How dare I, a miserable and wretched sinner, thus salute Thee? Alas! my Master, I view with shame those Sacred Wounds, for how often have my sins opened them afresh! Behold now, I prostrate myself before Thee, my King, my God, my Judge, but still my Brother! Hail! Jesus, hail! I adore, I worship Thee! O now send Thy love into my heart, that I may love Thee as I ought.

I promise Thee, dearest Saviour, for love of Thee, seriously to amend my life, to strive never again to fall into any sins, and especially the sin I now lament. Lord, help me to keep my promise. Amen.

When about to go to the Altar, hear, as it were, an Angel whispering: The Master is come, and calleth for thee. Acknowledge your unworthiness of such a guest, and say,

Lord, I am not worthy that Thou shouldest come under my roof, but speak the word only, and my soul shall be healed.

Then rise, walk up reverently, and as you humbly kneel down, say,

Come, Good Jesus, come into my heart with that love of Thine, which passeth knowledge.

I am my Beloved's, and His desire is toward me.

After receiving the Paten

Abide with me, Lord.

After receiving the Chalice.

Let my sins be washed away in Thy Blood, O Lord.

For any special petition at the Altar.

O Eternal Father, I receive this Holy Communion of Thy dear Son's Body and Blood, humbly beseeching Thee because of It, to grant me (---).

Returning from the Altar.

My soul doth magnify the Lord, and my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Saviour.

After reception, kneeling down in your place, thankfully say,

JESUS CHRIST, my Creator and my Redeemer, whence is this to me, that my Lord should come and take up His abode in my heart! Oh that I could entertain Thee as I ought!

Let my soul, O Lord, feel the sweetness of Thy Presence. Let me taste how sweet Thou art, O Lord, that I may never more run after worldly pleasures; for Thou art the Joy of my heart, and my Portion for ever. Amen.

Say any of the following Psalms :--150, 103, 23, 118, 134.

AIL! my sweetest and most powerful Guest! My Lord Jesus Christ, daily desired, anxiously sought after, and dearly loved, I salute Thee! From my inmost heart I adore Thee, with the Father and the Holy Spirit sojourning with me, though most unworthy. Bless the Lord, O my soul ! and all that ... within me praise His Holy Name.

Now I possess Thee, Who possessest everything; what wilt Thou deny to me, to whom Thou hast given Thyself, the Source of all good things.

Re-invigorate the powers of my mind; grant that with a real and steadfast resolution, and with an ardent love, I may hold fast to Thee for ever. Let my heart be fixed on Thee alone, most precious Jesus; let my mind feast on the sweetness of Thy Presence, that, satiated with Thy love, it may long for nothing out of Thee. Amen.

MOST kind and gentle Jesus, I commend all those who have asked my prayers to Thy Divine Love, under the guidance of which Thou didst come down to earth from the bosom of Thy Father to save man. And, in union with that love wherewith Thou didst commend Thy Spirit to Thy Father, 1 commend them all to Thy Sacred Heart, beseeching Thee to take from Its treasures wherewithal to bless those for whom I pray: hear me, O Jesus, for Thy mercy's sake. Amen.

FOR OUR ENEMIES.

O LORD Jesus, in union with that love and that sweetness with which, amidst the anguish and sorrows of Thy passion, Thou didst pray for those who crucified Thee, saying: Father forgive them, I beseech Thee with all my heart that Thou wouldst now vouchsafe to forgive all who have ever in any way offended against me, for Thy mercy's sake. Amen.

FOR THE CHURCH.

LORD Jesus Christ who saidst unto Thine Apostles, Peace I leave with you: My Peace I give unto you; regard not my sins, but the faith of Thy Church, and grant to Her that peace and upity which is agreeable to Thy will, Who livest and reignest for ever and ever. Amen.

FOR THE PRIEST WHO IS PERFORMING THE SERVICE.

HOLY Jesus, Who hast purchased to Thyself an universal Church, and hast promised to be with the ministers of Apostolic Succession to the end of the world, be graciously pleased to bless the ministry and service of him who is now appointed to offer the sacrifice of prayer and praise to Thee in this house, which is called by Thy Name. May the words of his mouth and the meditation of his heart be always acceptable in Thy sight, O Lord, my Strength and my Redeemer. Amen.

FOR THE CONGREGATION THEN PRESENT.

GOD the Holy Ghost, Sanctifier of the faithful, visit, we pray Thee, this Congregation with Thy love and favour; enlighten their minds more and more with the light of the everlasting Gospel, graft into their hearts the love of the truth, increase in them true religion, nourish them with all goodness; and of Thy great mercy keep them in the same, O Blessed Spirit, Whom, with the Father and the Son together, we worship and glorify, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

SUGGESTIONS.

For a devout and orderly reception of the Holy Communion.

1. If thou hast never communicated before, "Signify thy name to the Curate," that he may advise thee as to thy fitness and frequency of Communion. 1 Cor., iv., 1, 2.

2. Rise early. Psalm lvii, 8.

3. If possible, communicate fasting. Psalm xxiii.

4. For the carrying out of these two suggestions an early celebration is the most convenient. St. John xx, i.

5. Be in Church before the service commences, and occupy all waiting time in devotion. 1 Thess., v, 17.

6. After the consecration, never sit, (unless thou art infirm), but kneel or at least stand, as being in the most special Presence, vouchsafed on earth, of the King of Heaven. As a holy Bishop of our Church has said, "Let both body and heart kneel, not to the Holy Elements, but to Thy Maker." Psalm xcv., 6.

7. As thou goest and returnest from the Altar, see no man, think of no man, but in the Spirit behold thy Lord, Present with thee in His Church. St. John xx, 29.

8. At the time of Reception use the ejaculations on page 22.

During the Act of Reception it seems reverent, (1 Cor. xiv, 40.)

I. To take up no book;

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II. To wear no gloves;

III. To receive the Sacrament of the Body of Christ into the right hand, laid open and flat upon the left, at the words, "The Body of our Lord, &c. As St. Cyril directs, "Make the left hand as if a throne for thy right, which is about to receive the King."

IV. To say softly "Amen," (as St. Cyril also directs), after the words, "Preserve Thy body and soul unto everlasting Life." V. To receive the Cup firmly with both hands at the words, "The Blood your Lord, &c."

VI. To rise as soon as the person next after thee has received the cup, (where there are many communicants --if few, let all retire together); and to return quietly to thy place.

10. Exercise the highest consideration in thought and manner towards thy brethren in Christ, who communicate with thee; whatever be their station in life, or their religious habits or opinions. 1 Cor. x, 17.

11. Remain kneeling in prayer until the Clergy have left the Altar. St. Luke i, 21.

12. It is unseemly to hasten out of Church directly after the conclusion of the Service, as the time immediately succeeding the C ommunion is especially blessed for private devotion. St. John, vi, 12.

13. On rising from thy knees for the last time, look reverently towards the Altar, and say, "Thanks be unto God for His unspeakable gift. Heb. xiii, 10.

14. On going out from the Church, make the following resolution: "I will go forth in the strength of the Lord God." Eph. vi, 10.

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ESU, at whose supreme command, We now approach to God, Before us in Thy vesture stand Thy vesture dipped in Blood, Obedient to Thy gracious word, We break the hallowed Bread; Commemorate Thee, our dying Lord, And trust on Thee, to feed. The Cup of Blessing, blessed by Thee, Let it Thy Blood impart; The Bread Thy mystic Body be, And cheer each languid heart. The grace which sure salvation brings Let us herewith receive; Satiate the hungry with good Things, The hidden Manna give. The Living Bread sent down from Heaven, In us vouchsafe to be, Thy Flesh for all the world is given, And all may live by Thee.
