Advice as to Russell-square and Debate on Market Improvement

Now on the Taps—Allen Manufacturing Co. Will Stay—Public Meeting About Queen-street West Pavement—Board of Control to-day With Mayor and Aid.

There is every promise that renewed executive activity will dawn upon the City Hall to-day. For the past week, all business has been occasioned by the illness of Mayor Shaw and Controller Hubbard.
