Money Collected by the City as Costs Goes into the Pockets of the High-Salaried Officials.

ALDERMEN GET THEIR EYES OPEN.

Did the Warren-Scharf Co. Pay Their Men Less Than 15 Cents Per Hour?

Ald. Wain's letter, charging the Warren-Scharf Company with paying workmen wages at the rate of 15 cents an hour, in defiance of the 18-cent-an-hour clause in all city contracts, was yesterday sent on to the Board of Control from the Works Committee. When the letter had been read, Ald. Spence said: "I think this is an outrage. I have heard more about it. These people get their contract upon condition of paying 15 cents an hour. They were given the money by the city to pay the men at that rate. I move that the City Engineer be instructed to issue pay sheets at the rate of 18 cents an hour. The Warren-Scharf Company examined the bylaw and was put into force, and if they have not paid the rate of wages, that they be made to pay the difference."

A Question of Power.

Ald. Sheppard (in the chair): Have we that power? Ald. Spence: Let them refuse us, and then we will know how to deal with them. Ald. Bowman: I have seen the Engineer, and he informed me that the Warren-Scharf people had informed him that they had made a mistake.
