SPAIN'S BUDGET.

The Finance Minister Expects a Surplus and Tells How He Proposes to Achieve It.

Madrid, May 25.—Senor J. Navarro Rivero, Minister of Finance, in the Budget statement to the Cortes, estimates the revenue at 888,378,771 pesetas (\$170,473,862), and the expenditures at 874,866,877 pesetas (\$168,662,114). In order to provide revenue to meet the extraordinary budget the Minister of Finance proposes to raise a loan with the assistance of the public market in order to meet the increased expenditures, and the 20,000,000 required to meet the interest, and for the redemption of late loans guaranteed by the Customs, a temporary surplus of 10 per cent. on all taxes except salt has been proposed. By this means it is expected twenty millions will be obtained. The colonial department will contribute 23,000,000, and the balance of the loan will be raised by a loan on the exclusive privilege of leasing in this product during the next 20 years. Should the colonial department be unable to obtain the increased expenditures, it is calculated that a portion of the same will be obtained by a proposed monopoly on explosives.
