WEDNESDAY, JUNE 30th, 1880.

PURSUANT to notice in the *Royal Gazette*, in accordance with the 13th Article of the Constitution, the Diocesan Synod of Fredericton met on this day, in the School Room of Trinity Church, in the City of Saint John, at 9.30 o'clock, A. M.

I. The special branch of work they have sought to promote during the past year, has been the formation of a Sunday School Association in every Deanery of the Diocese. For this purpose your Committee have brought the subject before all the Deaneries, and have received, without exception, replies favourable to such Associations. In the case of the Deanery of Woodstock, we understand that steps have already been taken towards forming a Sunday School Teachers Association, and that it will soon be in full operation. From the fact that meetings in the various Deaneries are only held quarterly, it has occupied nearly the whole year to obtain the above replies; and as it was impossible to proceed any further towards the improvement of Sunday Schools until a means of communication existed, nothing more has been done in that direction.

Now however that Sunday School Associations have been favourably considered throughout the Diocese, we trust that many will soon be formed, and the development and growth of Sunday Schools speedily go on.

II. Your Committee have corresponded with the Church of England Sunday School Institute (England), as to the terms of affiliation with that valuable organization. In reply, they received a reply expressing the pleasure which the Church of England Sunday School Institute would have, to be affiliated with Sunday School Teachers Associations in the Diocese, or any part of it, and a copy of the form to be filled up when this should be desired to be done. Your Committee also received a copy of all the cheap publications of that Society.

III. Your Committee recommend that a Sunday School Committee be again appointed to promote this most important branch of Church Work; so that all possible assistance may be rendered for the due organization of Sunday Schools in every Parish and Mission, and for the full equipment of the same to carry on the work.

### REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE

#### ON DIOCESAN CHURCH TEMPERANCE SOCIETY.

We, the undersigned, members of the Committee appointed by the Synod at its last session for the purpose of preparing a scheme for the organization of a Diocesan Church of England Temperance Society, respectfully submit the following as the proposed Constitution and Rules of such Society:—

I. This Society shall be called "The Diocesan Church of England Temperance Society."

II. The object shall be to induce the members of the Church of England in the Diocese of Fredericton to co-operate for the promotion of habits of Temperance; the reformation of the Intemperate, and the removal of the causes which lead to Intemperance. It shall also aim to establish Church of England Temperance Societies in Parishes and Missions where they do not now exist,—the consent of the Rector or Missionary being first obtained,—to stimulate to increased activity the Societies already established, and to cherish and promote a spirit of friendship and co-operation between the various local Societies.

#### BASIS.

III. The basis of the Society is union and co-operation, in promotion of its objects, on perfectly equal terms between those who use and those who abstain from intoxicating drinks.

IV. The Pledges of the Society shall be as follows:—

*Non-abstaining Pledge*:—"I recognize my duty as a Christian to exert myself for the suppression of Intemperance, and having become a member of this Society, will do my utmost, both by example and effort, to accomplish its objects."

V. Those members who desire to become Abstaining Members shall also sign the following Pledge:

"I hereby agree to abstain from the use of all intoxicating liquors, except for religious purposes, or under medical advice."

VI. Members shall consist of all members of the Church of England who sign either of these Pledges, and subscribe one dollar annually to the Society.

VII. The Lord Bishop of Fredericton shall be Patron of the Society.

VIII. The Officers of the Society shall be a President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary.

IX. The Church of England shall be represented by more than twelve members of the Society, and a

IX. The Council shall consist of these Officers, the Presidents of the Church of England Temperance Societies in the Diocese, and not more than twelve other members, to be elected at the first meeting of the Society, and afterwards at the annual meeting.

X. The Council shall have the management of the fund, publications and general business, and shall be authorized to frame such By-Laws as they may deem necessary for the working of the Society.

XI. The Council shall meet quarterly for the transaction of business, and at such other times as they may deem necessary.

XII. The annual meeting of members shall be held at such time and place as the Council may determine.

XIII. At the annual meeting, Reports from the Church of England Societies connected with the Diocesan Society shall be read, and all matters affecting the interests of the Association, or the promotion of the cause of Temperance in the Diocese of Fredericton may be discussed.

XIV. No alteration or addition shall be made in the Constitution or Rules of the Society except at an annual meeting, notice having been given at the preceding annual meeting, and then only by a vote of two thirds of the members present.
