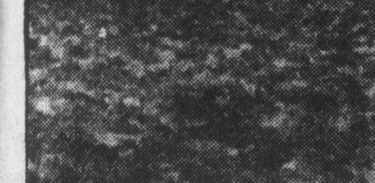
MAROONED ON LONE ISLAND

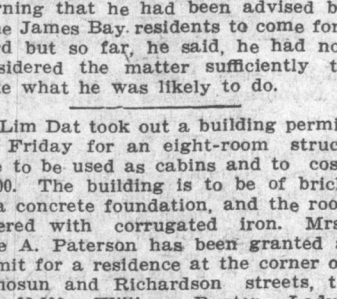
