> London, June 13.-In a swift and deadly raid on the city of London today German airplanes took a heavy toll in killed and wounded. Other places were attacked but, so far as is known, by far the heaviest losses occurred in London town itself.

> At a late hour tonight the casualties, as officially announced, numbered 534, including 97 killed and 437 wound-Fifty-five men met death, and 223 men were wound-Sixteen women and twenty-six children were killed, and 122 women and 94 children wounded.





About two thousand holders of mining claims have been relieved for work in mines through this summer. One thousand men have been made available in Porcupine camp alone, but it is claimed five hundred additional workers can be employed in the big production plants there. With increased labor supply greatly increased production is assured.

The monied interests would have made more money under neutrality than under a vastly increased taxation.

Even the west was feeling the thrill of the national call, and the first three states to fill up their army quota were Utah, Nevada and Oregon.
