Charges against a Portland Policeman.
Mr. R. Huey sent a communication last night to the Portland Town Council referring certain charges against one of the oldest policemen on the force. It seems that Mrs. Brophy was a tenant of Huey's, and he was anxious to get her out, as he did not consider her character good. One month when the rent was due, he had a distraint warrant issued, but she got the money and paid the bill. When the next month came round there was another warrant issued, and Constable Wasson, and Mr. Huey went to seize the furniture belonging to the woman. The distraint warrant was an excuse to turn the woman out of doors, and the pair, armed with the power of the law, seized a stove, table, couch, lamp, everything in the room, and even a shawl which covered herself and her child, to satisfy a debt of \$2.60, with the costs, which she had foot up \$17.00 more. Policeman Pidgeon heard of the affair going on, and made a collection among a few round the Station, and got money and a palatable bill. For this, which was an act of humanity on his part, he is to be put on trial before the Police Committee, and the affair creates considerable excitement in Portland.

The Times Washington dispatch says no facts have yet been brought to light showing an improper relation between Pomroy and Mrs. Conway, and the latter's husband is destined to spend some time either in prison or at the mad house, but did not make any charges of unfaithfulness against his wife.

LONDON, Oct. 13 - p. m.
The amount of bullion withdrawn from the Bank of England on balance to-day was £205,000, all for shipment to America. £82,000 were shipped for New York on Saturday.

Lord Trenton succeeds Sir Edmund Hammond in the office of Under-Secretary of State for the Foreign Department.

MADRID, Oct. 13.
The insurgent fleet has been defeated by the National squadron. The latter placed on Saturday afternoon, near Cartagena, and lasted about two hours. The insurgent vessels were considerably injured, and were compelled to return to Cartagena harbor. The Government squadron consisted of the Almansa, Victoria, Carmen, and two smaller vessels. Admiral Labos was a command. The insurgent fleet numbered four vessels. It is rumored the Tetina was captured, but the Government has received no such intelligence, and it is thought untrue. There is great rejoicing here over the victory.

MADRID, Oct. 13.
A DOUBTFUL RUMOR.
There is a doubtful rumor in circulation that a conspiracy has been discovered to assassinate Senor Castelar. Castelar yesterday paid official visits to Gen. Sierles, the American, and Layard, the British Minister.

WARRICKS REMOVED TO FRANCE.
A large number of Carlists, who were defeated at La Jangueras, have taken refuge in France. They first made a large funeral pyre and burned all the bodies of their dead.

DON ALPHONSO.
The Alphonista Club has issued a manifesto declaring that the time had come to prepare for the accession of Don Alphonso to the throne of Spain.
