New York, June 9. The Commonwealth of Massachusetts honored the memory of Charles Sumner by appropriate exercises in Middlebury, Boston, including an oration by William Curtis, of New York.

The Times correspondent at Paris graphs that it is expected in Dupuis, in a few days, will ask the committee on constitutional law to vote on the first article of the new introduction in May, 1871, providing that the government consist of a senate chamber of representatives and a President of the Republic.

SPANISH AFFAIRS. Stormy weather in Spain delays the battle between Carlists and Republicans. The Times, in an editorial commenting on the communication recently sent to various powers by the Spanish government, says: "It is a pity that the time approaches when the Spanish Government must be re-established in peace in Spain and Cuba, and when the present exceptional condition of affairs is terminated the complete establishment of representative institutions will become the guarantee of moral order."
