PROCEEDINGS OF FIRST DAY.

The preliminary inquiries having been instituted, the opening Prayer was read by the Rev. Stephen Lett, L.L. D., Grand Chaplain of B. N. A. after which the Right Worshipful the Grand Master, opened the Grand Lodge, in the Royal Scarlet Degree.

Resolved—That the Report of the Provincial Grand Treasurer be referred to the Committee on Finance.

The following Notices were then given :-

By Brother Francis Evans Cornish—That he will to-morrow ask for all Correspondence forwarded, and for all Resolutions passed, by Private, District, and County Lodges, which have been forwarded to the Officers of this Grand Lodge, relating to the establishment or continuance of Provincial Grand Lodges.

By the same—That he will move a Resolution, that in the opinion of this Provincial Grand Lodge, the establishing of Provincial Grand Lodges was unnecessary, and does not tend to advance the interests of the Loyal Orange Institution of British America, and that the Supreme Grand Lodge be requested to discontinue Provincial Grand Lodges.

By Brother Ogle R. Gowan-That he will, on to-morrow. move, that at a Special Meeting of this Grand Lodge, held in the City of Hamilton on the 24th of October last, called to take into consideration the proscriptive policy pursued by His Grace the Duke of Newcastle, towards the Orangemen of Kingston and Belleville and Toronto, during the recent visit of H. R. H. the Prince of Wales to this country; this Grand Lodge adopted a series of Resolutions, the first sixteen of which appear to have met with the unanimous concurrence and approbation of the whole Orange Body, and of the Protestant people of British North America generally—that the said sixteen Resolutions be now re-adopted by this Grand Lodge, as fully endorsed and approved of, after the most mature reflection. But this Grand Lodge feels bound to state, that the seventeenth Resolution, adopted at the said meeting at Hamilton, has not only failed to meet the approval of Orangemen generally, but has been condemned by many Lodges, Districts and Counties, as leading to strife and division in the Order, and as directly contrary to that discretion and free judgment which every Orangeman should exercise upon political questionsthat the said seventeenth Resolution be therefore rescinded, and it is hereby rescinded and repealed.

By the same—That this Grand Lodge, in justice to the feelings of the Orangemen of Western Canada, feels bound to re-iterate the protest, so frequently made from all parts of the Province against the division of Upper Canada into Local Grand Lodges; and this meeting hereby instructs its Grand Officers, to inform the

By the same—That this Grand Lodge has heard with satisfaction that the Most Worshipful the Grand Master has presented to Her Majesty the Queen the Address and Remonstrance of the Orange Body against the treatment which they received during the visit of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales to this country; which Her Majesty has been pleased most graciously to receive; and that this Grand Lodge embraces this, the earliest opportunity, of expressing its thanks to the Most Worshipful, for the great trouble and expense he has incurred, in undertaking the present journey to the Metropolis of the Empire.

By Brother Thomas Bradley—That he will on to-morrow move, that the sum of forty dollars be paid out of the funds of this Grand Lodge, towards the fund now being raised for the erection of the Orange Wing of the Protestant Orphan's Home, at Toronto.

Upon motion of the Rev. Dr. Lett, seconded by Bro. Bradley, the Grand Lodge was adjourned till the evening at 7 o'clock.

EVENING SESSION.

The Grand Lodge met at 7 o'clock, pursuant to adjournment; the Right Worshipful the Grand Master in the Chair.

At the suggestion of the Reverend the Grand Chaplain, the Grand Lodge agreed unanimously to take up the consideration of the several Resolutions, of which Notices had been given by the Past Grand Master, Brother Gowan, in the early part of the Session.

Brother Ogle R. Gowan then rose, and in a very able and eloquent speech, moved that it be

Resolved—That at a special meeting of this Grand Lodge, held in the city of Hamilton on the 24th of October last, called to take into consideration the proscriptive policy pursued by His

Grace the Duke of Newcastle towards the Orangemen of Kingston. Belleville and Toronto, during the recent visit of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales to this country, this Grand Lodge adopted a series of Resolutions, the first sixteen of which appear to have met with the unanimous concurrence and approbation of the whole Orange Body, and of the Protestant people of British North America generally—that the said sixteen Resolutions be now, and they are hereby re-adopted by this Grand Lodge, as fully endorsed and approved of, after the most mature reflection. But this Grand Lodge feels bound to state, that the seventeenth Resolution, as adopted at the said meeting at Hamilton, has not only failed to meet the approval of Orangemen generally, but has been condemned by many Lodges, Districts and Counties, as leading to strife and division in the Order, and as directly contrary to that discretion and free judgment, which every Orangeman should exercise upon political questions-that the said seventeenth resolution be therefore rescinded, and is hereby rescinded and repealed.

Upon this resolution, a highly interesting and very able debate ensued. The affirmative was supported by brothers George L. Allen, (who seconded the motion,) Dr. Lett, and Brothers Buckley, Hill, Button, Hewat, Kennedy, Carr, Dewhurst, Evans, Ferguson, Booth, Bradley, Sloan, Shepherd, Thompson, Dewson, and McMillan. The negative was argued with considerable ability by brothers Boulton, Sullivan, Davis, Morgan, McKee, Forrest, McCarthy, and McManus. Brother Gowan closed the debate; and a division being called for, there were 82 for the motion and 17 against it.

Brother Ogle R. Gowan then moved the second resolution of which he had given notice, as follows:

Resolved—That this Grand Lodge, in justice to the feelings of the Orangemen of Western Canada, feels bound to reiterate the protest so frequently made from all parts of the Province, against the division of Upper Canada into Local Grand Lodges—and this meeting hereby instructs its Grand Officers, to inform the Grand Lodge of British North America to be held in the City of Kingston in June next, that the Society desires to be restored to its former status and working order, as provided by the Constitution, prior to the adjourned meeting held at Cobourg in August, 1859.

Seconded by brother W. W. Connor, Co. Master of Huron, and passed—with only five dissentients.

On motion of Brother Thomas Bradley, seconded by Brother Samuel Howden, the Grand Lodge was then adjourned, to meet again at 9 o'clock to-morrow morning.

SECOND DAY.

WEDNESDAY, 20th February, 1861.

The Grand Lodge met at 9 o'clock this morning, pursuant to adjournment. The R. W. the Grand Master in the Chair.

The minutes of yesterday were read by the Grand Secretary, and on motion of Brother. E. R. Sullivan, seconded by Brother F. C. Stewart, they were approved of and adopted.

Brother Ogle R. Gowan, Chairman, of the Committee on Correspondence and Expulsions, presented the following Report:—

The Committee on Correspondence and Expulsions beg leave to Report, that they have examined the documents submitted to their consideration, and after careful examination beg leave to Report as follows:—

No. 1—Russell Brown, Robert Higison, and William Bradford, of Lodge 826, Sylvan, Co. of Middlesex, expelled for non attendance and non payment of dues.

No. 2—Henry Griffith of Lodge 197, Brantford, expelled for violation of obligation.

No. 3—F. E. McBain, late of Lodge 157, Brampton, Co. of Peel, expelled for immoral conduct, and expulsion confirmed by the Grand-Lodge, on the 17th of June, 1858. The Committee recommend, that Lodge 157 have liberty to re-consider this case, and in its discretion, to re-admit McBain to membership.

No. 4—John Richards, of Lodge 543, Melbourne, Co. Middlesex, expelled for non attendance and non payment of dues.

No. 5—Archibald McClelland, of same Lodge, expelled for marrying a Papist.

No. 6—Robert Middleton, Thomas Draper, and William Middleton, of Lodge 592, District of St. Mary's, County of Perth, expelled for violation of obligation.

No. 7—James Shaw, of Lodge 335, Mitchell, Co. of Perth, expelled for violation of Royal Arch obligation.

No. 8—Irvine Buchanan, of Lodge 720, St. Catharines, Co. of Lincoln, suspended for six months, for disorderly conduct.

No. 9—Edward Ashbury, Butler Pickard, Robert Wait, Isaac Pickard, Hiram Campbell, and James Boles, all of Lodge 720, St. Catharines, Co. of Lincoln, expelled for contempt of summons and violation of obligation.

No. 10—Edward Woods, of Lodge 77, Centreville, same County, expelled for contempt of summons.

No. 11—John M. Currie, E. A. Wright, and John Veitch, of Lodge 117, St. Catharines, same County, expelled for contempt of summons.

No. 12—Richard Eniss, of Lodge 840, Elora, County of North Wellington, expelled for violation of obligation.

No. 13—John Rennie, of Lodge 651, Collingwood, County of North Simcoe, expelled for felony.

No. 14—John Saltry, of Lodge 704, Cremore, same County, expelled for murder.

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No. 15—Robert Taylor, of Lodge 794, same place and County, expelled for thirty years, for embezzlement.

No. 16—Thomas Taylor, of same Lodge, place and County, expelled for ten years, for non payment of dues and contempt of summons.

No. 17—William Stlricth, of Lodge 817, County of Middlesex expelled for violation of obligation and non payment of dues.

No. 18—The Committee, upon examining the annual return from Lodge 892, County of Waterloo, find that the Master of the Lodge is reported as expelled, for retaining Lodge property; but as his name is not given, (as it should have been in the return,) they are unable to take any action, or to express any opinion upon the subject.

No. 19—John Wilson, Joseph Myton, Alexander Lawson, and Enos Jameson, of Lodge 632, Durham, County of Grey, expelled for non attendance upon summons, and for non payment of dues.

No. 20—James Sharp, of Lodge 689, same place and County, expelled for non payment of dues, and non attendance upon summons.

No. 21—Thomas Snell, of Lodge 101, Sullivan District, same County, expelled for embezzlement, and for refusing to attend upon summons.

No. 22—Robert Noland, of Lodge 851, District of Farmington, County of North Wellington, expelled for attempting to commit a rape.

No. 23—The committee decline to recommend the application of the Ingersoll Lodges, to be set off from the South, and to be attached to the North, Riding of the County of Oxford; as they conceive it would not only be contrary to the established working and spirit of the Order, and would greatly derange its internal economy; but would also lead to a vicious precedent.

No. 24—The Committee approve of the recommendation given by the County Master of Peel, in his decision upon the proposed division of the Albion District, in that County. The Committee are further of opinion that no Township should be divided into two or more Districts, without strong reasons being clearly established for such division; nor without the previous approval of the County Master.

No. 25—William Meek, of Lodge 427, District of Orangeville, Co. of Wellington, expelled for three years from the 24th December 1860, for non payment of dues, and for disobedience.

No. 26—Samuel Balis, Charles Gryles, Alexander McGilvray, John Boyd, and John Clark, all of Lodge 590, Nobleton, Co. of York, expelled for non attendance, and for non payment of dues.

No. 27—Thomas Todd, of Lodge 432, Wardsville, Co. of Middlesex, expelled for non attendance.

No. 28-David Allen, of the same Lodge and County, suspended.

No. 29—David Gibson, of Lodge 307, District of Elgin, and County of Elgin, expelled for contempt of summons, and for non payment of dues.

No. 30—George Shirley, and Isaac Silverthorn, of Lodge 307, suspended for one year, for contempt of summons, and for non payment of dues.

No. 31—Leonard Marsh, of Lodge 307, suspended for two years, for a similar offence.

No. 32—Robert Pudney, of Lodge 188, District of London, Co. of Middlesex, expelled for life, for non payment of dues, and for contempt of summons.

No. 33—James Thompson, John H. Moore, John Roberts, and Thomas Doherty, of same Lodge, District and County, suspended for one year, for non attendance, and non payment of dues.

No. 34—William McLeed, Robert Morton, Charles Pyper, Andrew Carson, William McCord, John Murphy, B. Sleid, Isaac White, George Faris, Anthony White, Peter Jackson, Ralph Pyott, and F. W. Peters, all of Lodge 412, same District and County, suspended until they respectively discharge the dues now owing by them to the Lodge.

No. 35—W. J. Branton, and John Jennings, of Lodge 791, same District and County, suspended for five years, for non payment of dues, and for contempt of summons.

No. 36—Lodge No. 902, in the same District and County, reports to the County Lodge, that one member has been expelled

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by the Lodge during the year; but neither his name, the offence committed, nor the precise punishment awarded, is given. Nor is any reference made to an appeal.

No. 37-The Committee recommend that the Report from the County Lodge of South Simcoe, with the accompanying documents, connected with the case of John McArthur, of Lodge 850, be referred back for informality. The Report is indefinite as to the charge, and the appeal does not appear with the other papers in the case

No. 38-In the papers forwarded from the same County, having reference to the respective cases of William Greenfield, Richard Lenox, Alexander McLean, and Thompson Boyd, no number of Lodge is given; and the Committee recommend that the papers be returned, so that the omission may be supplied.

No. 39-In the case of the charges preferred by Brother E. R. Sullivan, against Brother Henry Lemon, County Master of Brant, it appears that the witnesses are not in attendance at this Grand Lodge, and the Committee cannot, therefore, enter upon the investigation.

Your Committee further Report that Brothers Dr. Lett, Grand Chaplain, and C. F. Hill, Grand Lecturer, are, by Rule No. 23, page 27 of the new Constitution, entitled to sit and vote in this Provincial Grand Lodge, except on the election of officers, distribution of funds and drafting of By-Laws.

Your Committee further find that some Brethren claim to vote at this Provincial Grand Lodge as County Proxies, under the Rule No. 4, page 29, which clearly requires County Lodges to elect a proxy, but does not define his duties. We think that under Rule No. 12, page 23, none who are not there mentioned are entitled to vote, and, as proxies are not mentioned, your Committee would recommend that County Proxies be not allowed to yote here.

Your Committee further report that Brother Enoch Lyle claims to vote as Proxy for No. 758, but the same appears to have emanated from the Master personally, and not from the Lodge, as your Committee think it should have done; they therefore recommend that his vote be disallowed.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

EVANS CORNISH, The right of Brother John Wilson, to sit on this Committee, or to vote in the Grand Lodge, was here raised by Brother John Carr, District Master of Toronto, who called for the production of Brother Wilson's Proxy. The Proxy having been produced, and Brother Wilson having admitted, that he was not appointed Proxy in open Lodge 396, but had himself (at the request of the Master,) written and signed the Proxy, the Grand Master ruled, that Brother Wilson had no right to vote in the Grand Lodge. At this stage of the business, Brother Buckley, Right Worshipful Grand Master, rose and addressed the Grand Lodge in a very feeling and loyal speech; expressive of his thanks and gratitude for the high honor that had been conferred upon him by the Brethren, in elevating him to the post of Grand Master. He stated that he could not comply with the wishes kindly expressed to him by many, to again become a Candidate, as it was his intention to visit Europe during the course of the coming summer, and that he would therefore, be necessarily absent from the Province, for a considerable time. He heartily thanked the Brethren for the marked kindness he had experienced at their hands, and concluded by recommending Thomas R. Ferguson, Esq., M. P. P., as a Brother in every way suitable to be his successor in office.

After the Grand Master had closed his address, it was moved by Brother Ogle R. Gowan, Past G. Master, seconded by Brother J. H. Bessey, Grand Treasurer, and unanimously
