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late congress into making an appropriation

THE BRIDGE.
A great deal of wisdom is being wasted
in the St. John papers over the danger
which threatens the Fredericton bridge
and how it may be avoided. The way-
faring man, though a fool, is able in a
minute and a half, or at the outside two
minutes, to devise a plan which will make
the bridge absolutely secure against the
ice, and he at once gives the public the
benefit of his conclusions, so that if any-
thing should happen he will have the
satisfaction of being able to say "I told
you so."

The first question which arises in this
connection is whether the bridge is in
point of fact in danger of being carried
away. It is scarcely necessary to say to
a resident of this part of the province
that such a danger threatens the struc-
ture every year. So great is the strength
of the ice above, such is the volume of
water and so many and diverse are the
conditions to be guarded against, that it
is doubtful if engineering skill could
construct a bridge on piers across the
river here, which would be absolutely
safe from the ice, without making it
strong enough to resist the whole force
of the river, in which event the water
would be turned up into the city and
St. Mary's. The general proposition may
be laid down that any bridge, except a
suspension bridge, across the river here,
so built as to permit the ice to pass in
danger under such circumstances of
being either in the whole or in part car-
ried away.

But some say the present structure is
unnecessarily secure because the ice
breakers are not high enough. This is a
matter of opinion. Last spring they
were of no real service, but the spring
before they did exactly the work for
which they were constructed, that is,
they broke up the ice before it reached
the bridge. Last season was exceptional, and though
it may be said that it is against expec-
tation cases that precautions ought to be
taken, the experience of 1887 proved
that against an ice run of unprecedented
force the bridge was secure. In plan-
ning the ice breakers regard was had to
the usual height of water at the time
the ice runs, and they were not intended
to break up ice any more than to break
it. It is asked why not make them higher.
The answer is that to make them higher
would be to weaken them, as their area
is not sufficient to permit them to be
made higher. If eight or ten feet of ice
work were built upon those piers it would
probably be carried away and might do
more mischief to the bridge than the ice
itself. Besides it is not admitted by
those best qualified to judge that the
piers are too low. Everything appears
to indicate that the bridge will have a
very severe test this spring; but of course
this is not at all certain. It is better
shape for such a strain than it was last
year, the footing chills, which added
nothing to the strength, but were an
element of danger, having been removed.
It is now stands the bridge is prepared
as well as experience points out to be
necessary to resist any strain which will

NEW CUSTOMS REGULATIONS.

**Passengers Entering Canada to Make
Duty as to the Dutiable Articles in
their Luggage.**
OTTAWA, April 8.—The customs depart-
ment have provided a new regulation re-
specting travellers entering Canada by
railway or by steamer. Forms are ap-
plied to conductors of trains and masters
and purser of vessels. These the pas-
sengers will fill up, specifying what duti-
able articles they have in their luggage
and making oath thereto. This will obvi-
ate the loss and unpleasant search here-
tofore in operation, unless the passenger
prefers the old plan, when, of course, his
baggage will be searched. The senior
member of a family may, if sufficiently
acquainted with the contents of the bag-
gage of the whole party, be allowed to
include all such baggage in one entry.
Goods subject to duty not exceeding in
value \$500, may be passed under the
new arrangement. Jewelry that has
been worn for at least six months as
personal ornaments may be admitted
free of duty. Only one watch for each
passenger can be admitted free of
duty. Wearing apparel in actual use
may be used by the passengers and
not excessive in quantity or in value.
If in the case of travellers
arriving in Canada with the intention
of staying in the country for a limited
time, the rules are to be interpreted
in the most liberal sense. These
regulations are rendered necessary, be-
cause retail dealers complain that goods
in excess of requirements, and some-
times sold after arrival, have been ad-
mitted free of duty under the old
system.

Reports from the northwest to the

THE CENTRAL RAILWAY.

The Washington and other bridges
which are in the erection, and securing
completion.

The firm of Kilham & Weston, who have
the contract for building five miles of this
road, have 20 men and 20 horses employed on
the work of construction. Besides this con-
tract they are building a number of bridges.
Among the number is one at Norton. This
bridge has two spans 104 feet each in
length. The sub-structure which is of the
Howe-truss pattern is now completed. The
bridge at Washademoak Lake will be fin-
ished in about three weeks. This bridge has
one span 60 feet; one span 100 feet, and
a short 140 feet white pine span. It is
spanning a river and will be a fine
structure. The total length of this bridge is
1,600 feet and the approaches are made of
giving bents. The total length of the
road is 50 miles, it is well under way.
The total length is 500 feet; the remain-
der of the distance, 500 feet, is in the form
of a bridge, being composed of piling bents.
The superstructure of this bridge is also of

the Howe-truss pattern, built of Southern
pine. The St. John and Salt Works
are making these piling bents and the rails
for the bridge, but all the other material is
being made on the spot. That line com-
mences west of Norton station on the E. C.
R. crosses Norton river, thence across Belle
Lake Creek, running past Ward's Corner,
thence on to the salt works. Thence the line
crosses the salt works, and strikes
Washademoak Lake at Armstrong's Point.
Then taking a northern course to the head of
Dunbarland Bay, which it crosses at Beau-
coup's mills and ship yard; thence to Coal
Creek and on to Salmon river, where it will
be close to the coast towards G. King, a
total distance of 90 miles. Connection, it is
expected, will be had from this point to
Fredericton with the Northern and Western
road—Globe.
