"there was the usual back stabbing, character assassination and dirty tricks, but they were all aboveboard and out in the open."

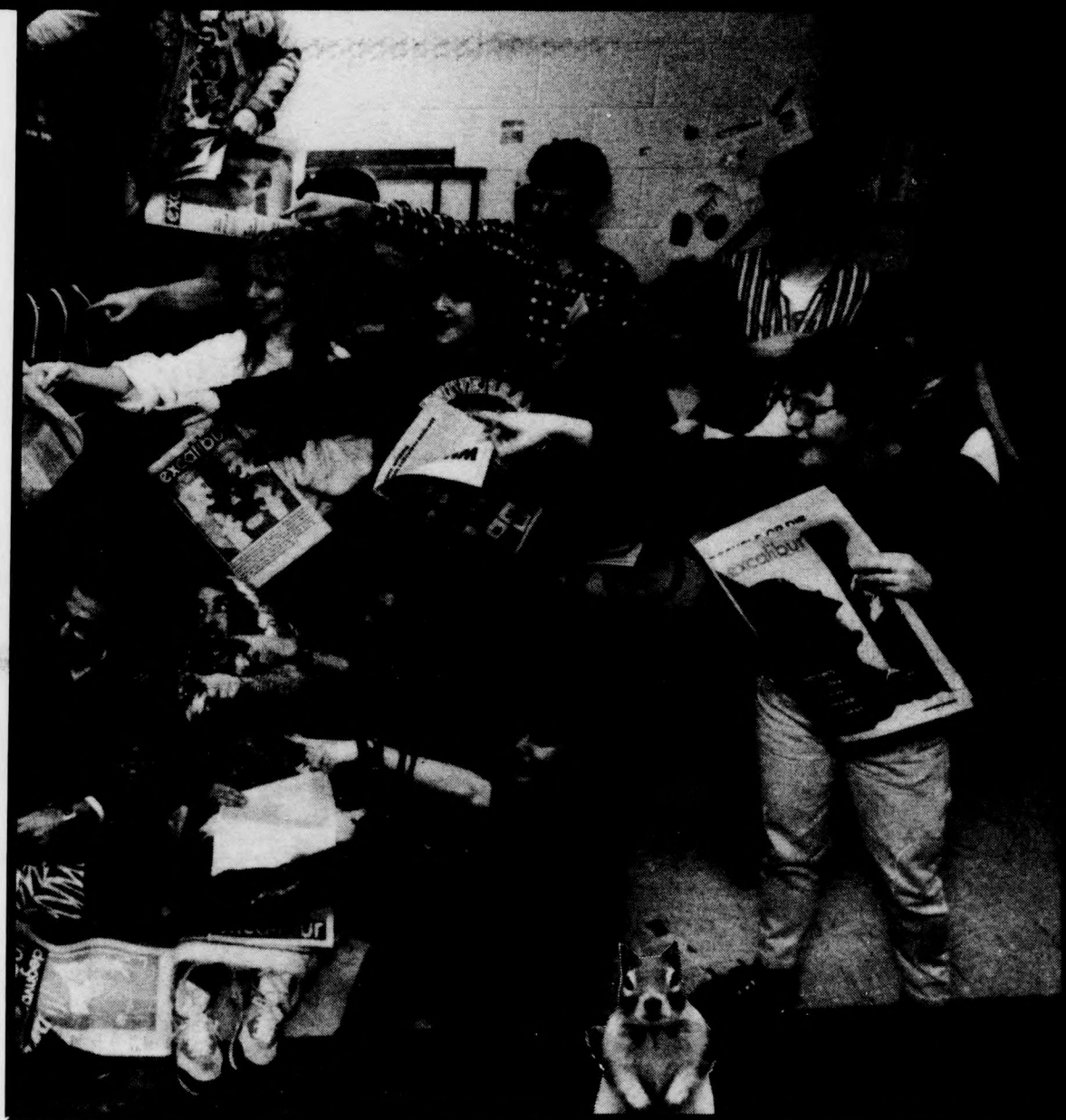

those 750 Bethune votes on the second last day really put the chipmunk over the top. Anyway, it was a damn close race."

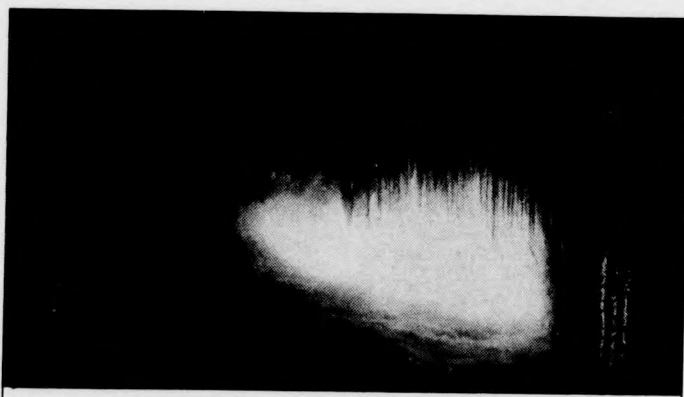
But, most staffers were crushed. Production manager Steve Perry(zosa) summed it up best when he said, "I need a summer vacation."

The *Excalibur* newspaper box located beside the newspaper's 111 Central Square office door has been vandalized again.

At about 10:30 pm Sunday, an *Excalibur* staff member discovered a 36 by 31 by 10 centimetre block of ice cubes on top of the newspapers in the box.

Another staff member estimated that the ice had been there for approximately 15 minutes, since only the top few newspapers were wet.

A security spokesperson said there were no reports of

similar mischievous incidents Sunday night.

A third *Excalibur* staff member checked Central Square and Ross Building hallways in vain for a trail of water or clues leading to the origin of the ice block.

There were no damage costs, just a moist floor and a few newspapers drenched beyond repair.

On November 12, 1989, the same *Excalibur* box was set on fire at about 6 am. Someone also used ashes from the blaze to draw a happy face — that issue's cover graphic — on the wall across from the office. Repair costs were \$500.

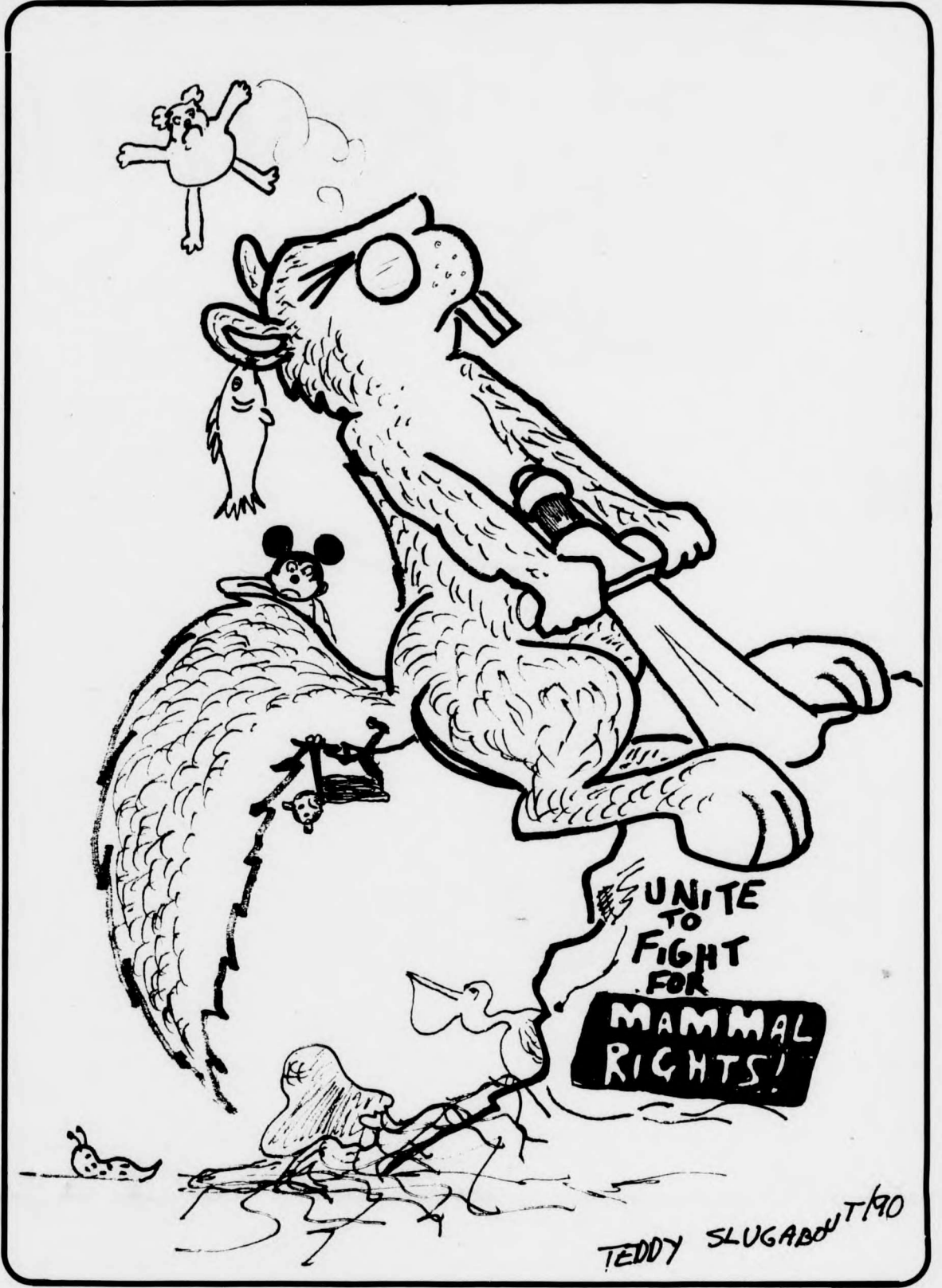

Gomushi, the proud owner of a head of long light-brown, dark-brown hair defended his position against Donuts proudly. "Unite to



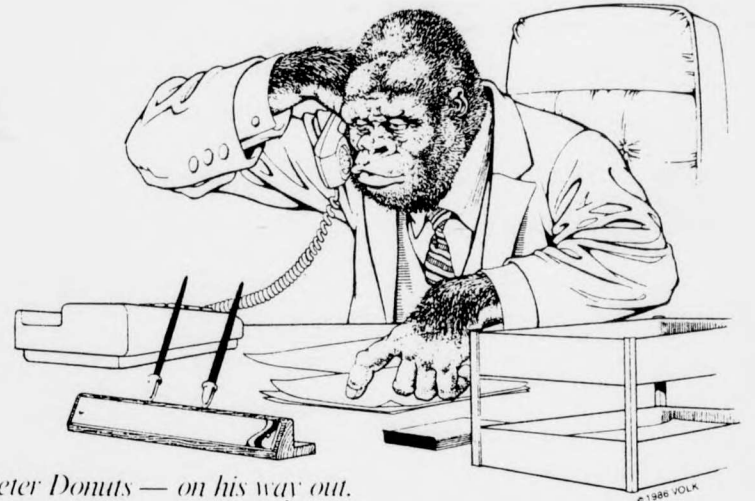
CYSF prez-elect and Short Old Shacks lead singer Jeann Gomushi.

WRITER'S BLOCKHEAD

THE SLEEP OF THE MOT JUSTE, #47:

Have you ever wondered why, whenever you're looking for just the right word, you can never find it? I hate that. (Have you ever noticed yourself starting a column sounding like Andrey Rooney? I especially hate that.)

The other night, I thought I had found the perfect word. It wasn't very long. It had a lot of vowels. It had flow, that magical quality that writers use when they don't have rational reasons for their belief that something is right.

The word was banana.

Unfortunately, the sentence in which it belonged was: "Having conquered most of Europe, Napoleon turned his attention to Russia, not realizing that its harsh winters would . . . his efforts." Banana, as good as it was, didn't seem appropriate, somehow.

The perfect word is of vital importance to writers. For one thing, it's an excellent excuse to give editors anxiously awaiting your work (as in: "I'm sorry I couldn't get that novel to you on Friday, but I'm looking for a six letter synonym for 'yellow fruit that hangs from trees in tropical regions.'").

For another thing, the search for the perfect word is often used to explain a writer's habit of staring into space for no reason. "I thought she was having a nervous breakdown," the editor said, "but she was just trying to find an original way to describe a cloud." It is said that French writer Marcel Proust spent months agonizing over each word of *A La Recherche du Temps Perdu*. Stephen King, on the other hand, spends an average of fifteen seventenths of a second on each of his words.

That must prove something.

The search for the perfect word can be agonizing; there are more than 60,000 words in the English language, yet not one of them adequately describes the feeling of sitting outside a dentist's office, hearing the drill going in another room and knowing that you're five months behind in your

payments. Oogy comes close, but you won't find it in Webster's.

But, banana, now there's a word that you would think could expand to encompass the various and complex uses to which it could be put. "I'd love to go bowling with you Edna," George exclaimed. "But, all of a sudden, I'm feeling rather banana."

Or: John wanted to go to Edmonton, but his banana was in the shop.

Or, even: When all else fails, banana.

But, of course, life isn't that simple. Language is a set of symbols agreed upon by the people who use them. If you go changing the symbols, you get anarchy. Or, worse: a plague of tax consultants.

Clearly, as a perfect word, banana had its limitations. So, I tried others: holistic, pedantry, mesquite, Rastafarian. I thought I might have something with Rastafarian, but when I put it into my original sentence ("Having conquered most of Europe, Napoleon turned his attention to Russia, not realizing that its harsh winters would Rastafarian his efforts."), I was less than enchanted with the results.

Nobody told me writing was going to be so hard!

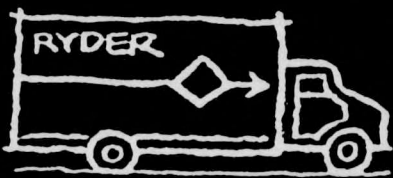

It isn't really. The original TMNT comic was a parody of other comic books, and of mainstream culture in general (thus the fascination with pizza). Much of the original biting satire is missing from the movie, but the ghost remains helping to make an enjoyable movie.

The press kit says that the movie is for adults, not just kids. Actually, the movie is caught in between a desire to be mature, and a need to appeal to the younger folk. The result is a movie that can be enjoyed by adults while they worry about



what their kids (cousins, little siblings etc.) are seeing. As the little girl in front of me said, "Raphael sure says 'damn' a lot."

If you're not thrown into a panic at Turtles influencing kids by saying damn, then how about good guy Casey Jones (Elias Koteas) who goes after crooks

using sports equipment. Bashing somebody with a hockey stick doesn't bother me, or most kids, they see it all the time in the NHL. But, the baseball bat with the accompanying 'thud' made me flinch.

If Bobby Herbeck (writer) and Steve Barron (director) truly

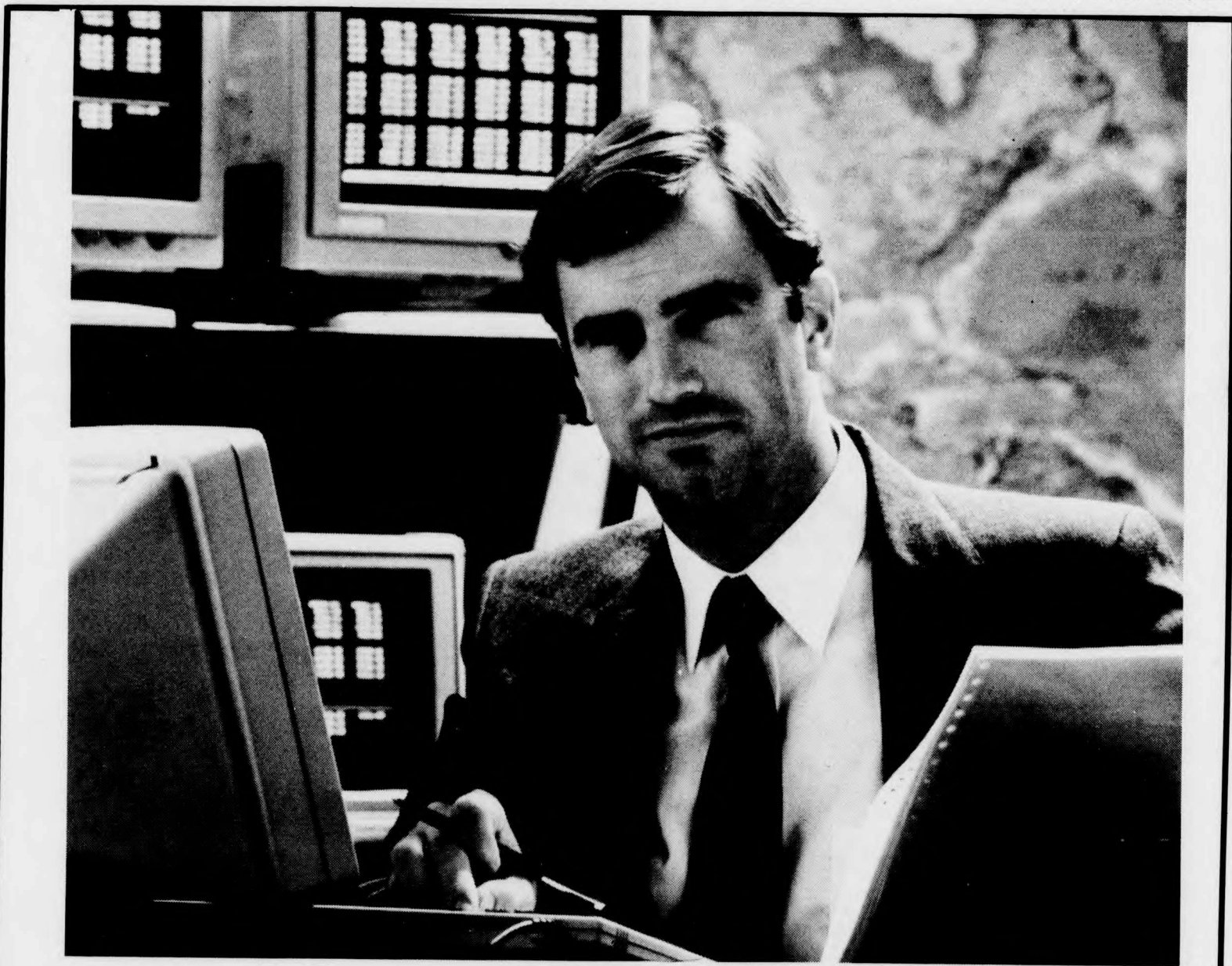
wanted to make an adult movie, then they should have concentrated more on the sub-plots. Two examples: the first is the "romance" between April O'Neil (Judith Hoag) and Casey. In the beginning, there is an awful lot of animosity between them, and then when they leave the city with

the turtles, the most intimacy that they express is having a civil conversation. That's it until the end of the movie, when they kiss through five minutes of credits. The relationship evolved very abruptly, with no subtlety. Subtlety in a movie about turtles and Ninja's? Obviously not.

My second example is when the turtles have been defeated, separated from their master, Master Splinter, and have left the city. Master Splinter psychically teaches the turtles that the most important tool of the Ninja is the mind, not the body. There isn't a notable increase of mindpower by the turtles in the rest of the movie.

Other than those two minor complaints, the rest of the movie is a wonderful visual experience. Jim Henson's animatronics have grown from making a frog ride a bike to this: quite an accomplishment. The motions of all the turtles are fluid and believable, so much so, that after the first five minutes you forget that you're watching a special effect.

So, suspend your firm grip of reality, sit back with your popcorn and enjoy what is sure to be "a shell of a hit." movie
