PRELIMINARY REMARKS.

1. This Compendium of a Catechism (First Grade) is for backward oral-pupils.

It contains the Fundamental Truths, the knowledge of which is indispensable in order that they may receive the Sacraments in a becoming and profitable manner.

- 2. The speech of these pupils being as a general Rule defective, owing to their lack of memory and understanding, in teaching them catechism while study and oral Recitation should not be neglected Lip-Reading followed by Graphic Reading and Writing are the principal means to be employed.
- 3. Care should be taken before the studying of each lesson, to explain clearly to the pupils, at the blackboard (by the devices in common use, that is by comparisons, synonyms, con traries, etc.) the new words and sentences, the meaning of which would be beyond the reach of their intelligence. They will thus study with more relish and facility.
- 4. When each pupil has recited the lesson well, the Catechist will make use of questions; then he will further vary the questions and write on the blacboard some Phrases to be completed and corrected, so as to be sure that the lesson recited by heart has been thoroughly understood.

- 1. The Short Catechism (First Grade) is intended for beginners. It will especially help the older backward pupils to acquire a sufficient knowledge of the Truths of Religion and of the means of practicing their religious duties.
- 2. The Short Catechism (Second Grade) which corresponds to the diocesan Catechism is the course to be followed in preparing the more intelligent pupils for communion and confirmation.
- 3. The Large Catechism (**Third Grade**) is intended for *older pupils* better gifted and capable of making greater progress in the study of Religion.

NOTE. — The Large Catechism may be of great use to advanced pupils who have left their Institution. Being unable in the world to understand either a sermon or a religious conference, or a series of religious discourses, they will find in this Book, written for them and in a style familiar to them, clear explanations of Christian Doctrine, answers to current objections, solutions of cases in a word, a great many practical details, which knowledge will help tem to keep their faith intact and to serve God with greater fervor in proportion as their Piety will be more intelligent.

He opens the Tabernacle, he takes a large

Host and puts it in the Monstrance.

He offers incense to Jesus Christ, he walks up the steps to the altar, he takes hold of the Monstrance and he blesses us. It is Jesus Christ, present in the Sacred Host, Who blesses us.

- 4. The priest preaches. The priest ascends the pulpit, he makes the sign of the cross and he talks about God, Jesus Christ, the Blessed Virgin, etc.







GOD IS OUR MASTER.

16. — THE TEN COMMANDMENTS OF GOD.

- 1. God may command us, that is, give us orders, because He is our MASTER.
- 2. God has given us TEN COMMANDMENTS.
- 3. All must obey the Commandments of God.

God gave Moses the Ten Commandments. God had written them on two tables of stone.

1. One God shalt thou adore and Him only shalt thou love above all things.

1. By the first Commandment God commands me 1. To adore Him alone — and to love Him more than anybody or anything. — God commands me 2. To love my neighbor.

My neighbor: that is every man, without any exception.

I will adore God alone (Father, Son, and Holy Ghost).

— I will love God above all persons and all things.

— I will also love my neighbor.

- 2. Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord, thy God in vain.
- 2. By the Second Commandment God Forbids me to blaspheme: that is, to utter bad words against God, the Church, Jesus Christ and the Saints.

I will never utter bad words against God, Jesus Christ, the Church or the Saints.

- 3. Remember that thou keep holy the Sunday.
- 3. By the Third Commandment 1. God commands me to go to Mass every Sunday;—
 2. God forbids me to work on Sunday.

I will always go to mass on Sunday; — I will not work on Sunday.







28. — EXTREME UNCTION



The priest giving Extreme Unction.

1. Extreme Unction is a Sacrament which comforts both the soul and body of the sick person who receives it.

2. It helps the sick to die a happy death.

3. Persons, who are VERY SICK, should receive Extreme Unction.

4. To receive Extreme Unction WELL, we must confess our sins, pray, and have confidence in God.

If we cannot confess, we must ask pardon of God and make an act of Perfect Contrition.

5. To give Extreme Unction, the priest makes with holy oil the sign of the cross upon the eyes, ears, nose, mouth, hands and feet of the sick person, — and he prays to God to forgive the sick person all the sins he has committed through the sight, hearing, smell taste and touch.



29. — HOLY ORDERS



Priests receive the Sacrament of Holy Orders once only.

- 1. Holy Orders is a Sacrament by which priests are ordained.
- 2. The Sacrament of Holy Orders gives the priest the power to say Mass, to baptize, to hear confessions, to preach, to give Communion, etc.

- 3. Holy Thursday is the day Jesus Christ instituted the Blessed Sacrament.
- 4. Good Friday is the day Jesus Christ died on a cross for our Redemption.
- 5. Easter is the day Jesus Christ rose from the dead.
- 6. Ascension Day (40 days after Easter) is the day Jesus Christ rose up into Heaven.
- 7. Pentecost (10 days after the Ascension) is the day the Holy Ghost came down upon the Apostles in the form of tongues of fire.
- 8. Corpus Christi is the day the Church honors the Blessed Sacrament by carrying it in procession.
- 9. The Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is the day our Lord has asked us to honor His Sacred Heart in a special way.

FEASTS OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN.

- 1. The Immaculate Conception (December 8th). On this day we honor the Blessed Virgin who was conceived without sin.
- 2. The Nativity, B. V. M. (Sentember 8th).

 On this day we honor the birth of the Blessed Virgin.
- 3. The Annunciation (March 25th). On this day we honor the mystery by which God became man. He became man by taking to Himself a body and soul in the womb of the Blessed Virgin.

- 4. The Seven Dolors B. V. M. On this day we honor the sufferings of the Blessed Virgin at the foot of the cross on Good Friday.
- 5. The Assumption (August 15th). On this day we honor the Blessed Virgin who was taken up body and soul into Heaven.

We pray to the Blessed Virgin in a special way during May. May is the month of the Blessed Virgin. We hour her also during October, the month of the Holy Rosary.

OTHER FEASTS.

1. All Saints Day. (November 1st). — On this day we honor and pray in a special way to all the Saints in Heaven.

I ought to pray to all the Saints and especially to n.y Patron-Saint.

- 2.All Soul's Day (November 2nd). On this day we pray for the Souls in Purgatory and go in procession to the cemetery.
- 3. The Feast of Saint Joseph (March 19th).

 On this day we especially honor Saint Joseph though we should pray to him every day.

March is the month of Saint Joseph.

- 4. The Feast of Saints Peter and Paul (June 29th). On this day we especially honor and pray to the holy apostles Peter and Paul.
- 5. The Feast of the Holy Angels (October 2nd). On this day we especially honor and pray to the Holy Angels.

1. Advent is a time of prayer, fasting and penance, which prepares us for Christmas. — Advent lasts four weeks.

2. Lent is a time of prayer, fasting and penance, which prepares us for Easter. — Lent lasts 40 days. It begins on Ash-Wednesday and ends on Easter Sunday.

3. Holy Week is the week before Easter.

4. The EMBER-DAYS are three fast days (Wednesday, Friday and Saturday) at the beginning of each of the four Seasons (4 times each year).

5. The Vigils or Eves of some of the more important festivals are: the Eve of Christmas, of Pentecost, of the feast of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, of the Assumption and All Saints' day.



Jesus Christ instituted the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist: 1st to offer Himself to God His Father on the Altar, during Mass; 2nly, to give Himself to us in Holy Communion, 3rly, to always remain in the Tabernacle, amongst us.

1. The holy Mass. — Once, on the first Good Friday, Jesus Christ offered, His Body and Blood upon the cross to God the Father in order to save us: this was the Sacrifice of the Cross.

In the same manner every day, upon the altar Jesus offers up by the hands of the priest His Body and Blood, to God the Father: this is the Sacrifice of the Mass.

During Mass I must unite myself to Jesus Christ and the priest to adore God, to thank

Him, to ask pardou of Him for my sins and the grace to go to Heaven.

I must also think of the sufferings and death of Jesus Christ.

We must hear Mass with respect, attention and devotion, especially on Sundays.

2. HOLY COMMUNION. — The word communion means union with Jesus Christ. When we receive the Sacred Host, it is Jesus Christ Himself, Who enters into our mouth, rests on our tongue and descends into our hearts.

When the priest gives us the Sacred Host, he says to us: " the Body of our Lord Jesus Christ brin to Eternal life:"

If we wish to be victions and go to Heaven, we should often go to Holy communion; but let us always take care to receive our Lord fervently and worthily that is with devotion, respect and love towards Him and without mortal sin on our soul.

3. The Visit to the Blessed Sacrament.—I do not see Jesus in church; but I know and believe that He is really present in the Sacred Host.

When passing before the Tabernacle, I bend the right knee to adore our Lord. Then I say the "Prayer on entering the chapel".

Jesus looks at me, He listens to me. — If pray to Him well, He shall grant me a great many graces.

Before going out of the church, I will always pray to the Most Blessed Virgin.

Yes, my God! I would rather die than sin again.

But my soul is weak; by itself, it cannot withstand temptation nor do good. I believe so.

O Jesus! do Thou help me! do Thou fortify my heart and make it like unto Thine. O Mary! protect me, especially in the hour of temptation. Holy Patron saint! pray for me.

Hail, Mary, etc.

NOTICE

You are bound to confess all your mortal sins. To commit a mortal sin, we must disobey God grievously, with knowledge and will.

You are not bound to confess venial sins, but it is good to do so. When you do not know whether a sin is mortal or venial, you must at least ask about it.

Perform your penance well. Recall to mind your good resolutions and the good counsels of your confessor.

Perform acts of mortification, and good works to atone for your sins and not to go into Purgatory.

A mortal sin forgotten in confession is forgiven with the others by Absolution; but if we remember it later on, we must confess it in the next confession.

Never speak of your sins, nor of your penance, nor of what the priest told you in confession.
