Another supporter of the Premier admitted that the Lieutenant-Governor had undoubtedly caught the Premier napping. "What he should have done," he said, "was to have suggested a commission of his own choosing himself. The Governor could not be refused to accept of his own constitutional reason, which he would hardly have given. As it is the Premier's duty to accept of the commission or not, but give the Lieutenant-Governor the alternative of backing up or dismissing his ministry, which is always a serious thing to do.

The entire French press is greatly excited over the crisis. The Conservative press, without an exception, approves of Lieutenant-Governor Angers' action, and demands that the Royal Commission be named by himself, claiming that a committee of the House means a whitewash. There are practically only three daily papers defending the Premier. L'Etendard at noon says that the Premier and his colleagues have the confidence of the Queen's representative. The difficulty rests upon the personnel of the commission.

THE THREE AGES.

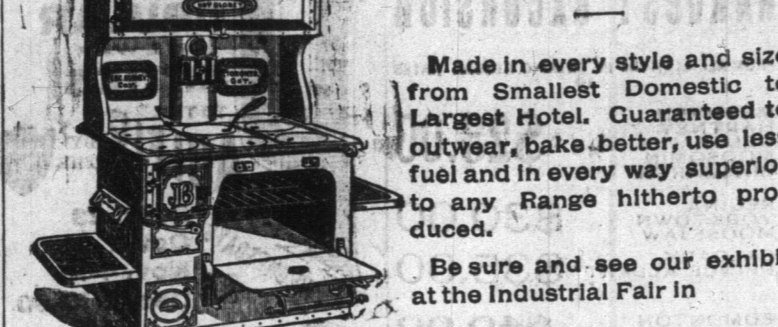
