The Revised Bible.

New York, May 12.—The first delivery of the revised edition of the New Testament is to be delivered at twelve (twelve) o'clock by the American and English publishers; 400,000 copies have been stored for weeks with agents, but in accordance with the plan of the publishers they are not to be given to the public till May 25th, the day fixed for the simultaneous appearance on both sides of the Atlantic. The book is from the Christian University press of Oxford England. Already a score of American publishers have been announcing and advertising, and many schemes have been tried to surreptitiously obtain a copy of the new edition. There will be no copies sold at retail by agents. Arrangements have been made with retail dealers, who will unquestionably have a greater immediate sale than any book ever published, and almost every bookseller has already immense orders for it. The Oxford edition are in four different kinds of type and in twenty styles of binding; prices range from 15 cents to \$16. A few copies have for some time been in the hands of the American Revision Committee, but they have been carefully guarded as those in the agents' hands.
