Voters Guide.—The Elons 1849 Act of and the Elective Franchise Extension Act.

(a) Every male person, having been for six months previous to, and being at the time of his voting, the legal and bona fide freholder of lands of the actual value of £5 or upwards, or of the yearly value of £5 or upwards, in any township or place.

(b) Or if the lands of the value aforesaid shall have come to him by descent or inheritance, or by devise, marriage or contract of marriage, he may vote, though not a freholder, for six months.

(c) Or if the lands of the value aforesaid shall have been registered three calendar months before the date of the writ of election, he may vote.

(d) Or if having been for six months previous to, and being, at the time of his voting, the legal and bona fide tenant or occupant of lands of the value aforesaid, he may vote.

No person to vote as tenant, unless his lease was originally for not less than one year.

No person deemed the occupant of lands, unless he occupy with the consent of the owner, and with the intent of becoming the owner or proprietor, on the performance of the lease or tenancy, or occupant of lands on which any instalment of purchase money, or any rent, or other sum of money is over due to the crown and unpaid; for as owner tenant, or occupant of the property being voted to the crown, and partners, entitled to vote if their respective shares are sufficient.

The electors shall vote at the polling place, in the township or ward where the property shall lie upon which they claim the right of voting.

A person may vote if the lands lie partly within one county and partly within another. If lands lie partly within one polling place and partly within another, the voter may vote in either place, at his discretion.

A voter may be called upon to declare the true situation, or the names of his neighbors. No person to vote more than once at the same election.

Two consecutive days of polling in each Township or ward. Voting to commence at nine of the clock, a. m., and finish at 5 p. m., on the same day.

All applications, without other formality, may be administered by the Deputy Returning Officer, where that is only necessary to naturalize a voter. Interpreters may be appointed, and shall take an oath: I swear (or affirm) that I will faithfully execute such duties, declarations, affirmations, questions and answers as the Deputy Returning Officer, shall require me to translate at this election. So help me God.

Voter may be required to take oath or affirmation No. 3, in addition to any other oath that he may be legally required to take, such as that he believes himself to be of the full age of 21 years, &c.

Deputy returning officer empowered to administer oaths Nos. 1 and 2; but a voter taking one of the said oaths or affirmations, shall not be required to take any other oath.
