March 4, 1948.

The Secretary of State presents his compliments to His Excellency the Ambassador of Canada and has the honor to refer to his note No. 106 of March 4, 1948, proposing that an agreement be entered into between the Governments of the United States of America and Canada in the following terms:

Memorandum of Agreement

In order to improve the sanitary practices prevailing in the shellfish industries of the United States and Canada, it is agreed as follows:

- 1. Whatever manual of recommended practice for sanitary control of shellfish industry is approved by both the United States Public Health Service and the Canadian Department of National Health and Welfare will be regarded as setting forth the sanitary principles that will govern the certification of shell fish shippers.
- 2. The degree of compliance with those principles obtained by the State authorities of the United States will be reported to the Canadian Department of National Health and Welfare by the United States Public Health Services and the degree of compliance obtained by the Provincial and other competed authorities in Canada will be reported by the Canadian Department of National Health and Welfare to the United States Public Health Service.
- 3. Whenever inspections of shellfish handling facilities or of shellfish grown ing areas are desired by either party to this Agreement, the other party will endeavor to facilitate such inspection endeavor to facilitate such inspections.
- 4. This Agreement may be terminated by either party giving thirty days notice.

The memorandum of Agreement as set forth above is acceptable to Government of the United States of America. As proposed in His Exellence, note, therefore, that note and the present reply are regarded as constituting Agreement between the two Governments effective on the date of the present note.
