Monsieur le Directeur général,

Je suis heureux de joindre à la présente la réponse du Canada aux questionnaires transmis aux Etats membres avec la lettre circulaire n° 2548 dans laquelle vous réclamez leur aide pour la préparation du document 20 C/5.

Je dois d'abord vous dire que j'apprécie et que j'appuie fortement l'invitation que vous avez lancée aux Etats membres et aux commissions nationales de travailler en étroite collaboration avec vous pour la formulation des plans à moyen terme et des programmes biennaux de l'UNESCO. Le gouvernement du Canada et la Commission canadienne pour l'UNESCO sont conscients des efforts considérables que vous et votre équipe avez déployés pour mettre au point des méthodes efficaces à cet égard, et nous n'ignorons pas non plus les complexités qu'entraînent, d'une part, le processus de planification et d'autre part, l'étendue et la diversité du mandat et de la clientèle de l'UNESCO.

Dans l'espoir que mes commentaires vous seront utiles ainsi qu'à vos collègues, je me permets d'exprimer certaines réserves sur ces questionnaires et de souligner les difficultés susceptibles de se poser lorsqu'il s'agira de dégager des données utiles des réponses reçues.

Pour répondre aux questionnaires, nos conseillers, dont plusieurs possèdent une vaste expérience des programmes de l'UNESCO, ont dû consulter et étudier deux autres documents totalisant plus de 900 pages. Ils ont eu du mal à associer les réalisations aux objectifs, à tirer des conclusions significatives sur la répartition optimale de ressources limitées et à porter des jugements uniformes sur plus de 200 thèmes.

Il semble également que la formulation des questions appelle des réponses qui pourraient être ambigués ou trompeuses. Nous avons d'ailleurs fait état de cette préoccupation dans la "note technique" qui accompagne la réponse du Canada et qui indique également les interprétations que nous avons retenues.

Si les Etats membres et les commissions nationales peuvent et doivent s'intéresser à l'orientation générale du programme ainsi qu'aux activités dans les domaines où ils ont des connaissances ou des intérêts particuliers, il est entendu que seul le Secrétariat est suffisamment bien informé pour juger de la rentabilité de l'ensemble du programme ainsi que de ses composantes reflétées dans les questionnaires et les documents C/4 et C/5. Nous sommes d'ailleurs confiants que dans l'exécution de cette tâche, vos services attacheront de l'importance aux paragraphes 28 a) et 29 de la résolution 100 du document 19/C. En ce qui concerne les programmes où nous sommes suffisamment renseignés pour porter des jugements éclaires, nos conseillers ont noté le nombre d'activités qui semblent peu rentables par rapport aux objectifs fixés et notre réponse signale d'ailleurs des cas précis.

Comme la formulation des questionnaires porte davantage sur le détail du programme que sur les affectations budgétaires, lesquelles limitent nécessairement le champ d'action, nous avons dû effectuer des calculs assez complexes pour convertir en chiffres ronds les taux de croissance des dépenses prévues sur les questionnaires. Vous conviendrez, j'en suis sûr, que cette conversion était nécessaire puisqu'il aurait été absolument inutile et improductif de discuter des programmes en faisant abstraction des fonds disponibles pour leur exécution.

Bien que les questionnaires ne fassent aucune mention des révisions du Plan à moyen terme (document 20 C/4), nous sommes amenés à conclure, entre autres choses, que la transposition du plan en programme met en lumière certaines faiblesses dans le plan même, lesquelles pourraient être corrigées dans le document révisé. Il est notamment évident qu'on n'a pu trouver des activités de programme rentables - peut-être est-il d'ailleurs impossible de le faire - qui traduisent certains des objectifs du plan et de ses thèmes. Dans d'autres cas, par exemple en 6.5, il semble que le désir de poursuivre des programmes actuels peut avoir donné lieu à une élaboration superficielle de certains objectifs. Notre réponse contient d'ailleurs d'autres exemples à cet égard.

Nous estimons qu'on devrait tenir compte de ces remarques dans la formulation du document 20 C/4 et la révision du tableau synoptique des ressources disponibles. Ce dernier devrait d'ailleurs être révisé de façon à indiquer la croissance négative des objectifs auxquels les 18 et 19 sessions de la Conférence générale et les questionnaires donnent relativement peu d'importance. On pourrait alors concentrer les efforts, d'un côté, sur les activités importantes, et de l'autre, dans les secteurs où l'UNESCO peut vraiment fournir un apport précieux.

En ce qui a trait à la somme de ressources dont dispose l'UNESCO pour mettre en oeuvre ses programmes à venir, je me vois obligé, en raison de considérations d'ordre national, de souligner l'importance d'associer la planification du programme et du plan à moyen terme à l'aptitude des Etats membres à leur accorder un appui financier. En effet, vous n'êtes pas sans savoir que de nombreux gouvernements, dont celui du Canada, ont adopté des mesures d'austérité à l'échelon national. Dans certains cas, les budgets des organismes internationaux ont dépassé le taux de croissance des programmes nationaux, ce qui signifie qu'avec le temps, moins de ressources pourront être affectées aux priorités nationales. Certaines des causes de ces augmentations, telle l'inflation, échappent au pouvoir de l'UNESCO, mais la croissance réelle inscrite dans le projet de programme présenté aux gouvernements relève toutefois de l'Organisation. Il importe donc, à notre avis, que l'UNESCO revoit constamment ses programmes en cours de façon à éliminer progressivement ceux qui sont devenus moins utiles et à déterminer ceux qui se chevauchent au sein de l'Organisation ou par rapport aux activités d'autres institutions de l'ONU. Les crédits ainsi débloqués pourraient alors être affectés à des activités prioritaires.

Je voudrais enfin réitérer les préoccupations déjà exprimées au sujet du mode de calcul des taux de croissance. En effet, en se fondant sur le budget antérieur plutôt que sur l'évolution réelle des dépenses, les taux de croissance prévus semblent minimiser la croissance réelle puisque l'extension du programme, financée au moyen d'une efficacité accrue et d'autres économies - la croissance proprement dite - est masquée dans les chiffres de base au lieu d'apparaître dans le taux nominal.

Comme je l'ai dit précédemment, nous appuyons totalement le principe de la consultation des Etats membres au chapitre de la planification du programme. Pour sa part, le Canada verrait d'un bon oeil la création d'un groupe de travail formé d'Etats représentatifs chargés d'étudier les moyens d'accroître l'efficacité de ce principe, et si jamais vous reteniez la suggestion, notre gouvernement serait disposé à faire partie de ce groupe.

Je suis convaincu que vous considérerez la réponse du Canada comme une manifestation positive de notre intérêt et de notre contribution aux activités de l'UNESCO. En conclusion, permettez-moi de vous souhaiter, en mon nom et en celui du gouvernement du Canada, de continuer à relever avec autant de bonheur le défi que représente la fonction de Directeur général d'un organisme aussi important, à l'échelle internationale, que l'UNESCO.

Technical note re questionnaire "A" (CL 2548 Annex II)

- 1. There are ambiguities in Questionnaire "A" which may give rise to misleading and inconsistent returns and will raise questions about the validity of the consolidated quantitative analysis.
- 2. The explanatory note annexed to CL 2548 sheds some light on the problems, but leaves several matters of interpretation unresolved. The present note is accordingly designed to ensure consistency at least within the Canadian return, and perhaps to sound a note of warning about the interpretation of whatever statistics may be produced as a result of the exercise.

Translation problems

3. Question 2 refers to "adéquation à l'objectif" and this is translated into English as "relevance". The two notions of adequacy and relevance are by no means identical; the first has an operational connotation, while the second may imply only an abstract conceptual linkage. Thus in short, a given programme action may be relevant without being adequate, while a given appropriation may be adequate although spent on activities which are not relevant.

The difficulty is compounded in the column headings, where "relevant" appears as "satisfaisante". Here again the notion of "relevance" seems to relate largely to the intent of the action, while the judgement of whether or not it is satisfactory directs attention to the conduct and results of the given set of projects.

4. Since the purpose of the questionnaire is presumably to assist the Director-General in preparing a draft 20 C/5 including those activities which will "make the greatest contribution to the achievement of the established targets" (19 C/100 para 28(a)) the questions have been answered in the Canadian return in accordance with the French text: i.e., in terms of practical utility and cost benefit judgements, rather than in terms of conceptual relationships.

Ambiguity in the Replies to Question 2

5. Without interpretation, the replies to Question 2 can hardly help but be ambiguous, for it is unclear whether activities are to be judged with or without reference to the financial allocations provided under each theme.

In other words, inconsequential but inexpensive activities may be a "tres satisfaisante" symbolic response to a theme deserving only minor emphasis. Increased effort and investment in this area would imply a reduced rating of "assez satisfaisante" or "pas satisfaisante". Alternatively, and with equal logic, it could be held that no programme can be satisfactory if the theme to which it is addressed is of only minor interest, and the indicated reply would accordingly appear in column 9.

- 6. Thus a score in column 9 "pas satisfaisante" might with equal logic imply:
 - a) that more effort and investment is indicated;
 - b) that the programme cannot be made satisfactory, and that the resources should accordingly be transferred elsewhere or
 - c) that the effort and investment is appropriate to the theme, but requires redirection in terms of specific activities.

Quoi faire?

- 7. Decisions on these interpretations can only be arbitrary, and will no doubt differ as between respondents to the questionnaire. Aggregate returns are accordingly suspect.
- 8. We have attempted to maintain consistency within the questionnaire, using the following interpretations:
- a) Column 7 "très satisfaisante" means that the programme is acceptable and commended as it stands and does not require substantial changes in direction, operation, or funding. This does not imply a recommendation for increased effort or funding.
- b) Column 8 "assez satisfaisante" means that the programme is broadly acceptable but could benefit from changes in some of its components, often identified in the "comments" column.
- c) Column 9 "pas satisfaisante" means that the programme is not acceptable for one of the reasons set forth above in paragraph 6. The response is normally clarified in the "comments" column and may imply substantial increases or decreases in funding, or changes in substance.

Considering the history of educational development, one cannot but be impressed by the ultimate necessity for priorities in the creation of an overall plan toward the end of providing the greatest good to the greatest number. We wonder about such high cost activities as education for the handicapped (03) and indeed pre-primary education, when the main struggle to build a basic system of schools is both far from complete and chronically short of resources. Perhaps too it is pretty much a theoretical exercise to speak of "improved mobility" (05) in educational systems before there are structures and systems to move 'from' and 'to'.
		x	To talk of pre-primary education in most developing countries is to water down an already thin programme. There could be a real danger in allocating too many resources to the pre-primary level to the detriment of the other levels. With regard to 03, we are uncertain of the benefits of "segregating" certain groups of handicapped people from the regular system, only to "repatriate" them at a later date. Generally, we feel that action for the education of the handicapped is more effectively pursued at the national level. With regard to 02, we feel that in the UN context, pre-primary education falls more properly within the UNICEF mandate. We would support 01 particularly if the activities were focussed on an adult literacy level relevant to the Third World.
			If re-formulated, the activities corresponding to sections 02 and 03, and to a certain extent 04, would be of very great relevance to Unesco Member States from the industrialized world, and we bring this matter to the attention of the Unesco Secretariat. This is an area where countries such as Canada could draw considerable benefit from Unesco activities.

In developing countries there is not likely to be a sharp line between the library community and the information centre and system community. One common set of technical standards for bibliographic description would immeasurably ease the problem of information exchange, and would reduce the amount of effort that goes into preparing bibliographic descriptions. We believe, therefore, that Unesco should aim at reconciling UBC and UNISIST standards in order to present to the International Standards Organization detailed technical, bibliographic standards for world-wide adoption by all facilities (libraries, information centres etc.) developing ongoing machine-readable bibliographic files.

We would see the promotion of ISDS as being also relevant to the attainment of the objective in that it has the potential for reducing the ambiguities which increase the amount of effort that individual centres have to put into the identification of material.

Another area to which we would assign some priority is theme 05 - Promotion of the training and education of specialists in and users of information. It is our experience, when cooperating in projects in developing countries, that a lack of skilled information personnel is a major obstacle to success. No single organization like IDRC can do much to solve the problem; we find that a considerable amount of effort goes into identifying suitable training opportunities for project personnel; but these opportunities are rarely available in developing countries where the general setting of the courses would have most relevance to the students. There is a definite need to develop curricula which reflect the requirements of developing regions and to establish schools in these regions.

Throughout the program emphasis is placed on the development of systems to expedite the transfer of information. Lacking ready access to literature sources, information systems, no matter how ingenious, are of little value. In a current awareness service such as SDI, the service fails if users cannot obtain prompt access to cited papers and if data bases cannot be delivered on schedule. Thus with regard to Theme 03 attention should be given to determining the strengths and weaknesses of literature resources in a nation or a region and the creation of mechanisms whereby at least basic resources can be established.

Prince Edward Island ARK

The Prince Edward Island Ark is an expression of emerging concepts of habitat design. As a design concept it responds to the realities of the current energy crisis, of the past or present irrational and non-rational use of resources, of the deleterious social and environmental effects wrought by misuse of science and reflected in technological development and of the influence of bigness - institutional and technological - on societal well-being.

The project was proposed and constructed by the New Alchemy Institute and financed by the Government of Canada and the Province of P.E.I. as a contribution to the 1976 Habitat Conference held in Vancouver. The Ark combines, under a single roof, an experimental facility including a family residence and a commercial greenhouse and fish culture unit. The building is heated entirely from renewable energy, direct solar and wood. A unique hydraulic operated wind power system is still under development. Superfluous power will be fed into the P.E.I. electric grid. Ecologically, the Ark is designed to minimize waste production through recycling or organic materials produced in the greenhouse, aquatic system and the living quarters. This pilot project will also demonstrate how energy-saving technologies can be adapted to serving the needs of a family or small community.

"Child in the City"

This study proposes to examine the impact of rapid changes in contemporary urban living conditions on the well-being of children. The focus is on social and environmental trends and their real and potential consequences for children. Changes in family structure, housing, population and in feelings of social responsibility are the dominant trends to be analyzed. These changes have varying impacts on the attitudes, behaviour, life styles and general social health of our future generations. Some of the consequences are obvious (increasing violence), others are more subtle (changing values).

Five specific areas for research are suggested:

- attitudes to, and changes in the distribution of authority
- 2) the increasing diversity in population structure and thus in value standards
- 3) changes in housing and neighbourhood environments
- 4) changes in the context of childraising, and
- 5) changes in the access of children to different social activities.

Specific emphasis is given in each area to anticipating those emerging factors which will affect children, directly and indirectly, and which will increasingly shape the social and institutional context in which medical and welfare services operate. Since such issues, when identified, demand a response, the programme proposes to parallel the empirical research with demonstration projects. These projects are designed to stimulate public awareness, to disseminate research information, and when appropriate to encourage policy action.

The programme is funded by the Toronto Hospital for Sick Children Research Foundation. Members of the research team are Saul V. Levine, M. D., (Associate Director), Anna-Rose Spina, Ph.D (Programme Co-ordinator, Social Control), Linda Haggerty, MSW, Ph.D. (Consultant in Social Work), Robert Rinkoff, Ph. D. (Socialisation), Ellis Roberts, Ph.D. (Housing and Community Structure), Suzanne Zeigler, Ph.D. (Population Diversity). Environmental perception and policy research

Undertaken at the Institute for Environmental Studies, University of Toronto by the Environmental Perception and Policy Working Group.

A group of interrelated projects are being planned and undertaken with support from various national and international agencies including ICSU-SCOPE, UNESCO-MAB, IGU, IDRC, UNEP, AECB and EPC. Two themes are considered to be of possible interest to other UNESCO National Commissions:

- a) Development of methods to study environmental perception with particular emphasis on
 - non-literate populations
 - governmental and other decision-makers and planners
 - methods <u>not</u> requiring high expertise on the part of field researchers.
- b) International comparative studies of national approaches to environmental risk assessment and policy for natural and man-made hazards. These studies include analysis of scientific monitoring, modelling and testings needs and the development of criteria, institutional and regulatory mechanisms as they have emerged within different national structures. The excalation of environmental risks in newly industralizing and urbanizing countries with limited scientific resources is an important focus in the project.

- 1) The following comments should be read in the light of the points raised in the letter of transmittal.
- 2) Paradoxically, the most appropriate innovation for the period 1979-82 would be a decision to stop experimenting with "innovative" ways and means of carrying out the programme. Most methods of operation and combinations of methods have been tried; what is required for the immediate future is a consolidation of investment and effort on those activities and methods which have demonstrated high productivity and have attracted the most substantial financial and intellectual participation by Member States and the world community at large.
- In this context we would call attention particularly to Resolution 3.1 and paragraphs 28(a) and 29 of Resolution 100 of the nineteenth session, as well as Resolution 36.1 and 41.1 of the seventeenth and eighteenth sessions.
- 4) One exception to the general statement in paragraph 2 above is the process of planning and programme development itself, where new methods are clearly required. Experience at the 19th session of the General Conference and with the present questionnaire amply demonstrates the inadequacy of the present procedures which, despite good intentions, simply do not permit governmental and other experts to come to grips with the main issues.
- 5) Suggestions include
- 1) Radical rethinking and simplification of the documentation, to identify important policy and financial issues in a form that may be readily grasped by people who are not expert in the minutiae of the programme.
- The new documentation should probably stem from the budget lines and should include a very brief justification of the relative scale of proposed expenditures together with a summary statement of any policy issues requiring resolution. Costs of programmes (including allocated overhead and staff-costs) should be clearly indicated, and excessive detail should be suppressed.
- Wider use of meetings of governmental experts (perhaps along the nes of the councils of the scientific liaison programmes or the interregional meetings of National Commission Secretaries-General) to make considered recommendations on programme development in defined areas.
