MINUTES OF THE MANITOBA AND NORTH-WEST CONFERENCE.

HELD AT BRANDON, JUNE 8TH, 1893.

The MINISTERIAL SESSION OF THE MANITOBA AND NORTH-WEST CONFERENCE of the Methodist Church met in the city of Brandon, on Thursday, June 8th, 1893, at 9 a.m.

The General Superintendent, Rev. Dr. CARMAN, announced the 367th Hymn; the Secretary, Rev. Dr. MACLEAN, read 1 Corinthians, chapter 13, and prayer was offered by Rev. HENRY KENNER and Professor STEWART, B.D. The roll of ministers was called and fifty-six answered to their names.

McCullagh, of Prince Albert, was specially ordained at that place by Rev. James Woodsworth and Rev. F. B. Stacey, B.A., who were appointed for that purpose; that J. R. Howarth, T. J. Kennedy were also ordained, under authority of Conference of 1892, by the President of the Conference and the ministers resident in the city of Winnipeg; and that B. C. Freeman and S. D. REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

REPORT OF STATISTICAL COMMITTEE.

Your Committee, having carefully examined the District Schedules, and revised and tabulated their returns, beg leave to report the statistical returns for the year 1892-93, as follows:

Membership, 14,271; number published last year, 12,936; net increase, 1,335. How received: On trial, 1,515; by letter, 1,529.

FINANCIAL RETURNS.

Table with 2 columns: Description and Amount. Rows include Ministerial support, Connexional funds, Circuit purposes, Total raised by Circuits and Missions, Raised last year, and Increase.

Ministers and probationers in the active work, 128; reported last year, 123; increase, 5. Members of Official Boards, 1,989; number published last year, 1,892; increase, 97. Copies of Guardian and Wesleyan taken, 601; decrease, 132.

Owing to failure on the part of some Districts to complete their schedules at District Meeting, and on the part of others to do simple sums in addition or subtraction correctly, your Committee found their work most difficult.

The law enacted by our last General Conference, that a committee be appointed by the District Meeting to audit all Circuit and District Schedules, is in most of the Districts practically a dead letter. We would request the Conference to emphatically enforce the law.

We would recommend that the Discipline be carried out in having all the Schedules filled out at District Meeting, and that the figures then given remain unchanged after passing through the hands of the Auditors.

Your Committee would also recommend that each District Meeting be held a sufficient length of time before Conference, to allow the Secretary of the District time to complete all his schedules, and the Auditing Committee opportunity to thoroughly examine them wherever practicable.

We would again recommend that the amounts raised for Wesley College be entered in the column headed "Sustentation Fund."

Your Committee request the Conference to memorialize the General Conference to supply the Statistical Committee with blank forms for tabulating the District returns.

We also recommend the Conference to petition the General Conference to prepare for the Statistical Committee a new schedule, showing in a horizontal column the amounts which each Circuit or Mission has raised for each and all purposes.

Your Committee recommend that the District Secretaries and a layman elected by each Annual District Meeting constitute the Statistical Committee.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF EXAMINERS, 1893.

The Board of Examiners reported as follows:—

Eighty candidates presented themselves for examination, the largest number in the history of this Conference.

The Board would recommend the following regulations for 1893:

1. All candidates who intend writing on the Preliminary Course shall send intimation of the same to the Chairman of the District in which they reside not later than the first day of March.

2. Examiners shall forward to the Secretary of the Examining Board, not later than the 15th of February, manuscript questions on the subjects allotted to them, which shall be printed under the supervision of the Secretary, and forwarded by him to the Chairmen of Districts not later than the 15th of March.

3. The examinations shall be conducted in each District where there are candidates on the third Wednesday in April, by the Chairman and the Board resident within the District; but in cases where the distances are very great, the President may grant permission to Chairmen to arrange for examination of candidates under supervision of the nearest ordained minister.

4. Time shall be considered an element in the examinations, and in all cases shall be strictly adhered to. Each Examiner shall specify the time allowed for writing the paper set by him.

5. Each paper shall be valued at 100 marks.

6. All the subjects duplicated in the Arts Course shall be given to the examiners, to whom they are assigned in the ordinary course of study.

7. In order to secure uniformity, it is recommended that candidates be discouraged from taking subjects other than those in their regular year of study, also that all examiners report the results of examinations to the Secretary of the Board before the first day of May.

various circuits, the efforts of Principal Sparling in raising the necessary funds for the sustentation of the College and in obtaining assistance toward the erection of a college building, have resulted in most encouraging success.

At the last meeting of Conference the purchase of a college site and the necessary steps proposed to raise funds for payment of the same were reported. These steps were duly taken, and Principal Sparling, with a zeal and energy which cannot be too highly appreciated, proceeded to solicit assistance both here and in the Eastern Provinces. As the result of his labors, the Board has pleasure in stating that the amount now promised is over \$80,000, which amount does not include a number of persons who have intimated an intention to give substantial donations, but who have not yet fixed upon a definite amount. With these and other donations from places not yet visited, there is an encouraging prospect that the fund will ultimately reach \$100,000.

In making up this magnificent fund, the Methodists of Manitoba and the North-West have done there part nobly. Especial praise, however, is due to those liberal brethren in the east, whose munificent donations at an early stage at once demonstrated their estimation of the importance of the College to Methodism, and encouraged our people here to show their faith in its success by contributions equally liberal in proportion to their means. Special acknowledgment in this connection is due to Mr. Geo. A. Cox, of Toronto, who, during a visit here last year, increased his subscription by \$5,000, and to Mr. H. A. Massey, also of Toronto, who has promised the handsome sum of \$20,000.

In view of the encouraging result of the appeal for funds, the Board has under consideration plans for the new building, in obtaining which they have been greatly assisted by Chancellor Burwash, of Victoria College, Toronto, who came to Winnipeg for this purpose, and to whom the Board is indebted for most careful examination of the necessary conditions, and for valuable advice as to the size and arrangement of a suitable building. Regarding the actual erection of the building, the Board, with due regard to the necessity of caution on the one hand, and the extreme urgency of providing accommodation for the rapidly increasing number of students on the other, has resolved to begin operations at once, and proceed as rapidly as the state of their finances will permit. Proceeding under these conditions, there seems to be a reasonable prospect that the foundations of the building will be laid this season, and the building completed, ready for occupation, a year from next October.

As the early completion of the building is an absolute necessity to the College competing on equal terms with the sister colleges, the Board appeals with confidence to the members of this Conference for their continued sympathy and co-operation in advocating its claims for support amongst the Methodist people of this country.

The College Sustentation Fund being of equal importance, the Board has great pleasure in reporting the continued liberality shown in the contributions to it. The amount raised during the year was \$6,676.10.

A full report of both the Building and Sustentation Funds appears in the Bursar's report attached hereto.

In our report of last year it was announced that the attendance at college had been exceedingly encouraging. We are glad to be able to speak

in a similar manner this year. Ever since our first year of college work, when we had but eight students in all, there has been a constant increase in the attendance, until now, in our fifth year, we have seventy-one registered students, distributed as follows in the various years:—

In the Senior B.A. year	6	Students.

Thus making a total of seventy-one students in all, fifteen of whom had been appointed by this Conference to attend college. It is highly gratifying to know that fully fifty per cent. of these are studying with a view to enter the ministry of the Methodist Church.

In addition to these there were four of our former students, now engaged in the active work of the ministry, who presented themselves for examination in portions of the course assigned for the Degree of Bachelor of Divinity. Forty-four of our students wrote at the late University Examinations, and in consequence, as for the past three years, we stood second in the list of the affiliated colleges, not only in point of numbers, but also in the honors of the University obtained by the students; the Governor-General's silver medal in Mental and Moral Science being obtained by Mr. Jas. Endicott, a University silver medal in the General Course by Mr. A. E. Hetherington, and a University bronze medal in Classics by Mr. J. K. Sparling. In addition to this, our students succeeded in carrying off six scholarships in the higher years, and two scholarships in the previous year. Considering the number competing in the various departments, we think this a very creditable showing.

Besides our regular staff, we have been compelled during the past year to employ three of our senior students to act as tutors in some of the preliminary and previous work, it being found impossible to satisfactorily cover the work without their assistance. And even so we fear that our primary work has not been as satisfactory as it might have been; though in part we believe this due to the fact that quite a number of students do not present themselves with the opening of the session. In this connection we would desire to impress upon all intending students the great importance of attendance with the opening of college work. Those who present themselves at a later period cannot do themselves full justice; and further, do their class-mates considerable injustice in acting as a drawback to the advancement of the regular work.

We have, further, great pleasure in stating that admirable assistance has gratuitously been given us this year by Rev. G. R. Turk, who has conducted a class in practical Homiletics throughout the season in a very efficient manner. Our warmest thanks are due and are hereby tendered him therefor.

The intercollegiate system of lectures has been continued with great harmony between and advantage to the colleges concerned. We hope that the Conference will continue to endorse our action in this respect, since otherwise it would scarcely be possible for us to cover the work demanded by the University in a satisfactory manner.

While your Committee are much gratified to note that so many departments of Sunday School work report an increase of interest and results, yet we deeply regret that in the number of conversions there is a decrease of 109. And your Committee strongly urge the pastors, officers and teachers to look with all prayerful diligence after the spiritual welfare of the young people, that, with increasing attendance, there may be a corresponding increase in the number of those who are brought to a saving knowledge of the truth.

It is also a matter of regret that there is a decrease of \$215.48 in the amount raised for missions. It is of the utmost importance that the subject of Christian missions occupy a prominent place in each Sunday School, and your Committee are persuaded that if this vital element of our work is properly brought before each school, next year's report will be one of greater interest and larger finances.

Your Committee wish also to call attention to the fact that 1,231 copies of papers published by other houses are taken by our schools, showing an increase of 175. We have no hesitation in saying that the publications for Sunday Schools issued by our Book Room are as good as can be obtained, and our schools are kindly urged to get all their supplies from our own publishing house.

That Rev. J. Dyke be appointed treasurer of the Sunday School Aid and Extension Fund, instead of J. J. Young, Esq., who is hereby relieved of all responsibility in the matter.

REPORT OF TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE.

Your Committee beg leave to report as follows :

Whereas, it has been brought to the knowledge of this Committee that some dissatisfaction exists in some localities with the action of our Local Legislature in connection with the vote on prohibition taken at the last general election in our Province, your Committee present the following statement :

That when the question of the plebiscite was brought before the Legislature of Manitoba—and a vote of the people taken—it was provided in a definite way to secure the knowledge of the desire of the electors on the total prohibition of the importation, manufacture and sale of liquor in the Province.

It was not until after the electors had decided by a very large majority in its favor, that critical attention was given to the powers of the Legislature as to how far it could go towards meeting the wish of the electorate.

Before the late session of the Legislature was held, the Government declared their inability to carry out the will of the people as expressed in their vote.

Many temperance men said, then give us prohibition of the sale within the Province. This the Government declared the people had not asked for, and besides in their opinion it would not be wise. Therefore, they simply affirmed their conviction as to the importance of total prohibition, and passed a resolution memorializing the Dominion authorities to pass such a prohibitory law for the Province. Many of the members of this Conference regret that local prohibition had not been passed. Yet at this time and until the action at Ottawa shall be decided, and the attitude of our Government be taken on the final issue, we consider it premature to pronounce further on the subject. But we desire to place ourselves on record once more squarely on the subject of prohibition, and declare it to be our solemn conviction that it is the only satisfactory remedy for the evils of the liquor traffic.

And we would further recommend the Conference to memorialize the Dominion authorities, directly urging them to grant the prayer of the Manitoba Legislature.

1. The following resolutions also were passed and recommended for adoption by the Conference :

That whereas, exceeding difficulty has been encountered in bringing to justice offenders against the license law of the Province of Manitoba ; therefore

Resolved,—(a) That the Government be urged to appoint conscientious license inspectors who shall attend to the vigorous enforcement of the law ;

(b) That the clause enacting that the names of informants shall not be disclosed be re-inserted in the Liquor License Act ;

(c) That the appointment of men as Justices of the Peace who are known to be the slaves of strong drink is an insult to the moral sentiment of the community and should cease.

2. Whereas, some information has come to this Committee leading us to believe that injustice has been done, or error committed through action of

certain boards of license commissioners, and whereas, the law provides for no appeal from such action ; therefore

Resolved,—That the Government be asked to enact such legislation as will provide for an appeal from the decision of boards of commissioners to the County Court Judge. Carried.

3. Whereas, this Committee is of the opinion that the deposit required of candidates for the Provincial and Dominion Parliaments is foreign to the spirit of British institutions, and that it works special harm to the temperance interests ; therefore

Resolved,—That the said deposit, viz., \$200 for Manitoba and Dominion Parliaments, and \$100 for the North-West Assembly, should cease to be so required.

4. Whereas, there have been convictions of persons charged with selling and drinking liquor on the different Indian reserves, and whereas, the practice is detrimental to the social and religious advancement of the Indians ; therefore

Resolved,—That this Committee respectfully request the department to use all possible means to enforce the present regulations prohibiting the traffic. Also, that Indian agents be instructed to discountenance its use on Indian reserves. Also, that a copy of this item be sent to the Indian Commissioners. Also,

Resolved,—That copies of these resolutions be transmitted to the Provincial Secretary, to the Secretary of the North-West Territories, and the Secretary of State at Ottawa. Also, that a copy be sent to the Secretary of the Dominion Alliance in Winnipeg, and that the ministers of this Conference be asked to read such portions of this report as they deem advisable from their pulpits early during the coming year.

REPORT OF SABBATH OBSERVANCE COMMITTEE.

Your Committee desire to give emphatic expression to the conviction that the welfare of nations is inseparably connected with obedience to the expressed will of God, and that for this reason the future prosperity of our young and vigorous country is dependent upon the faithful observance of the Sabbath. We believe it to be the duty of the Church through the pulpit and other agencies under its control to insist upon the strict and joyful obedience of the command, "Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy," on the part of our people, and to protest strenuously against its violation by any. We believe the command to keep holy the Sabbath to be as obligatory as any other part of the decalogue, and we regret the growing tendency to violate the day by railroad traffic, public business and social visitation to the neglect of the sanctuary.

We lament the apparent determination of the directors of the World's Fair to override the expressed will of the great Christian public by opening the gates on Sabbath, and we would kindly and earnestly exhort our beloved people to give no countenance by their presence to the violation of the will of Him who said, "Keep my Sabbath and reverence my sanctuary."

We would suggest to Conference the propriety of directing the Secretary to communicate with the Dominion and Manitoba Governments, expressing the satisfaction of the Conference with the action of those respective Governments in closing their exhibits at the World's Fair on the Lord's day.

We would suggest to Conference the propriety of instructing the Secretary to communicate with the Postal Department, calling attention to the growing custom of keeping open post offices on Sabbath, thus preventing employees in some cases from attending Divine worship and causing unnecessary labor on the Lord's day, as well as encouraging a habit of violating the day by using it for the purposes of correspondence.

In reference to the minute of Saskatchewan District *re* the Sunday trading, shooting and fishing by white men and Indians on the reserve, your Committee heartily endorse the suggestion of the minute that Conference direct the Secretary to communicate with the Indian Department, requesting that instructions be issued to prevent such violation of the Sabbath day.

Your Committee would respectfully call attention to the increasing custom of keeping open retail places of business till a very late hour on Saturday evening, and sometimes almost, if not actually, breaking in upon the hours of Sabbath, thus rendering it difficult, and in some cases almost impossible, for employees and business men to be in attendance at public worship on Sabbath morning. We would earnestly exhort our people to set their faces firmly against this or any other habit that would hinder their attending the house of God and being fresh and vigorous for His service on Sabbath morning.

REPORT OF EPWORTH LEAGUE COMMITTEE.

Your Committee beg leave to report as follows :

1. That we recommend the Superintendents of Circuits or Missions, as far as possible, to endeavor to secure the affiliation of all young people's societies with the Epworth League, with the suggestion that they take the name, Epworth League of Christian Endeavor.
2. That whereas, the tendency is already observable in some Epworth League Societies to lean towards literary rather than spiritual work, your Committee recommend that the Superintendent of Circuits see that the spiritual activity (the real object of the society) be not neglected.
3. Your Committee recommend that special effort be made under the head of "Boys' Brigade," or some similar department of work, to preserve the boys during the critical age from sixteen to twenty-one.
4. That the department of juvenile work be energetically prosecuted with the view of taking care of the boys under fourteen.
5. That instead of fees or dues, voluntary collections be taken twice a month.
6. That every possible effort be made to have the Christians who attend meetings of the League regularly take the active member's pledge, and that all others take the associate member's pledge. Also, that the pledge be repeated at quarterly consecration meetings.
7. That attention be called to the department of literary work (page 14, Constitution) under the head, Denominational and other Literature, and that societies be recommended to collect our papers and magazines and

other good literature and send them to Sunday Schools, lumber camps and places of a similar character, where there is a scarcity of good literature.

8. That older members of the Church encourage, by every means possible, the Epworth League Society.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON THE STATE OF THE WORK.

As the result of faithful work during the past year, we are able to report an increase of 1,335 in the membership of the Church. We have now 14,271 names upon our communion rolls within the Conference. Our increase in members is due partly to watchful pastoral care in seeking out and welcoming our brethren coming to us from the Eastern Conferences, the United States, and the Old Lands, but much of the ingathering is the result of personal Christian work and special evangelistic effort. In this country, where the people give such high place to temporal prosperity and success, where the face of the new settler is so frequently seen, there is abundant need of continuing steadily and faithfully along all our traditional lines of service. Such is the state of the work that we must maintain in freshness, and spirit and power, the regular preaching services and prayer and fellowship meetings. We must also use special efforts to bring the duty of personal, vital godliness before the public; while at the same time we must not forget to give a prompt and hearty welcome to the brethren coming among us.

Notwithstanding the financial depression which has prevailed in many parts of the country, we have raised during the past year for ministerial support, \$57,635; for Connexional Funds, \$22,556.70; for Circuit purposes, \$91,659.20; making a total raised upon the Circuits and Missions in the Conference of \$171,850.90, and increase of \$5,855.21 upon the preceding year. It is gratifying that we can report both temporal and spiritual advance.

During the year the evangelistic work of the Church has been principally carried on by the pastors themselves, working on their own fields and helping their neighbors, and many souls have been saved in this way. Some evangelists have been working in the bounds of the Conference,

amongst whom special mention might be made of the work of the Rev. G. W. Kerby in the city of Winnipeg, of Mr. A. H. Viner and wife in the Crystal City District, and of Messrs. Williamson and Hossie in the Portage and Birtle Districts.

In the Regina District the work is very hopeful and new fields are continually opening out. In the Kinistino section of country, a large influx of settlers has taken place from Dakota, Ontario and England, and the faithful labor of our missionary on the field is resulting in great success. Perhaps no field offers greater opportunities for success than the Calgary District. The tide of immigration has set in strongly to the northern portion of Alberta, especially to the Red Deer, and along the C. & E. Railway new fields are continually opening out, and if our Church is faithful to her duties great good will result.

As in some parts of the country the population is in a constant state of transition, the attention of the Conference should be called to the removal of members by letter—the duty of the pastor from whose Circuit the member may be moving, not only to give a letter of removal, but also to send one to the pastor on the field so that he may at once look after the member removing. Many members have been lost to us by neglecting this.

In the Indian work there is progress all along the line. Rev. John McDougall reports that among the Indians in the West, life is advancing to better things. This is evidenced by growth in industrial habits, godly lives and triumphant deaths. The Orphanage and Home at Morley is now being taken over by the Central Mission Board. The Missions on Lake Winnipeg are having great spiritual prosperity. There have been revivals of religion on almost all our Indian Missions of the North. At Fisher River there has been much sickness, as many as a hundred cases at once; this has brought our missionary into close personal relations with his suffering people, and a very gracious revival has resulted. At Spirit Lake the Indians have built a church without a single cent of cost to the Missionary Society, and here a native is working for the spiritual good of his people without receiving any remuneration. The people at Island Lake, not to be outdone by their brethren at Spirit Lake, have likewise built a church. They have no teacher, or preacher, or leader, but once a year they have a visit from the missionary, which has awakened in them an earnest desire for larger religious privileges. We thank God for such tokens of His favor.

Trusting in the help and blessing of the Holy Spirit, let us address ourselves to another year of glad service for our Master.

tice, and respectfully requests the Government to instruct all officials in the employ of the Indian Department upon the several reservations to aid us in our endeavor to suppress this evil.

Your Committee would indorse the above resolution, and recommend that the Secretary of Conference be requested to write an official letter to the Indian Department setting forth the request embodied in it.

2. *Whereas*, notwithstanding the vigilance of the mounted police and Indian Department in preserving order throughout the country, the Stony Indians have suffered loss for some years by the stealing of their horses, some of which have been found at different times on the Blood Reserve, and whereas, the interests of both Church and state call for honorable and friendly relations between the Indian tribes, in order to inspire confidence in, and upholding the prestige of, our Christian religion, and the law of the land; therefore,

Resolved,—That this meeting deprecates the existing predatory attitude of the southern tribes towards the Stonies, and respectfully and urgently memorialize the Indian Department to adopt such means as will prove effectual in terminating this system of annual plunder.

Your Committee would advise that the Secretary of Conference correspond with the Indian Department in reference to this matter also.

That collections or subscriptions be taken up at each place where he engages in special services. That all collections, subscriptions and expenses be reported to the Committee of Management, and placed in a fund as provided by Discipline for the payment of the evangelist.

We beg to re-affirm the resolution passed at the last Conference, that religious or evangelistic services be held upon all the evenings during which Conference is in session, with the exception of those set apart for the Educational and Missionary meetings and the Reception Service.

This evidence of their self-denying zeal is very gratifying to this Conference, and we hereby express our hearty sympathy with their action and willingness to co-operate with them in fulfilling the pledge they have given. Moreover, we assure our esteemed and honored brother that we shall follow him to his distant home of toil with our earnest and constant prayers, and that we shall watch with profoundest interest his work for the Master in that far-off land.

Two of the young men, F. W. Locke and James Endicott, B.A., related their Christian experience and call to the ministry in an interesting manner.

PASTORAL ADDRESS.

TO THE MEMBERS AND ADHERENTS OF THE MANITOBA AND NORTH-WEST CONFERENCE.

"Grace be unto you and peace from God the Father and from our Lord Jesus Christ, who gave Himself for our sins, that He might deliver us from this present evil world according to the will of God and our Father."

The return of our Annual Conference held this year in the city of Brandon affords us the privilege of again addressing you with words of congratulation and exhortation.

You will rejoice to know that the past year has been one of prosperity. Financially it has been in some respects depressing, but in the salvation of our people it has been highly successful.

The Church has had her vision cleared, her standard of life-conduct has been raised, and her Christian experience deepened. The kingdom of God is beginning to come, we believe, within you; our salvation is nearer than when we believed, and this is the best guarantee of financial success for the future.

Our membership now numbers 14,271, an increase of 1,335 during the past year. At least half of these have entered our ranks through the saving power of God's grace. Let us give thanks unto God. In this age of scepticism and criticism, we need no higher evidence that the Son of Man is the Son of God than His pardoning grace and sanctifying power manifested in the life of all our people. May we in the name of our Divine Christ go on unto perfection.

And while the magnetism of Christ's methods in saving men is so manifest, we are glad that you are not forgetting the *methods* by which this magnetism must make itself felt. In this age when congregations are beginning to assert their rights, we rejoice that you perceive the strength of Methodism to be in her connexionalism. Your support of our connexional funds, which, notwithstanding the financial depression, are far ahead of last year, and your manifest interest in caring for the needs of others, while your own needs are so great, are sufficient evidence that you recognize and appreciate the value of the great principle of connexionalism in our religious life and Church economy. But here also there is room for development. May you rest nothing short of the mind of Christ Jesus, that *every* man should look not on the things of himself alone, but also on the things of others.

Inasmuch as the Missionary Society, through the extension of the work *abroad* as well as *at home*, has necessarily curtailed the grants to our home missionaries, we affectionately exhort you, while now doing nobly, to raise your standard of giving to the New Testament plane, that the fields may as soon as possible become self-supporting and the Mission Board be left free to meet the ever-increasing demands of the work. "Let him that is taught in the Word communicate unto him that teacheth in all good things."

The small number of efficient young men from the East offering themselves for our fields of labor, the progressive character of our work, and the very large number of young men of talent in other departments of work in our land, direct our attention to the obligation Methodism is under in our North-West country to provide more men than at present for our opening mission fields. We urge upon our young men of enterprise and ability to turn their eyes in the direction of the great field of important work and usefulness opening in our ministry. Is not the fact of so great need in our home and Indian work the call of God to *you* to help lay the foundations of our country's greatness through the channel of our Christian ministry?

We are deeply thankful for the work done through our Sunday Schools and Epworth League Societies. We are strongly desirous of seeing a Sunday School organized at every appointment throughout our Conference, and an Epworth League wherever practicable. While there are great advantages in a new country, let us remember that there are great disadvantages also, and we shall not prove worthy of our fathers unless in city, town, or country place, we attend to the training and development of mental and spiritual life through the channels which these organizations afford.

We call your attention once more to the great cause of temperance. Let our mind and heart be in perfect accord with the God of truth and purity on this question. We are fully convinced that the attitude of every member of our Church, and everyone who has any interest in the welfare of our country, should always and everywhere be one of uncompromising hostility to the liquor traffic. May you consecrate every energy of your life to the abolition from our land, and then the annihilation, of the accursed thing.

We commend Wesley College to your sympathetic interest and financial help. We must ask you, as in the past, to come generously to its support until such time as we have a sufficiently large endowment fund to meet all expenditure. We are satisfied you rejoice with us that the vision of a Wesley College building is soon to become a reality through the beneficence of eastern friends, and your own most liberal contributions already given, and those which we hope yet to receive. Help us, brethren, to reach our ideal—a fully equipped building, a full staff of teachers, and an endowment fund covering all expenditure. Our country requires it, our Church needs it, we as a people cannot do without it.

And now we gently but earnestly beseech you, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. We believe that the ordinary Christian life will never draw our fellows to the Christ. We need the *extraordinary* life, the life of "prayer and fasting," in order to helpfully and powerfully touch the lives of our fellow-citizens. Holiness and usefulness are inseparably connected. Let not the rush of our work and the hurry of our life draw us away from our private devotion and study of God's word.

"And now, brethren, the Lord bless you and keep you, the Lord make His face to shine upon you, and be gracious unto you; the Lord lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace."
