The London Times despatch of 9th sent from Pekin, from its respondent who was with the Japanese in the battle of the Liao Yang, was cabled to the Toronto Globe and appeared in that enterprising journal on Saturday, 10th. It is well worth reading because it is from the usual associated press exaggerations and inventions. The correspondent says:-

Liaoyang at sunrise on Sept. 4 presented a dismal spectacle. The Russian settlement was burning, and the heavy pall of smoke which hung over the old town scared the Chinese hiding from the Japanese troops, who, more or less deadbeat, were bivouacking in the suburbs. The attaches were informed they could not visit the town owing to the fact that a certain number of the Russian rearguard had entrenched themselves in the centre of the Chinese town, and street fighting was proceeding. The statement was incorrect; not a shot was fired inside Russian settlement was in ruins. The damage to the town itself was not so great from shell fire, though the rearguard of the 10th Siberian Rifles had sacked all the European shops and many of the houses of the wealthy Chinese before evacuating. Over 50 Chinese were killed by the Japanese shell fire.
