ARFUL STEAMBOAT ACCIDENT.
The poinful duty devolves upon us of chronicling another shocking stembout accident.
The steamboat George Collier left this port, Saurday afterpoon, at thalf past 5 o' clock, for St. Ednis. At half past 1 o' clock on Sunday inorning, 5th inst. when within about 80 niles of Natchey, the piston rod gave way where the key passes thre' the T head, which broke the forward cylinder head, and carried away a part of the boiler stands; the steam which escaped scalding 45 persons who were in the after cabin, 25 of whom died the same day.
Twelve of the unfortunates were buried in the neighbourhood of the disaster. The George Wash, ington shortly came along on her way down, and took the George Collier in tow. The other fourtiesh, who survived but a few hours, were interred at a woodyard nearer to this city.
We visited the ill-fated boat yesterday, and the sight that met our eyes was truly heart rending.—The survivors lay about on pallets, the flosh boiled down of their boines, as it were; some issuing the inost piteons means—others, unable to inter even a groan. There were those among them partially consoled by the southing care of friends; and more who had home from whom to seek sympathy but strangers.
