A large gathering of people witnessed the union barge at Douglas on Sunday afternoon, many being present from the city. Fire covers were handled by immersion by Rev. Wm. Downey (Free Baptist) and Rev. Mr. Hawes (Congregationalist) baptised an equal number, both by immersion and by sprinkling. The baptism took place at the river bank in front of Mr. Stephen Christie's residence. The revival meetings are being continued this week. Some 20 converts have been baptised since the moving began.

Summer Arrangements of Trains.

The summer arrangements of the New Brunswick Railway went into effect yesterday. On the main line there is little change from the April schedule. The morning express from St. John arrives here at 10:30 a.m., and the evening express leaves at 7:15 p.m. The afternoon train leaves at 4:30 local time, instead of at 4 o'clock as formerly. The time table otherwise remains unchanged.

On the Gibson branch, the time table is entirely changed, and the trains are run by the same arrangement as last summer. The express from Woodville arrives at 10:30 a.m., and leaves again at 1:30 p.m. standard time. Close connection is made with the Annapolis and Grand Falls trains.

His Arm Torn Off.

A distressing accident occurred in Blair's factory on Saturday afternoon last, Fred Riddings, one of the employees, while carrying a barrel of material across the floor, stumbled and fell against the planer. He put out his hand, and in so doing, tore his arm off at the elbow. He was held fast by the machine until he was cut free. He was then taken to the hospital, where he is now lying. The accident was caused by the carelessness of the employee.

The Railway Bridge and Track.

Ballast trains are running and resurfacing the new railway bridge a number of times daily, and a large number of men are at work building up and filling in the approach to the bridge on the city side. The track is now laid down to the corner of the Penney's building, the western wing of this building being torn away. The gravel under the "filling" is being hauled from the quarry at the North and Western fronts and side walls will be a high one and form quite a hill, and the only one of the city plat. With regard to the Mrs. Sils' residence and property on George street, which was destroyed by fire, the property is now being sold by the company before being submitted to arbitration.
