The Bishop's Fund Envelopes for August have printed on the back a very brief statement of the position of the Cathedral with regard to the Diocese, which though very well known to some, is misunderstood by others. One result of the circumstances being thus brought to people's attention is an application for envelopes from a country parish from which few, if any, contributions to the fund bave ever been received.

The Treasurer received recently a package of money, with a memorandum, as follows:

This was the result of a very pretty little sale of Children's work which was held by some of the Daughters of the Cathedral on the verandal of 371 Brunswick Avenue. The busy little fingers had brought together quite an assortment of useful and ornamental articles, besides candies, ice cream, etc., varied by the ever popular "bran pie." This little effort on the part of the children to do something for S. Alban's is much to be commended and an excellent example to other willing workers in the good cause of helping on the work of the extension of the Cathedral building.

Some of the ladies of S. Alban's congregation met together last week and decided to tender a reception to his Lordship and Mrs. Sweatman on their return home from their ocean trip. It is proposed that the reception shall take the form of a Conversazione on Thursday evening, 14th inst. There will be an address of welcome and a short programme of music, vocal and instrumental. The tennis lawn is to be illuminated with a marquee in which light refreshments, ice cream, coffee, cake, etc. will be dispensed to those desiring to purchase them; proceeds to go to the Cathedral Extension Fund. All church people and their friends are cordially invited to join in welcoming onr Bishop. The Choir members, the various Auxiliary Societies, the Young People's Association, and members of the Congregation generally are asked to help in every way to make the Conversazione a successful and pleasant gathering.

It has been suggested by a member of the congregation that a Cathedral League should be formed among the Church women of the City and Diocese to promote in every way the cause of Cathedral Extension. The suggestion is an admirable one, and there is a wide field tor such praiseworthy effort in behalf of the Diocesan Cathedral. Covering, as such work should, the past, present, and future of S. Alban's, much could be done by those who are zealous in good works to secure the payment of the old debt on the Cathedral by donations from Church people throughout the Diocese, obtaining subscriptions to the Bishop's envelopes, maintaining the present activities of the Cathedral congregation, and providing for the future building. Readers of the MONTHLY NOTES, think this over, talk about it amongst your friends and see what can be done in this way. It has also been suggested that the Church women undertake the erection of one of the four Piers in the Crossing, the cost of which would be about \$1,200. This could easily be accomplished (under the auspices of the Cathedral League or otherwise) if the energetic women of our Church once put their hand to The boys of the Cathedral School have already undertaken to build one Pier, and their example is worthy of imitation. The children of S. Alban's Sunday School, who have done so well in their missionary work the last year or two, might perhaps undertake the building of a third Pier, and in this way provision would be made for a "School Pier," a "Women's Pier," and a "Sunday School Pier." The building of the Cathedral can only be accomplished step by step, and it is a move in the right direction when our p ople have a definite work before them which they set themselves to accomplish.

THE "DOVENNE" OF S. ALBAN'S.—We are glad to hear that Miss Taylor, of 46 Isabella Street, (who is said to be the longest regular attendant at St. Alban's Cathedral, except the Bishop's family) is convalescing after a long and painful illness of nearly a year's duration.
