To a few the benevolent and philanthrouse features of the eminently conservative principle of Homeone and ampreciated, but of the eminently conservative principle of Home-steed Exemption are known and appreciated, but they have neglected to employ the faculties with which Providence has endowed them, otherwise we should not exhibit in Canada a torpidity and agathy irreconcilable with the natural instincts of man. Let no one who avows Homestead Exemption opinions be turned aside from his advo realized, would invade the sanctuary of private rights, wresting from the landlord his lands, warding off from the debtor the legal weapons of the creditor, and fostering fraud by investing it with the products of honest industry. Such sounding ations may fall from the lips of ignorance and prejudice, and if constenanced by wealth and station, may alarm the timid, and confound the uninstructed with doubts as to the honesty and justice of their cause. In all movements there are to be found the selfish, the exutious, and the cowardly; but where, as in this measure, the labor is one of peace, the execution obstructed by few difficulties and so dangers, and the result conducive to the security and protection of the family prive this Province of a Homestead Exemption Law. The Law which has been just enacted in the adjoining State of New York, is conspicuous for its simplicity, heavity, and lately icity, brevity, and lucid exposition of the respective rights of the creditor and debtor.
