N. B. LAST YEAR In the annual report of the Crown Legtislature recently by Hön. c. w. Robinson, Minister of Lands and
Mines, Mr. T.G Loggle, Deputy Minmines, Mr. T.G Logsie, Deputy Min-
ister, refers to the fire problem . in New Brunswick as follows: fires during the past year owing to the generally wet season. At tumes during the summer season when
the country was becoming dry the Province was favored with welcome showers and this together with
well directed fire fighting well directed ire ighing force
abled fires that might have be serlous to be controned and even-
tually put out. The Fire Law, amended, was tavorably regarded by the pubilic and worked out to the sat-
sifaction of the Department. The Law provides that where ares are
buring on private lands there is no onus on the part of the Government
to put these fires out. The responsiblilty of suppressing fires of this kind is now placed on the County counch
lors who are authorized by the Act to call out the necessary force from time to ume as may be regutred.
