CITY BOND TROUBLE ENDER

THE EXECUTIVE WITHDRAWS THE BONDS FROM THE MARKET.

ated Debate at the Meeting of the Committee in Which Aldermen Get Augry-To Solve the Difficulty All Offers Are Cancelled and the Question Will Be Considered Afresh.

On a division of 6 to 5 the Executive ommittee yesterday afternoon decided to withdraw the new Toronto city bonds from the market and cancel all the offers that have been made for their purchase. This decision was arrived at after a nost lively and heated discussion, in which several of the aldermen lost their tempers and made uncomplimentary remarks about each other.

Ald. Shaw stated that his own personal beauty the stated that his own personal tempersonal temper

Ald. Shaw stated that his own personal honor had been impugned, whereupon Ald Crawford passed a remark that he thought the honor of the city had been impugned prior to the arrival of Mr. Mr. Wilson Smith from Montreal.

The committee met in the morning but the meeting was adjourned until the afternoon. R. Wilson Smith, the Montreal tenderer, was present at the morning session, but in the afternoon he was not allowed to witness the proceedings.

Produced the Letter.

Mr. Smith produced the letter from Mr. MacFee on which the charge is based that a cablegram was sent to England giving the terms of Mr. Smith's offer. Ald. Shaw met this charge by proving that the letter from McFee was dated Oct. 23, nearly two weeks after Mr. Smith's offer had been made public prosperty.

Ald. Frankland's suggestion.

Ald. Frankland suggested that the bonds be taken off the market and that the committee commence all over again as to their disposal.

Ald. Shaw did not think such a course would be an honorable one for the city to pursue. to pursue.

Ald. Crawford also thought the suggestion a good one. He was not at all struck with the Old Country agreement, and was decidedly opposed to any issue of four per cents. He thought it advisable to accept neither of the offers before the committee.

The Mayor criticized Ald. Snaw and Treasurer Coady "in a kind and chariatable manner." He thought that Mr. Smith was entitled to the bonds.

The Mayor's Views. The Mayor said that notwithstanding the letter or the manner in which it was written, he thought of the two tenderers Mr. Smith should have the presentations.

HERE'S PROFIT IN MILK

MARKET FOR FARM PRODUC

Increasing the Daily Yield—There is Economy in Purchasing Good Stockand This is the Key to the Success of the Dairy.

The class of farmers who send milk to the city markets are among the most therprising, and when the milk busiess is conducted intelligently there is most always a sure profit. Considering the kind of stock used by a large number of farmers, and the low prices bained for milk, it is surprising that rimers can afford to invest so much apital in buildings and stock as may a noticed on all large dairy farms, but he milk and butter business seems to ave the preference in this section of the country, and the production is enormous. The herd that contains cows hich yield two gallons of milk per day, from each cow, as an average during the 10 months in the year, is considered good one, and if three cents per quart contained for all milk shipped it is onsidered a satisfactory price in some

WHERE THE PROFITS ARE OBTAINED.

The profit is not entirely from the milk and butter sold. The farmer sells his own labor with the milk, and also charges for the use of his teams which haul the cans to the station. The manure also contains a large share of the profit and the natural increase of the stock is an item to be considered. It is in the increased fertility of the soif that the greatest gain to the farmer results. The keeping of dairy stock necessarily entails the use of more horses, and the raising of pigs is also a matter connected with the dairy, in order to save the refuse material. The animals thus provide a home market for the products of the farm, and enables the farmer to avoid hauling his crops to market in bulk, by feeding his grain and hay to the cows and shipping the milk. Then again, the receipts are frequent and cash coming in daily or weekly and at all seasons of the year.

DOUBLING THE PROFITS.

If the farmer can increase the daily yield of each cow but a single quart it amounts to 75 gallons during the 10 months allotted as the milking period of each cow. If he can double the yield to four gallons per day, or even more, the profits will be perhaps trebled or quadrupled because the first cause of shelter and room in the pasture will not be increased, while but a slight increase in the expenses for food will result. This can be accomplished by the use of improved stock. The labor and care will be the same as for the lesser quantity of milk, but the value of the herd will be greater and the outlay less in proportion to the increase in production. Much as has been written in iavor of the pure breeds a large number of farmers still continue to use cattle that are tar below what should be found on the farm, and mistaken views of economy have kept them struggling against the tide when they should be found on the farm, and mistaken views of economy have kept them struggling against the tide when they should be prosperous. Breed is the key to success, and the farmer who has overlooked that fact has deprived himself of his greatest advantage.

NOVEMBER ON THE FARM.

If bones cannot be reduced to a very ine condition pound them, or break them to pieces in some manner and place them around the grape vines, about six inches deep in the soil. They may also be used around trees. But ittle benefit will be derived from coarse pieces of bone for a year or two, but it is better to thus utilize them than to also we them to accumulate anto unsightly neaps.

Shelter is the most important matter connected with farming. The capital nvested in shelter enables the farmer to save food by keeping the animals warm. When the winter is severe the unimals require more food than in summer in order to create sufficient warmth to protect the bodies from cold. The more an animal is exposed the more an animal is exposed the more that must be created and additional food will be necessary. Comfortable stock will increase more rapidly in weight than if given no shelter, and the gain to the farmer in the saving of food and the freedom from disease of the flock or herd will return a fair profit on the investment in shelter.

One of the difficulties encountered in keeping sheep is that they do not always thrive if the flocks are large. It is for that reason that merinos and southdowns have been more popular than some of the large breeds, as they are active foragers, and can be kept in larger numbers in one flock than the Oxford or Shropshire downs.


