THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS TODAY ANNOUNCED THE FOLLOWING APPOINTMENTS AND TRANSFERS IN THE CANADIAN DIPLOMATIC SERVICE:

MR. PIERRE DUPUY, AT PRESENT AMBASSADOR TO ITALY, HAS BEEN APPOINTED AMBASSADOR TO FRANCE, TO SUCCEED MR. JEAN DESY WHO IS RETIRING. MR. DUPUY WILL TAKE UP HIS NEW DUTIES IN PARIS IN THE EARLY FALL. THE APPOINTMENT OF HIS SUCCESSOR IN ROME WILL BE ANNOUNCED LATER.

MR. H.F. FEAVER, AT PRESENT AMBASSADOR TO DENMARK, HAS BEEN APPOINTED CHIEF OF PROTOCOL OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS IN OTTAWA TO SUCCEED MR. J.A. MCCORDICK WHO WILL BE RECEIVING ANOTHER ASSIGNMENT. MR. FEAVER WILL TAKE UP HIS NEW DUTIES IN THE EARLY FALL. THE APPOINTMENT OF HIS SUCCESSOR IN COPENHAGEN WILL BE ANNOUNCED LATER.

JEAN DESY

MR. DESY WAS BORN IN MONIREAL ON JAHUARY 5, 1893. HE RECEIVED HIS EDUCATION AT LAVAL UNIVERSITY AND AT THE UNIVERSITY OF PARIS. HE PRACTISED LAW IN MONTREAL FROM 1915 TO 1917 AND TAUGHT AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MONTREAL AND AT THE UNIVERSITY OF PARIS BETWEEN 1919 AND 1925. HR. DESY JOINED THE DEPARTMENT OF EXTERNAL AND AT THE CANADIAN I FEATION 1919 AND 1925. MR. DESY JOINED THE DEPARTMENT OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS IN 1925 AND STRIVED AS COUNSELLOR AT THE CANADIAN LEGATION IN FARIS FROM 1928 TO 1939. THAT YEAR HE WAS APPOINTED MINISTER TO FELGIUM AND TO THE NETHERLANDS. AFTER HIS RETURN TO CANADA IN 1941 HE WAS MADE MINISTER TO ERAZIL, AND IN MARCH 1944 BECAME AMBASSADOR TO THAT COUNTRY. HE HELD THAT POST UNTIL SEPTEMBER MADE AMBASSADOR TO THAT COUNTRY WHEN THE CANADIAN MISSION WAS BAISED TO THE STATUS OF EMBASSY. IN 1951, MR. DESY WAS SECONDED THE CANADIAN BROADCASTING CORPORATION AS DIFECTOR GENERAL OF THE INTERNATIONAL SERVICE. HE HELD THAT POST UNTIL HE BECAME THE INTERNATIONAL SERVICE. DESY HAS ATTENDED SEVERAL INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCES INCLUDING THE UNITED NATIONS CONFERENCE ON INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATION IN SAN FRANCISCO IN 1945. MR. DESY 15 THE AUTHOR OF "LES SENTIERS DE LA CULTURE"; PERICOICALS IN FRANCE, BRAZIL AND CANADA. IN 1956, HE WAS ELECTED "MEMPRE CORRESPONDANT DE L'ACADEMIE DES SCIENCES MORALES ET

MR. DESY IS MARRIED AND HAS TWO CHILDREN.

PIERRE DUPUY

KR. DUPUY WAS BORN IN MONTREAL ON JULY 9, 1896. HE RECEIVED HIS EDUCATION AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MONTREAL AND AT THE UNIVERSITY OF PARIS. HE WAS CALLED TO THE BAR OF THE PROVINCE OF QUEBEC IN 1920. HF. DUPUY JOINED THE DEPARTMENT OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS IN PARIS IN 1922 AND SERVED THERE UNTIL 1940. IN JUNE OF THAT YEAR HE TRANSFERRED TO LONDON WHERE HE BECAME CHARGE D'AFFAIRES OF THE CANADIAN LEGATIONS TO THE GOVERNMENTS OF BELGIUM, FRANCE AND THE METHERLANDS IN LONDON. HE WAS ON LIAISON VISITS TO THE FRENCH GOVERNMENT IN VICHY IN 1940 AND 1941. AND ON A SPECIAL MISSION TO METHERLANDS IN LONDON. HE WAS ON LIAISON VISITS TO THE FRENCH
GOVERNMENT IN VICHY IN 1940 AND 1941, AND ON A SPECIAL MISSION TO
FRENCH NORTH AFRICA AND TO DAKAR IN 1943. LATER THAT YEAR, HE
BECAME CHARGE D'AFFAIRES OF THE CANADIAN LEGATION TO THE ALLIED
COVERNMENTS IN LONDON. MR. DUPUY WAS AWARDED THE C.M.G. FOR HIS
SERVICES DURING THE WAR. HE WAS APPOINTED CHARGE D'AFFAIRES OF
THE CANADIAN LEGATION TO BELGIUM IN 1940; MINISTER AND
SUBSEQUENTLY AMBASSABOR TO THE NETHERLANDS IN 1945. HE BECAME
AMBASSABOR TO ITALY IN 1952. MR. DUPUY HAS ATTENDED SEVERAL
INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCES. HE IS THE AUTHOR OF *ANDRE LAURENCE*
AND HAS CONTRIBUTED VARIOUS ARTICLES TO NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS
IN FRANCE AND CANADA. IN FRANCE AND CANADA.

MR. FEAVER WAS BORN AT GLACE BAY, N.S., ON JUNE 18, 13 CT. HE WAS EDUCATED AT KING'S COLLEGE, DALHOUSIE UNIVERSITY AND THE LAW SCHOOL OF HARVARD UNIVERSITY. HE SERVED AS LAW CLERK IN NOVA STOTIA FROM 1927 TO 1930. HE JOINED THE DEPARTMENT OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS AS A THIRD SECRETARY IN 1930 AND SUBSECUENTLY SERVED IN ASHINGTON, TOKYO, LONDON AND THE HAGUL AND IN CITAMA 13 ARIOUS CAPACITIES. HE WAS CHIEF OF SECTOCOL OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS IN OTTAWA FROM 1951 TO 1954. THAT YEAR HE WAS APPOINTED MINISTER TO DENMARK AND IN 1956.
