Canada-Japan Ministerial Committee Meeting

As previously announced, the third meeting of the Canada-Japan Ministerial Committee will be held in Tokyo on September 4 and 5, 1964.

Canada will be represented at this meeting by the Honourable Paul Martin, Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Mitchell Sharp, Minister of Trade and Commerce, the Honourable Walter Gordon, Minister of Finance, and the Honourable Hedard Robichaud, Minister of Fisheries. Mr. L.T. Pennell, M.P., Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Finance, and Canadian Government officials will assist the Canadian Delegation.

Japan will be represented at the meeting by the Honourable Etsusaburo Shiina, Minister of Foreign Affairs, the Honourable Kakuei Tanaka, Minister of Finance, the Honourable Munenori Akagi, Minister of Agriculture and Forestry, the Honourable Sakurazuchi, Minister of International Trade and Industry, and the Honourable Mamoru Takahashi, State Minister and Director of the Economic Planning Agency. Mr. Nobuhiko Ushiba, Deputy Under-Secretary for Foreign Relations and formerly Japanese Ambassador to Canada, and other Japanese officials will assist the Japanese Delegation.

After reviewing the international situation, the two delegations will discuss world trade and economic problems and then turn their attention to bilateral questions in economic and other fields. Ministers will also take advantage of their presence in Tokyo to sign a visa waiver agreement and a double taxation agreement.
