ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1849,

Presented 5th January, 1850.

THE Board of Management of the St. George's Society, before retiring from office, has the honor to submit to the Members the usual annual statement of the affairs of the Society.

One of the most important matters which the Board has to report is that the efforts of the Society, so long ineffectual, to obtain an Act of Incorporation, have at length met with success. At the last session of the Legislature a Charter was obtained which gives the Society ample corporate powers. There is now, therefore, no reason to doubt that the prosperous condition which the Society has attained will be permanent, and we may confidently hope that it will long continue to be, as during the fourteen years of its existence it has been, the means of affording promptly effectual relief to distressed English and Welshmen, and of cherishing in us the kindly and ennobling associations which pertain to the remembrance of our country.

The attention of the officers now to be elected, will be early required for the revision of the by-laws, the procuring of a Seal, form of Diploma, &c., rendered necessary by the incorporation of the Society.

The Reports for the year 1848, together with lists of Members and of the past and present Officers, were published early in the past year; appended to these was a statement of the alterations which had

been made in the Constitution and by-laws since they were printed in pamphlet form. Most of the Members have doubtless been furnished by the Treasurer with a copy of all these documents.

St. George's day was as usual celebrated by the attendance of the Society, at Divine Service. The Patron of the Society, his Lordship the Bishop of Montreal, was present; prayers were read by the Revd. G. Mackie, D. D. and a very excellent sermon was preached by the Revd. A. W. Mountain, B. A., both Chaplains of the Society; an admirable musical service appropriate to the occasion, was performed again this year, by S. Codman, Esq., and the ladies and gentlemen of the choir of the Cathedral, and the collection in aid of the charitable fund amounted to £21 17s. It is to be regretted that the annual dinner was this year unavoidably omitted in the celebration of the day—a deviation from the ancient usage of the Society, which it is hoped that circumstances will not again render necessary.

A short time before the anniversary, a communication was received by the Board of Management, from the Officers of a Society then quite recently established in this city, under the title of the "Junior St. George's Society," asking to be associated as a distinct body with your Society in the celebration of the annual festival; to this request the Board did not deem itself authorised to accede, and an intimation to that effect was accordingly forwarded to the Junior St. George's Society, together with an invitation to all its Members to join you in the observances of the day as individual brother Englishmen.

The Charitable Committee has been judiciously liberal in the relief of applicants for assistance; it has not, however, been found requisite to dispense so large a sum this year as in some of the past years, although the alteration recently made in the Constitution of the Society has considerably increased

the sum available for charitable purposes. The Book of the Committee is on the table for the information of Members; it appears that the number of cases relieved was thirty-five, many of these including several individuals of one family, and that the sum distributed was £72. 17s. 5d. A report of each case will, if desired, be printed with this Report, for the use of the Members.

The Treasurer's Report will explain the financial position of the Society; under the management of that zealous officer the funds continue to increase, notwithstanding the depression under which the general interests of the city have labored during the last two years. It will be observed that the Permanent Fund of the Society now amounts to £1.160. and that the considerable sum of £59 15s., is due for arrears of subscription, &c.,

At one of the destructive fires which this year laid waste parts of our city, the box containing the earlier records and papers, was burnt in the dwelling-house of the Secretary—an accident to be much regretted, as documents of great interest to the Society are thus irrecoverably lost. The books containing the records of the Society since January 1841, alone remain.

During the past year, the Society has suffered the loss of J. C. Fisher, LL. D., a Life Member. The services which Dr. Fisher has rendered to the Society since its institution, the efficient manner in which he has recently presided over it and performed the duties of several other of its highest offices are doubtless fresh in the memory of the members: in him the Society has lost a past officer eminent for

his zeal and activity—a member noted for his attainments as a scholar and for his courtesy as a gentleman.

The Society has also had to sustain the loss by death of Wm. Phillips, Esq., Mr. A. Lenfesty, and Mr. Thos. Yates, Life Members, Jeremiah Leaycraft, Esq., Mr. G. Arnold and Mr. S. Hough, ordinary Members. Although the decease of some of the oldest and most respected of the Members has thus to be recorded, the Society has much cause to be thankful to the Almighty that more of its Members were not taken away by the fatal disease which has but recently left this city; whilst at least one-fortieth of the inhabitants of Quebec have fallen victims to the Cholera during the last summer and autumn, our Society has to lament the loss of but three (the late Messrs. Yates, Arnold and Hough) out of more than two hundred Members enrolled on its List.



An Act to Incorporate *The St. George's Society of Quebec.*

[30th May, 1849.]

WHEREAS the President and Members of the Association which hath for many years existed at Quebec, under the name of the *St. George's Society of Quebec*, have by their Petition to the Legislature represented, that the said Association has been formed for the benevolent purpose of affording pecuniary, medical, and other relief to such natives of England and Wales and their descendants, in this Province, as may, from sickness or other causes, have fallen into distress, and have prayed that, for the better attainment of the objects of the said Association, it may be invested with corporate powers; and by reason of the good effected by the said Association it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said Petition: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, *An Act to re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada*, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Thomas William Lloyd, Henry John Noad, John Musson, William Bennett, John H. Clint, Robert Symes, the Reverend George Mackie, D. D., the Reverend Armine W. Mountain, B. A., James A. Sewell, M. D. E., Charles Poston, Benjamin Cole, William B. Meyer, Weston Hunt, Robert Roberts, Peter Sheppard, Samuel Wright, Abraham Joseph, William Hedley Anderson, Benson Bennett, William Kimlin, M. D., Henry W. Welch, William H. A. Davies, John Shaw, and Samuel Newton, and such other persons as are now Members of the said Association, or shall hereafter become Members thereof, under the provisions of this Act, and the By-laws made or in force under the authority thereof, shall be and they are hereby constituted a Body Politic and Corporate, by the name of *The St. George's Society of Quebec*, and shall

by that name have perpetual succession and a Common Seal, with power to change the same at pleasure, and may sue and be sued in all Courts of Law or Equity, and may acquire and hold personal property to any amount, and immoveable property not exceeding in yearly value, two thousand pounds currency, and may alienate the same and acquire other such property instead thereof, not exceeding the value aforesaid, and shall have such other powers as may be necessary to carry this Act into effect according to its true intent and meaning; and all property, real and personal, now belonging to the Association aforesaid, or held in trust for the said Association, or for the use thereof, shall after the passing of this Act, become the property of the Corporation hereby constituted; and all debts due to and obligations contracted in favour of the said Association, or any Officer of the Association or other person acting on behalf thereof, shall from the same time be deemed to be due to, and to have been contracted in favour of the said Corporation; and all debts due from, and obligations contracted by the said Association, or by any Officer or person acting on behalf thereof, shall from the same time be deemed to be due from, and to have been contracted by the said Corporation; and all such property, debts and obligations may be sued for, recovered and enforced, by or against the said Corporation.

II. Provided always, and be it enacted, That the said Corporation shall have no power to hold any property, nor shall any property be held in trust for them or for their use, except such as shall be derived from the following sources, or purchased with funds derived from such sources, that it is to say: The property of the Association hereby transferred to the said Corporation; the admission fees of Ordinary or Honorary Members, which shall in no case exceed one pound five shillings currency, each Member; the life subscription of Members, which shall in no case exceed seven pounds ten shillings currency, for each; the annual subscription of Members for the general purposes of the Corporation, which shall in no case exceed the rate of ten shillings currency, per annum; the subscriptions of Members to the Charitable Funds of the Corporation, donations, bequests or legacies made to the said Corporation, and the moneys arising from fines and forfeitures lawfully imposed by the By-laws: And provided also, that the property and funds of the said Corporation, that is to say, the amount of the permanent fund which forms the chief part of the property of the Association hereby transferred to the said Corporation, and all sums which shall hereafter be received by the said Corporation for life subscriptions of Members, or from legacies, bequests or donations, not specially made for other purposes, shall constitute the permanent Fund of the Corporation, no part of the Capital amount of which shall be expended or

at such General Meeting be adopted, amended or rejected, in whole or in part, by any majority of the Members present thereat: Provided always, that no such By-law shall have force and effect except in so far as it shall not be repugnant to this Act or to the Laws of Lower Canada.

VI. And be it enacted, That the General Meetings of the said Corporation, and all meetings of the said Committee of Management, shall be held in such manner, after such notice, upon such requisition, at such times, and at such places in the City of Quebec, as shall be directed by the By-laws of the Corporation then in force.

VII. And be it enacted, That the By-laws of the said Association, in so far as they may not be repugnant to this Act, or to the Laws of Lower Canada, shall be the By-laws of the Corporation hereby constituted, until they shall be repealed or altered as aforesaid: Provided always, that no such By-law, whether made before or after the passing of this Act, shall impose any penalty or forfeiture exceeding one pound five shillings currency.

VIII. And be it enacted, That the said Corporation may invest their Funds in any legally established Savings' Bank, in the Stock of any Chartered Bank in this Province, in any Provincial Securities or Securities guaranteed by the Province, or in Debentures or Bonds of the Corporation of the City of Quebec, but in no other way whatsoever, except in the immoveable property which they are hereinbefore empowered to hold.

IX. And be it enacted, That until others shall be elected in their stead, according to the By-laws of the Corporation, the present Officers of the Association aforesaid, shall be those of the said Corporation, that is to say: The said Thomas William Lloyd, shall be the President; the said Henry John Noad, the first Vice-President; the said John Musson, the second Vice-President; and the said William Bennett, the Secretary; the said John H. Clint, the Assistant Secretary; the said Robert Symes, the Treasurer; the said Rev. George Mackie, D. D., and the said Rev. Armine Mountain, B. A., the Chaplains; the said James A. Sewell, M. D. E., the Physician; and the said Charles Poston, Benjamin Cole, William B. Meyer, Weston Hunt, Robert Roberts, Peter Sheppard, Samuel Wright, Abraham Joseph, William Hedley Anderson, Benson Bennett, William Kimlin, M. D., Henry W. Welch, William H. A. Davies, John Shaw, and Samuel Newton, the other Members of the Committee of Management.

X. And be it enacted, That no person otherwise competent to be a Witness in any suit, action or prosecution, in which the said Corporation may be engaged, shall be deemed incompetent to be such Witness by reason of his being or having been, at any time, a Member, Officer or Servant of the said Corporation.

XI. And be it enacted, That the said Corporation shall not be dissolved, or the property thereof divided among the Members, except under the provisions of a By-law, passed by the consent of at least nine tenths of the Members of the said Corporation, nor unless such By-laws shall provide for, and the Funds of the Corporation shall be sufficient to meet the payment of all demands against the Corporation: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent any Member from withdrawing at any time from the said Corporation after payment of all arrears by him due to the Funds thereof, including his annual subscription for the year then current.

XII. And be it enacted, That the said Committee of Management shall yearly, in the month of January, insert in some newspaper published in the City of Quebec, a statement of the amount of the funds and property, debts and liabilities of the said Corporation, certified by the Treasurer thereof; and that the repeal or alteration of this Act by the Legislature shall not be deemed an infringement of the rights of the said Corporation.

XIII. And be it enacted, That this Act shall be deemed a Public Act, and as such shall be judicially noticed by all Judges and others whomsoever, without being specially pleaded.
