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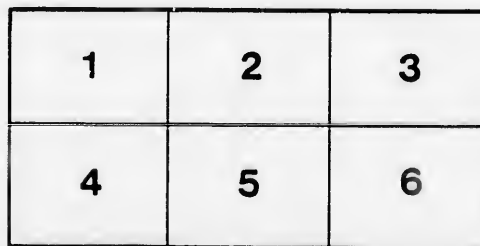
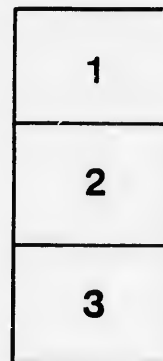

Travelling Arrangements.

Reduced railway rates will be granted to those attending the Toronto Normal School Jubilee Celebration at ONE AND ONE-THIRD first class fare for the round trip, if fifty or more attend; or at ONE first class fare, if three hundred or more attend. Anyone applying for a railway ticket must purchase a first class full fare one way ticket and obtain a receipt on the standard certificate form for purchase of the ticket, from the agent at the starting point, within three days of the date of meeting, or during the meeting. Mr. R. W. Doan, director of railway arrangements for the committee, will fill in the said certificate, and a ticket for return will be issued by the agent at Toronto, in accordance with the rate indicated above. Agents will supply the standard certificate form free. No other form will be accepted by the railway companies. It is very desirable that even those who live near Toronto should purchase tickets as indicated above, for, by so doing, they will assist the visitors from a distance. Tickets will be valid for continuous return trip until November 5th.
