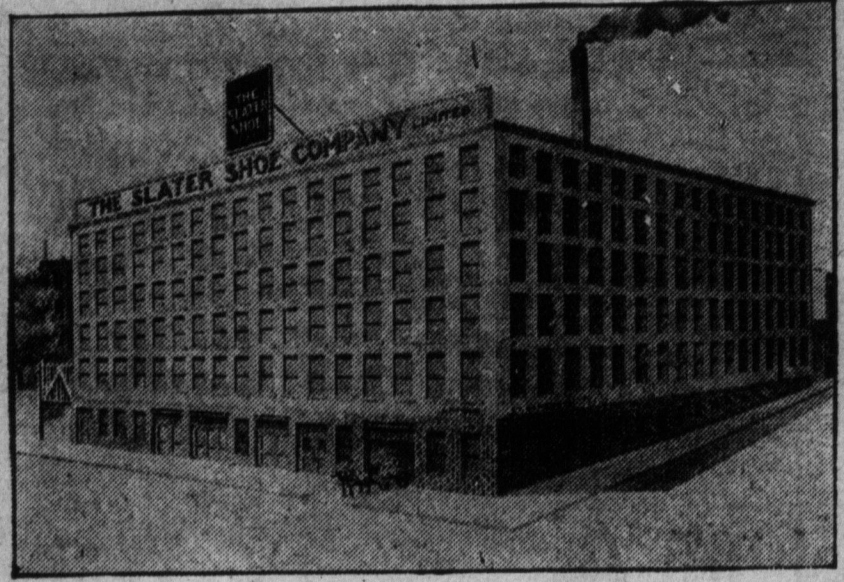

COBALT---Nova Scotia Makes a Strenuous Movement at Week End---COBALT

Strength in Some Cobalts But Weakness in Others

Mining Market Irregular, But With Strong Upward Movements in LaRose, Nipissing, Otisse and Scotia.

World Office. Saturday Evening, July 10. The Cobalt mining stocks have displayed considerable irregularity, and in some cases weakness, during the past week.

LaRose has been the strongest issue throughout the week, advancing over 15 points during that period. Considerable buying of this issue is coming from London, at which point the stock is now listed.

Nipissing has been more active of late, many holders of this issue having disposed of their shares and put the proceeds in LaRose, believing that the price of the latter will equal if not exceed that of Nipissing before long.

Scotia has occupied the centre of interest. News of a rich strike on the part of the company, which has been confirmed in consequence of confirmatory reports continued to arrive, and the price advanced from day to day. The high price reached was 72 1/2, over 35 points above last week's close.

The other active issues have been generally inclined to weakness, with Temiskaming the leader in this respect. These shares have declined almost from day to day, and show a loss of about seven points from last week's closing prices.

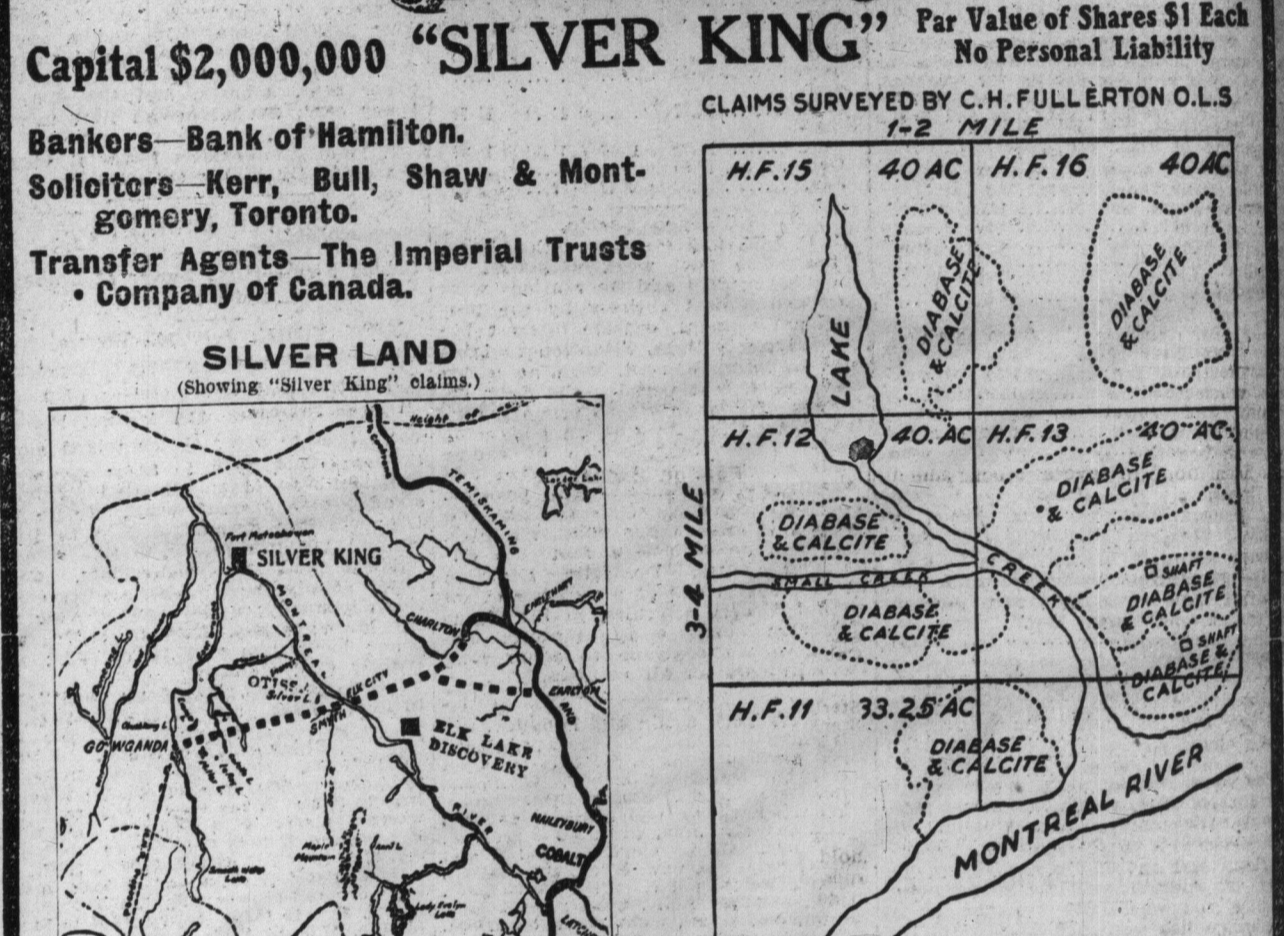
