



The blood of living animals stands at a given temperature, called blood-heat. This heat must be, and is, kept up from three sources, viz: by excluding the cold, or applying external heat; or the liberation of caloric or heat, from the carbon of their food; or from the carbon and hydrogen contained in the fat of their own system.

We may consider the animal structure a perfect furnace, formed by the architect of nature, of which our stoves are but an imitation, which we will take to illustrate. The means of heat are the same in both cases. Will we place the stove in the field, where all the heat radiated causes a current of cold air to rush to the point rarified? or will we exclude the external air, except what is necessary to support combustion, and thus circumscribe the heat radiated within the enclosure, (on the air-tight principle)?

For heat, will we use coal, wood, and the grosser kinds of carbon, or will we use oils, and fats, which contain more hydrogen and less oxygen?
