The report of the committee who were appointed to gain information in regard to utilizing the Sackville butter factory as a co-operative factory was quite favorable, after which considerable discussion followed relating to the probable quantity of cream or milk that could be supplied, the advisability of manufacturing both butter and cheese and other matters relating to the starting and running a butter factory. The report of the delegates to the Farmers and Dairymen's association held at Fredericton, J. T. Carter and J. J. Anderson was well received and listened to with attention. The next meeting will be held in Union Hall on Monday evening February the 20th.

Dominion Parliament.

OTTAWA Feb. 1. Some discussion took place on the Copyright law.

In reply to Mr. Davies, Hon. Mr. Haggart said the receipts of the P. E. I. railway for the six months ending 31st of December last were \$92,072.90 and the expenditure \$130,391.40.

The receipts of the Intercolonial and its branches for the same period were \$1,595,047 and the expenses \$1,597,757, a loss of \$2,710. There had been expended \$170,000 on capital account of which \$128,000 was for the Harris property, St. John, and \$30,000 at Port Miguave.

Mr. Mulach moved a resolution that binding time be placed on the free list, he followed it up by many reasons why the farmers should be freed from the bondage of the cordage monopolists which was controlled by an American syndicate. The committee was a wealthy one he said and could afford to stand alone. He was followed by Messrs. Sample of Alberta, Davin of Assiniboia, McMullin of Huron, and McMillin of North Westington, in speeches full for the repeal of the tariff on this item.

Mr. Foster in reply said the government is not a bankrupt for any new light but binding time would defer until the government introduced its tariff measures. He said a man might be a strong protectionist yet be opposed to a duty on a certain article.

Col. O'Brien said he was in accord with those who protested against the duty on binding time. The government is responsible for the illfeeling that existed because of its failure to deal promptly with these questions.

Sir Richard Cartwright supported the motion in a bitter speech which he assailed the cabinet, which he said has made up of marionette provincials, having no money for the western farmers.

Sir John Thompson, who was greeted with cheers, said no one expected the last speaker to accept the finance minister's proposition that instead of commuting it itself on the question, the house should await the announcement of the governments general tariff policy. Sir Richard had disfigured Harnard with stale adjectives and had repeated his old venomous utterances, being bound neither by the rules of debate or ordinary courtesy. It was not true that the government had refused to consider the demands for changes in the tariff from the farmers or any other class of the community. Sir John said he did not dispute the right of members to discuss tariff matters at this or any other stage of the session, but he felt the house would agree with him that to alter the tariff in any one particular week in advance of the governments general tariff measure would be to disorganize the business of the country.

FEB. 2.—Mr. Coatsworth Toronto introduced a cruelty to animals bill.

The binding time motion was continued by Messrs. Mulach, Campbell, Edgar, and Bain. Mr. Stairs of Halifax said the industry was an important one and was followed by two speakers so that there was no comment on the motion. It was not fairly stated by the opposition, they having given the whole price in Canada. He was willing to abide by the policy which was considered best for the country. A motion to adjourn the debate was carried.
